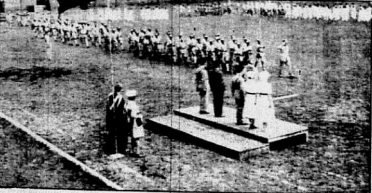

## HEARING BEGINS AT KAPENGURIA
