

BULLDOZER OPERATION AT TANGA

Foundations of slipway laid

(Special Correspondent's Column)

ADVANTAGE was taken of the excellent weather—the lowest of the week—to push out the new slipway at Tanga harbour. Three bulldozers worked ceaselessly to complete the work before the turn of the week. A fourth stood by with a cable to pull out any of the other three if they got stuck in the mud.

At several high tide earth cores from ground higher up had been collected and packed ready, and the upper portion of the slipway constructed.

Three at once

Early on Saturday morning two large excavating tractors and a smaller one started earth work in the slipway, at the same time commencing and leveling the concrete slab on which the slipway will be built. As the tide receded soft mud was cleared by hand, to ensure that the earth, which had been put down as dry as possible.

The slipway is situated at upper end of the harbour. When completed, it will be used by the larger ships, and will be able to raise three lighters; one of which at the same time. This will be done by winches attached to the upper end of the slipway, which will draw up the lighters on a crane.

This slipway is part of new harbour scheme at Tanga, which is going ahead with speed.

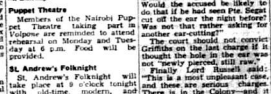

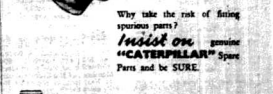

ON LOCATION WITH KENYA'S OWN FILM UNIT

It was a small little figure who watched from the safe shelter of her nurse's arms, the car in which Sally Jane obviously did not approve of her mother playing the leading part in Kenya's own film, *No Rain in the Mountains*, now being made by Capetown Film Productions at Nairobi. But Sally Jane's mother, known to a few movie fans as *Queen of the Desert*, had promised to lend her name and her acting ability to what it is hoped will be the first of many films about Kenya and which may well prove the beginning of a thriving local industry. It is the intention of Capetown Film to employ only local actors, actresses and technicians and that it will be the first to be in the picture.

I thought I would like to see the star on location, so we set out for the Samburu country about eight o'clock one morning, travelling via Gilgil, Thompson's Falls and Hamuduni. I found Carol a very human and understanding person, with none of the capriciousness of some of the more famous stars. She is a good wife and mother—Sally Jane has a baby brother named Mark—since she arrived in Kenya just over a year ago, that she has not had time to make her career.

But now here she was, ready to put her heart into the new venture and she had readily grasped one very important factor connected with the making of this particular film: there is only money enough for essentials, one to run the show and all performing several different jobs. The picture is a co-operative effort with each person doing his or her own bit. I had been out on location several times with the M.G.M. unit when it was making *King Solomon's Mines*, when money was no object and a star's whims and preferences were met to the letter.

For 14 miles, of our destination, when we were hot, dusty and tired, we had a puncture and Carol was out of the car at a moment, ready to do her bit in changing the wheel. And that I think is typical of her: she will find a better father than she did to the help of the more or less-worked members of her unit.

A delightful site for the camp had been chosen a little way out of Maralal township: it was shaded by tall trees and sheltered from the cool winds by the hills behind. There was a slight hitch over a tent for Carol; it had not been delivered as promised, but soon a temporary one was rigged up and we were able to wash and shake the dust out of our clothes and have a welcome cup of tea. For that night and the next I was the guest of the M.G.M. unit.

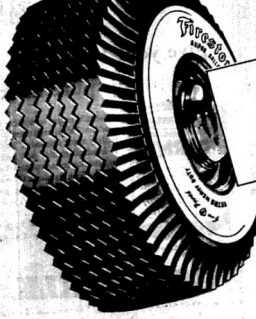

LESLEY CLAY Starts A New Series On WOMEN AT WORK

And The First Article Describes A Coffee Expert

A WOMAN who says she could never go back to being just an ordinary housewife again, Mrs. Ellen Dorman of Nairobi, has made herself an expert at a job rarely undertaken by the feminine sex—that of coffee tasting and roasting. But then Mrs. Dorman has in her veins—besides the ordinary good red blood—an infusion of the beverage imported from her coffee trading ancestors from three generations back.



