NO COMPULSION IN NATIONAL SERVICE

British Policy Outlined

THE NEW LORD PRIVY SEAL, SIR JOHN ANDERSON, ELUCIDATED HIS PLANS FOR NATIONAL VOLUNTARY SERVICE WHEN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS DEBATED THIS MATTER OPENED ON TUESDAY NIGHT, AND DECLARED THAT HE HAD MADE PREPARATIONS FOR A NATIONAL REGISTER OF PROPERTY AS WELL AS A PERSONNEL, IF THAT SHOULD EVER BE FOUND NECESSARY.

He defended the voluntary principle, replying to the argument that conscription would improve foreign opinion, and stating that conscription was of little use in getting people for jobs requiring judgment, initiative and discretion. The member and importance of jobs of this kind had greatly increased.

There was Liberal Labour and Independent support for the proposals, but Mr. L. S. Amery and Sir Edward Grigg criticized them on the grounds of ineffectiveness.

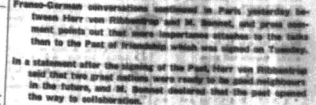

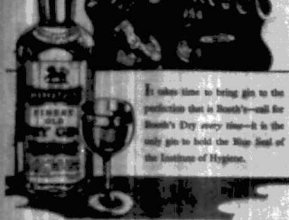

COLONIES DEBATE IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

All Opposed To Returning Lands To Germany BUT NO PLEDGE FOR THE FUTURE

London, December 8. The British Government is not even considering the transfer of any colonies or mandated territory. The assurance was given by the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, in the course of the House of Commons debate last night.

OPPOSITION LEADERS

Mr. MacDonnell said 'I do not believe that there is today any serious opinion in this country which is opposed to handing over to any other country one set of the territories or peoples for whose government we are responsible either as a Colonial or a Mandate Power. That view has been expressed this afternoon in every part of the House and that view is shared by His Majesty's Government. We are not discussing this matter. We are not considering it. It is not now an issue in practical politics.'

League Leaders' Views

Lord Francis Scott, one of the members of the Transvaal Legislative Council, said that the British Government had been asked to return the territories to Germany and that the Government had refused to do so.

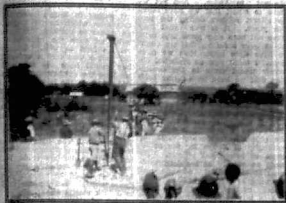

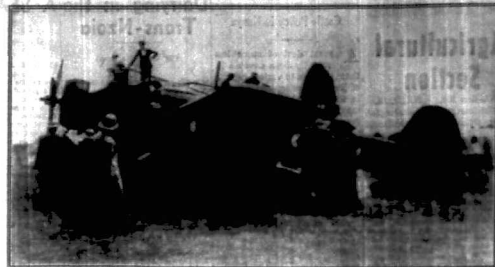

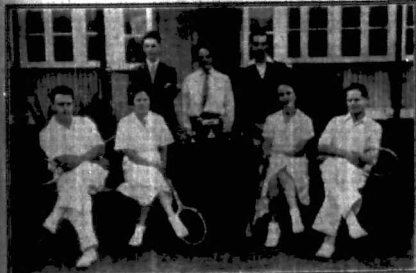
