### Swift moves said to be unlikely

### LABOUR M.P.'S MOTION

MORE replies have been received from Mau Mau leaders to letters written by General Chiang Kai-shek. The replies are not expected to take place before the end of next week at the earliest. A warning was given in Nairobi yesterday that swift developments were unlikely.

It is believed that 16 terrorists in the Mount Kenya and Nyjeri areas have replied to General Chiang. On Wednesday it was disclosed that six answers had been received to 26 letters. They were regarded as "not unfavourable".

A motion signed by 13 Socialist M.P.s welcoming the decision to arrange meetings with gang leaders which may lead to widespread surrenders has been put on the Order Paper of the House of Commons. The signatories include Mr. Fenner Brockway.

Two London newspapers argued yesterday that opposition to the Government's attempt to persuade terrorists to surrender was wrong. The News Chronicle said that the willingness of the Chin-Chi, East Africa, Gen. Sir George Erskine, to seize the opportunity must be "applauded and endorsed". The Times has refrained from editorial comment but the Daily Telegraph held the view that the result was "surely worth the experiment", although the result may prove disappointing.

Meanwhile, "General Chiang" has been officially informed that the death sentence which has been committed to life imprisonment. He is under close guard in the Nyjeri area.

They tried in vain to define the authority of the President and the Revolution Council both of which claimed to represent the sovereign power.

NOTICE TO QUIT FOR INDIAN FAMILIES

New Transvaal move

UNDER the Nationalist Government's Group Areas Act (the weapon being used to enforce territorial segregation of the races in South Africa) efforts were made two years ago by the municipality of the small Transvaal town of Johannesburg to remove the Indian quarter from the town.

The Indians, the strenuous legal battle and went their case for being allowed to stay in the town.

It has been a short-lived victory. Now, as the result of a new Government decision, it looks as though all of them will be ordered to move out—where to nobody knows.

Stone control ended

A month ago a short notice appeared in the Government Gazette announcing that the stone trade had been dissolved.

The dissolution of the Board ended rent control in the area, which means that landlords of premises occupied by Indians can use the old pre-war powers under the common law to file a simple one-monthly notice to tenants to quit.

These powers have now been used and half the Indians in the area are under notice to quit their dwellings and have been told to leave by the end of the month.

Representatives of the Indian community have just been to Cape Town to seek relief from the Government but so far without success. Questions are to be asked in Parliament about the plight of these families. Three million who were properly employed are not affected. But four, who in dependence, are homeless and will have to go.

Face ruin

The Transvaal is a controlled area under the Group Areas Act and the Indians may not rent or buy other premises there with the movement of Indians from the area.

The government, however, is prohibited, so they cannot remove out another piece.

"We do not know where we can go," one of the delegates to Cape Town, Mr. T. M. G. M. said.

All the Indians affected have had to leave their homes in Johannesburg and unless relief is granted they will face ruin. Those had been in business in the same shops for more than 20 years and in most cases lived with their families on the premises.

War-time measure

The 1952 application which the Indians sought to remove from the Act is a little too and will not be taken up in the Bill.

# Commonwealth's bright prospects over increasing share of vegetable oil trade

With the great expansion of vegetable oil in 1933, although the total output of the world was only 10,000,000 tons, it is estimated that a very high level of production should again be reached in 1934. It is expected that the Commonwealth will obtain a larger share of this trade than in 1933.

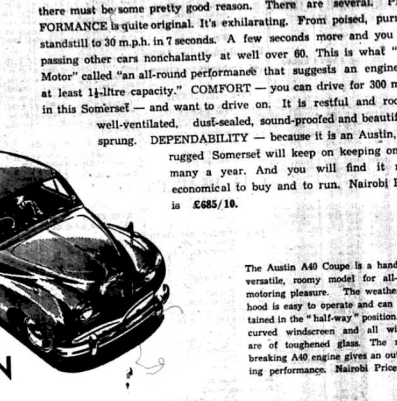

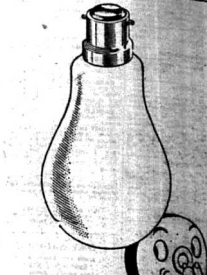
