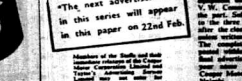

NO detailed statement on yesterday's inter-continental conference in Nairobi will be issued until after this week. After discussions lasting more than five hours behind closed doors in the Memorial Hall, the chairman, Mr. W. R. Hancock, announced that the emergency conference could be made public the security aspects would have to be discussed.

Implications of the
closure decision

SOVIET INTRANSIGENCE

THE decision of the four Foreign Ministers to close the Berlin conference on Thursday amounts to an admission that they see no prospect of reaching agreement on the problems before them. This view is taken by diplomatic observers in Berlin.

Without a change of policy by one side or the other, it would take much longer than four days to reach agreement on the German and Austrian problems. No such policy changes are expected.

Yesterday the Ministers held their fourth secret session to try to agree on terms for meeting China, the one remaining point on which they have not reached a complete deadlock. But, even on this issue, the Eastern and Western positions are so far apart that agreement would demand an important sacrifice of principle by one side or the other.

There remains only the possibility that some progress may be made over the Korean issue. Mr. Molotov has agreed to the Western proposal that a conference be held in Geneva on April 15, but he insisted that the meeting should be preceded by one of the five Powers, including China. Observers report that the West has refused to consider this as it would mean the acceptance of China as a nation with voting standing.

Gang of 200 routed in running battle MOST FIERCE ACTION OF THE EMERGENCY

Security forces killed at least 35 terrorists yesterday in a battle which raged all day in the area between Thika and Fort Hall. Two others were captured. Among the dead was believed to be a self-styled Mau Mau "general."

Last night 35 bodies had been recovered and the search continued for more of the dead terrorists scattered in the trails made by three sections of a gang estimated at 200 in the broken countryside in and around the Kandara Division.

Casualties among police and troops who co-operated in fighting one of the most fierce and successful actions of the Emergency to date, asked killed and two European police inspectors slightly wounded.

The wounds were inflicted by the two inspectors, Field and Macfarlane who were hit in the firing near Kandara Police Post which was raided.

Continued reports of the fighting were being received last night from the area, but the only other casualties among the police were those of a sergeant who was killed in an ambush and the African barman killed when the British raided Thika Golf Club.

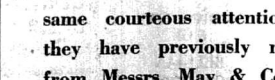

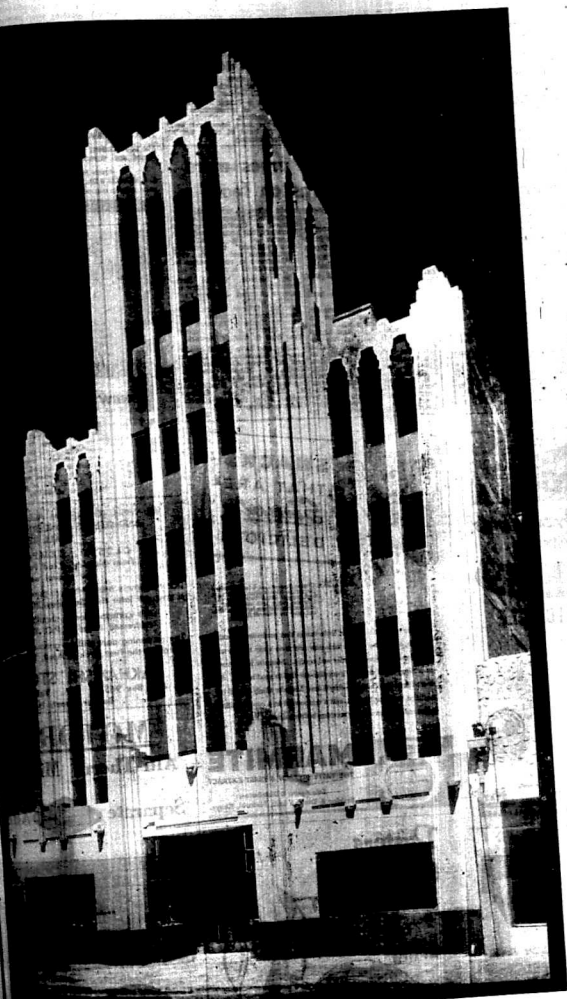

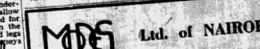

This week I rode in the biggest elevator in Kenya. It seemed—and probably is—as big as the largest one I have ever seen which is used in Victoria Station, London, for carrying baggage and mail up and down.

Five-ton load

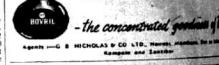
