World's production of fibres reached a record level

£200,000,000 share-out from wartime wool stocks

BRITAIN, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand have shared almost £200,000,000 from the profits of the joint organization established in 1915 for the disposal of Britain's wartime wool stocks.

This was shown in the final accounts and liquidator's report of the organization, known as the Wool Disposal Board, which were shared between the four Commonwealth Governments on March 13.

The report showed that the take-out of the joint organization since 1915 for a total of £431,000,000. The share of the four Governments was £165,000,000. The final net profit was £35,000,000.

The report also stated that since the disposal of the wool stocks the organization's assets were valued at £100,000,000. The report also stated that the organization's liabilities were £35,000,000.

Six-year period

The Australian, New Zealand and South African Governments have each received 12 1/2 per cent interest in their shares of the total stock since the disposal of during a six-year period. This produced a profit of £100,000,000. The share of each Government was £25,000,000.

World production of fibres reached a record level in 1935. Consumption was below production and stocks increased, but fibre prices rose sharply during the closing months of the year.

A report on industrial fibres, published by the Commonwealth Economic Committee, indicates that in the current season world output may exceed that of 1935-36. It is also likely to expand.

1935-36 report states that in wool the output of the world is expected to be larger than last year. It also notes that the wool price in the United States is expected to rise, while the price in Europe is expected to fall.

Price decline

Apart from wool, the price of most natural fibres has fallen since 1932. The price of cotton, for example, fell from 18 1/2 cents at the beginning of 1932 to 16 cents at the end of the year.

Sharp rise

Last season the Commonwealth Wool Disposal Board had a profit of £100,000,000. The share of each Government was £25,000,000. The report also stated that the organization's assets were valued at £100,000,000.

GOVERNMENT ENDS GANGSTERS MASSACRE AFRICANS Tied together and slashed

RAILWAY gang of eight Africans were tied together in a group and slashed to death by a gang of 20 strong which attacked the railway landings near Malaya in the Tika area on Saturday. A day later, the gang was dispersed and two children were slashed and killed.

The following security measures were taken: the area was cordoned off and a search was made for the gang members who were reported to have fled yesterday.

Children escape
At 12.45 a.m. the gang slashed the ankles of a child who was lying on the ground near the railway station. The child escaped and was reported to have fled.

The last victim was a 12-year-old boy who was slashed to death by the gang. He was taken to the hospital but died of his wounds. The gang was reported to have fled towards the north.

Tied together and slashed

RAILWAY gang of eight Africans were tied to a log and slashed to death by a gang of 20 to 30 strong which was active in the Thika area in the early part of Saturday. One of the men was killed, and two children were slashed and injured but managed to escape.

GOVERNMENT ENDS SURRENDER TALKS PLAN 'Gen. China' to begin life sentence

TWO MAU MAU CHIEFS NO LONGER HELD

The plan for the use of "General China," 32-year-old Kikuyu and former K.A.R. corporal, who became one of the leaders of the Mau Mau gangs, to induce the surrender of terrorists in the Mount Kenya area has been abandoned. The Acting Governor, Sir Frederick Crawford, stated yesterday that "China" was now on his way to prison to serve his life sentence.

It was also disclosed at a Press conference at Government House, attended by the Chief of Staff, East Africa, Sir George Erskine, his Chief of Staff, Maj-Gen G. D. G. Heyman, and the Chief Native Commissioner, Mr. E. H. Windley, that two other Mau Mau "Generals," "Langanyika" and "Kalaba"—who were reported to have surrendered in response to "China" and the bloodshed letters, are no longer in the hands of the authorities.

Troop operations intensified

They returned to the forest, in company with six Mau Mau "delegates," after parleys with the authorities on March 30 at Nyeri, and no further news of them or their confederates has been received. One theory is that on their return to the gangs in the forest they were arrested. The Acting Governor stated that the policy of using high-ranking Mau Mau terrorists to induce their surrender negotiations had been abandoned. Both "Langanyika" and "Kalaba" were they would eventually lose their freedom, but while negotiations were in progress they had been allowed to "roam about."

Similarity in Comet injuries LINK BETWEEN NAPLES AND ELBA CRASHES

The bodies of five of the 21 victims of the Comet disaster were yesterday flown from Naples to Rome for identification. The bodies were found in the wreckage of the aircraft carrier, Eagle, on Saturday. It was learned that they bore injuries similar to those of the victims of the Comet crash three months ago.

Surgeon-General Ronald Russell, of the Eagle, said that all the bodies of three men and two women had extensive injuries to the lower limbs but there was no mutilation and no sign of burning. He added that he could not say whether the injuries were caused by the impact on the water or by some sudden explosion in flight. He agreed that death must have been very rapid.

Three of the bodies were in a state of complete decomposition. They were almost fully clothed and the hair of the man without shoes and lower trousers had been crushed by the force of impact.

The injuries were multiple bruises and fractures, especially in the lower limbs, a post-mortem would probably reveal, it was stated.

Salvage privately

Capt. Douglas Holland Martin, Commander of the Eagle, said that the bodies were picked up in an area where the sea was 120 ft deep, and depth ruled out the possibility of salvage operations.

Air Marshal Sir Harold Whitham, chief of B.O.A.C. medical services, arrived in Rome by air from London. He said that he would go to Naples tomorrow to see the bodies of the other five victims of the crash. He also said that he would be in charge of the medical services in the event of a similar disaster.


