MR. PANT'S FAREWELL MESSAGE TO KENYA

'Adjustments, then peace'

SVERAL hundred Indians were at Eastleigh Airport yesterday to say goodbye to Mr. A. B. Pant, who was returning by air to Bombay after five years in Nairobi as the Indian Government's Commissioner for East Africa. Before boarding the plane Mr. Pant told the East African Standard: "I would like to express my best wishes to the people of East Africa. There are a number of necessary adjustments still to be made on the human and economic planes. While these have been accomplished the Colony can look forward to peace and prosperity."

At the last farewell given in his honour in Nairobi by the Kenya Legislative Council, the Commissioner said: "There was not and has never been any racial prejudice in the Government of India to prevent the best interests of the Colony from being made my representations to the East and Central African Governments."

Proper 'interference'

"The appointment of a Commissioner here," said Mr. Pant, "was made because we were not sure we would be able to do this in the absence of our own people. It is a job which is not to be done by a man of another race. We want to know the political and human and cultural aspects of the country. SECURITY FORCES KILL 87 TERRORISTS:

CAPTURE 16 Biggest battle of the Emergency CASUALTIES INCLUDE 'CHIEF RECRUITER'

The biggest battle since the start of the Emergency... a series of running engagements which started south-west of Fort Hall on Saturday morning—combined forces of police, Home Guard and two companies of the Inniskilling Fusiliers had by mid-day yesterday killed 87 terrorists, captured 16, and wounded between 30 and 40.

One of the dead terrorists was wearing regalia which indicated that he was a high-ranking member of the Mau Mau. He was identified by a prisoner as the Mau Mau's 'chief recruiting officer' in Nairobi.

According to police sources, casualties among members of the security forces were one tribal policeman and two members of the King's General Service Corps. Last night a company of the Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers was in pursuit of a terrorist gang at Mbitui, north of Kangema and 20 miles by road from Fort Hall.

The progress of the battle was described yesterday by the Commander-in-Chief, Gen. Sir George Erskine. Gen. Erskine revealed that a severe engagement took place at Kangema on Thursday, when security forces killed 99 terrorists. Further contacts were reported in the area and it was clear that a large number of guerrillas were operating on the boundary between Thika and Kiambu.

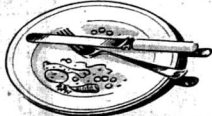

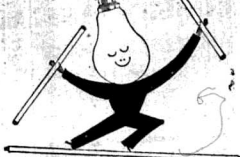

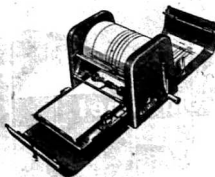

U.S. cutters 'shadow' British vessels

ARMED guards have been placed on British ships calling at United States ports on voyages to the Far East, says a report by the Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom. It describes the guards as part of "ill-defined restrictions" imposed by the United States Government on ships transiting to Far Eastern Communist ports.

United States naval cutters had also shadowed British ships since last November when an American port to another. It was "almost certain" that this should happen in the future, the report declared.

After McCarthy
Since James Britton's appointment last September as director of a program against British ships being used to carry strategic materials for the United States, McCarthy's report said that the system worked smoothly and that the developments in America would not have any effect on the export of legitimate trade in non-strategic materials with China.

Understandably the report and system, denunciation of the trade by Senator Joseph McCarthy, were followed by United States Government restrictions which went beyond those imposed by the British Government and beyond the terms of a United States-United Kingdom agreement.

Question raised
Britain has raised with the United States the question of such restrictions, the Foreign Office announced.

A spokesman said the British Embassy in Washington had approached the State Department action against British vessels during the past few weeks. Action involved shadowing the ship in American waters and placing guards on board.

Member to urge summary justice by tribunals

Mr. Humphrey Blake, Member for Aberdeenshire, gave notice of a motion in the House of Commons for the Government to introduce forthwith a Bill to set up summary tribunals to deal with offences against the provisions of the Criminal Justice Act, 1948, which would be empowered to deal with summary offences.

Death sentences would require administrative confirmation, but there would be no right of appeal.

LAKE PROVINCE PROGRESS

Development - **Start Success**
SOME 300 water points have been constructed in the plain every five miles in Tanganyika's most thickly populated country—the five Wankao districts of the Lake Province. The plan requires 1,000 water points, states Mr. John C. Ransay in a paper on the development of hand-built water points in the Lake Province, presented to the recent inter-territorial hydrological conference held in Arusha. He is the Divisional Engineer of the Water Development Department in the area.

The programme part of the Government Development Plan is designed to have no point more than 2½ miles from water—a major feature in the five-year life of the territory's progress.

Foremen's cost
An average of eight to ten days a year were lost by hand labourers in the Lake Province between 1947 and 1950, it was found. This loss when a year in expansion areas means a great deal of work done but often nearly broken down because of a lack of spares.

In 1949 an officer of the Department was attached to the Provincial Development team and the next year to the Provincial Development team in the stepping up of construction of more and greater dams—an African Dam Federation was set up.

This course, held annually for five days at Mbariki just before the dam construction season, has proved a most practical work. All districts now have dam foremen and this has made possible the extension of the dam-building programme into districts.

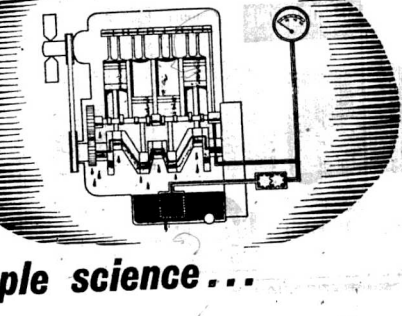