Tiny scales

WHEN she had finished the roasting process, Mrs. Dorman put the beans into a small grinding machine, then took a weighing scale to the scale of scales which her husband had bought very old indeed. Weighed exactly 50 cent.

Sampling

THE DORMANS live in an attractive house in Crawford Road. It is a pleasant home by all standards. They have built on it a very narrow study, lighted by daylight tubes, in which Mrs. Dorman spends a part of her day. It is here that she does the coffee which is brewed by the factory. Having roasted the beans and tested them and made up their minds what they think they are worth, the Dorman go to the machines and buy what is suitable for their enjoyment.

approximately one-third of an ounce of coffee is required for tasting. Mrs. Dorman put her sample into an earthenware cup with a perforated base, secured some hot water over it and then it was ready for testing. She poured the coffee into the liquid into another cup, then took a small tin of coffee and began to do this so often, it is not surprising that she has become an expert at it. She has to buy some perfume and by the time she has done this she has to smell the same! But that she said, this was not the case with coffee tasting, or with any beverage. Beside the cup of earthenware cups

stood rows of little enamel mottled "bottles", one for each person, so highly organised and hygienic the process. Then Mrs. Dorman turned to the sampling of coffee and set out for the factory in the industrial area.

The factory

HIGH-CEILINGED, with its corrugated iron roof and concrete floor, the building was completed three years ago and the whole premises designed by Mr. Dorman himself, with a store room where the green coffee is packed in sacks and another store for bags, sacks, etc. The factory is staffed by Mr. D. M. Murch, a well-known Kenyan African, none of whom are, however, allowed to touch the machinery.

Dorman, a business-like man, while several Mrs. Dorman showed her the roaster with its giant wheel inside the revolving drum where the beans revolve. The chief purpose of inspecting the coffee during roasting is by means of sampling tins which pull out of the drum so that you can see what colour the beans have arrived at. Although it looks so formidable, Mrs. Dorman illustrated to us that the central plant is simple-banded if necessary.

Filling the hopper above the green coffee goes in, it is then blown up through into the roaster where the furnace burns it. Now could see the beans travelling through the drum into the main drum and where they are cooled and the coffee is packed into an earthenware cup where it is set aside

the silver skins sucked off and, when properly cool, it goes into another machine where again the coffee is collected in the hopper and blown up into another container. This constant blowing operation removes all foreign matter. From the hopper the coffee is put into a weighing scale and the various processes which include some loss of weight as the moisture and the ammonia oils contained in the beans decrease. After it is transported into the automatic weighing machine, where it is weighed off into pounds and thrown into bags which are heat-sealed and date stamped in one process.

Cup tests

As each batch came out of the roaster, Mrs. Dorman took it to a long table at the far end of the room and there she and her husband, who does the same kind of work and that was in Africa, where she visited with her husband for hours, she said, exchanging views and experiences and in San Francisco, Mrs. Dorman had

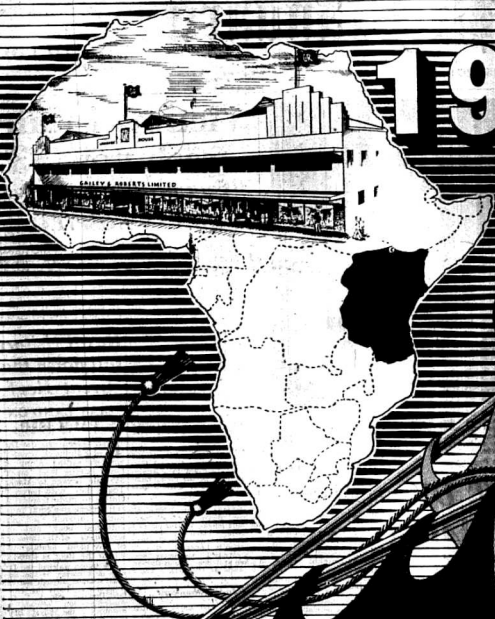

TWO YOUNG MEN WITH THE WILL TO SUCCEED

From a tin shack to a £5,000,000-a-year business

JUST about the time that Lord Delamere was being helped into a small hut at Njoro in fulfilment of a promise to create a 'White Man's Country' on the highlands of East Africa, two young men sat talking by the light of a smoky hurricane lamp in the shabby railway town of Nairobi.

The year was 1904... had a country and with no dispersal to the greatest of the East African pioneers the names of those two young men have become more widely known than that of Delamere.

They were James Hamilton Gailey and D. O. Roberts. Roberts, surveyors employed by the railway.

While Lord Delamere planned the expensive but very instructive experiments, while he threw about, determination and not a little cheer he bullied and cajoled Whitehall into realising the potentialities of British East Africa, these two young men planned a business which for half a century has gone hand-in-hand with the development and progress of East Africa.

A real tribute Today the broad fields of the Kenya Highlands, the flourishing coffee, dairy and livestock industries are a tribute to Lord Delamere. Today, almost thirty years ago, the two young men of East Africa from Njoro to White are a tribute to the two young engineers.

As Delamere planned to keep the Highlands of Kenya with settlers from Britain and Europe so did young Gailey and his partner, see the commercial possibilities of development. "If Delamere persuades settlers to take up land here," they said, "then they will need shops and gardens, huts and rails, harness building material." And so they set up a tin shack in Government Road, Nairobi, the first law developed by the Nairobi Corporation.

Expansion

Gailey and Roberts were and shopkeepers... not businessmen. To them the intricacies of buying and selling of shipping and costing, of inventing and bills of lading were obscure and difficult as they secured the services of another young railway engineer, Mr. G. E. Ramsey, who had been given service to set up his railway association with the original partners, for Ruby had been the first to set foot on the soil in the First World War and James Gailey died in 1938. Mr. Ramsey died in 1933 after 48 years of energetic association with the firm.

Large staff

The Gailey and Roberts venture was a success. They had attracted energetic men and by the end of 1900 they had a staff of eight Europeans, several Indians and a number of Africans, and two plants in Nairobi township and another in the Railway area. Today 440 Europeans work for the firm and nearly 5,000 Africans and Asians, and there are five branch offices in Tanganyika, three in Uganda and three in Kenya as well as the main office in Nairobi.

Flow of capital From 1904 onwards settlement began in earnest and as ship after ship tied up at the wharves at Njoro, Nairobi (Gailey had been actively engaged in the building of railways and in the buying of land and in the buying of cattle and sheep to be brought, offered, bought, and sold to the Government in the years before the outbreak of the war with Germany in 1914 imports to East Africa had risen to £2,000,000... an increase of 400 per cent in size.

During the First World War the firm of Gailey and Roberts had to import part of the tin. To them the intricacies of providing and keeping going a business and the over-extended mechanical resources of the banking community.

Aftermath of victory They enlarged their workshop after they had acquired the Nairobi Engineering Company and Douglas's machine tools. On the site where Terra House now stands, Gailey and Roberts built their homes and the ones that to this day are still in use. They had long left the tin shack in Government Road and were living in a large house on the corner of Delamere Avenue (then Old Avenue) Street directly built by Col. R. E. Douglas.

By victory in 1918, as did the victorious coalition of the Allies, gave Tanganyika to Britain, young men who had fought in France and in the East Indies were recruited into the business. Many were recruited into the business to repair the damage done by the war.

Among these men were A. L. Gailey and J. Phillips who later joined the board of Gailey and Roberts, together with Mr. C. V. Hawkins and Mr. Percy Bryant.

Gailey and Roberts weathered the depression of the early thirties and they held steady through the years of the depression. G. E. Ramsey, who had become a member of the firm and its general manager in 1910 was a real 'farmer's friend'. He had introduced a system of grazing control between growing and harvest time and during the last years his faith and determination enabled many a hard-pressed farmer to survive.
