## FINANCIAL STRENGTH AS A DECIDING FACTOR

### If War Broke Out Between Britain And Germany

#### INFLUENCE FOR PEACE

London, December 16.—Mr. Neville Chamberlain spoke at a luncheon at the House of Commons yesterday of Britain's financial strength.

The Prime Minister said: "It may take it that when Germany is defeated, it will be the possible consequences of a conflict, if ever a conflict should arise between our two countries, they think not only of our armaments, but of our great financial resources, which in a war of long duration, might well prove to be the deciding factor."

"It is this sense which is always with us, and which I am sure has very great influence in preserving the peace of the world."

The Prime Minister was speaking at a luncheon given by Sir George Broadbridge a Member for the City of London. Sir George said that people often spoke about the weakness of Britain's defenses, but rarely mentioned the country's great financial strength.—(Reuter).

### MECHANICS WANTED FOR NAVY

The British Admiralty has issued orders for additional recruits for the engineering branch of the Royal Navy. For the first time additional recruits who are becoming increasingly necessary will be recruited from the Navy district from 1934.

The Navy expansion programme is being cut 28 per cent. This will be accomplished in the coming year according to the Admiralty.

U.S. NOTE TO GERMANY  
Washington, Dec. 16.—The United States presented a note to Berlin yesterday which reiterated that no assurance has yet been given that American money being in Germany would be loaned without discrimination between those who borrow.—Reuter.

# ECHO OF INCOME TAX AGREEMENT

## Government Denies Agreement To Limit It To £43,500

The Government of Kenya does not consider that it is under an obligation to take £43,500 from the community through the Income Tax. The official attitude is that what is regarded as a moderate rate of tax has produced enough more (especially from people overseas) than was expected.

In the Legislative Council this week the Earl of Innes quoted the statements made by leading European Elected Members in the past in which he based the claim that the Income Tax introduced by the Government in Kenya should be limited to £43,500. He pointed out that the gross amount of taxation had been, in fact, increased by the higher yield and had decreased as intended when the tax was introduced.

It is felt it is right that I should explain to Council my reasons for regarding an independent estimate of the £43,500 which has been advanced on the motion of the Earl of Innes as an underestimate of the revenue to be derived from the Income Tax. I feel further that the estimate is based on the report of the Income Tax Commissioner, and not on a more realistic basis. I feel that I should also mention that the Income Tax has produced more than was anticipated, and that it is not possible to estimate the revenue to be derived from the tax on the basis of the report of the Income Tax Commissioner.

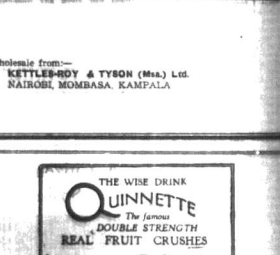

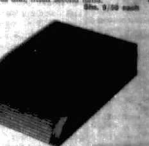

**British Policy**  
When the Prime Minister told Press representatives of all nations that the British Government in London last week that so long as we persist with our faith and undiminished hope, his search for appeasement in Europe, British newspapers applauded his statement but did not all share his optimism. Appeasement has always been a British Prime Minister that he is working for peace. Perhaps "appeasement" is not a good word, it sounds too passive. It is something a freedom child by giving it little by little. We are in some danger today of being fascinated and mesmerized by a slogan, and when Mr. Chamberlain follows up his restoration of his objective by selling the House of Commons that he does not propose to seek its sanction before he is even negotiating with the German government—though he is openly quite prepared to gamble on party loyalty when he has to risk the House of Commons to his peace plan—somebody can blame if they continue to be suspicious of the Prime Minister's conception of "appeasement." Suspicion is visible in many directions. It is noteworthy, for instance, that before he visits Rome (which he proposes to do while Parliament is in recess) sections of the House of Commons want to bring him down to agreement on some things which, in their view, he must discuss. The new anxiety about the future of the Colonial Empire—as distinct from the Mandated area—has not particular the question to be asked today about British Somaliland, is one significant sign that Mr. Chamberlain does not enjoy the full trust which would have been in a much larger measure had the country felt justified in confiding in him the task of appeasing the Dictators.  
The fact that the country is not backing the Prime Minister without qualification is a sign of growing strength. It is one sign of the returning appreciation in Britain of realities and of confidence, of a reaction against the policy of appeasement on the threats which have been behind almost every international crisis from the days of Japanese aggression in Manchuria to the Italian conquest of Abyssinia and the systematic German violation of the Locarno treaties. Even by a show of force. The Prime Minister found his speech in favour of peace last week for this assurance to the people in Britain, in the Empire and to British allies. The propaganda has now proceeded far enough for us to say with confidence that we are in a position to fulfil those obligations." That is the first time an unqualified statement about the success of progress of rearmament has been made since the task was undertaken.  
But that is not all. Speaking practically at the same time, Sir Thomas Inskip, Minister for the Co-ordination of Armaments, said: "We are completing our defence both at Home and in other parts of the Empire so that we need no longer depend from any private act. No longer will our Foreign Secretary or Prime Minister be compelled by considerations of weakness or default on our part." A Director of Works Armstrong said last week that progress made in rearmament during the past two years had been remarkable. The Prime Minister has also warned those in Germany who may think about war that in a war of long duration Great Britain's financial resources might well prove to be the deciding factor." Indeed he believes that it may be necessary to take restraining influence—a significant suggestion that there have been some Secretary of State who have been weighed the chances of conflict.  
Last week, too, the Home Secretary, faced with the assertion that German firms in Britain are discharging their British employees and recruiting Germans, gave a firm assurance to the House of Commons that "no person will be given to foreigners to come to work in this country if the job can be done by somebody already living here."  
The British Board of Trade has been given special powers to keep political as well as commercial matters in mind in operating a new export credit which is expressly intended to deal, if necessary, with "economic" transactions. The President of the Board of Trade is now talking about Britain's "economic" transactions. The decision coincides with reports about the growing advance to bulging Germany and with renewed German attacks on Britain and America—two incidents notably strengthened by the German invasion of Poland. The Anglo-American Trade Agreement. The unprecedented change in British trade policy follows the success of Germany in making an agreement with Rumania, whose King Carol was only recently in London. By that agreement Rumania will take a quarter of Germany's oil exports and supply of raw materials and grain and will pay on the latter system by supplying manufactured goods. The net result is expected to be that Germany will supply one-half of Rumania's imports and take

one-third of her exports. Rumania (naturally the Germans have made a better agreement in taking twenty-five million, and the Mexican "expatriates" all (to her the property of Britain and America) in exchange for exchange for machinery. These agreements are reasons which despite the talk of "appeasement" British is determined necessary to engage in a commercial war to protect her own interests. Through its bringing in the City of London. The City wants peace for its financial policy. Mr. Chamberlain wants peace because he has a "business" mind. But the public opinion is waking up to the danger of too many concessions, the people do not want Munich to happen again. This is no longer on the side of the Prime Minister. An election is due next year. Events since Munich have not failed to do his advantage. While it is possible possibly regret his effects to maintain peace or to seek appeasement, even they would fail—which many people believe they will—the British nation may well be brought by the Premier's policy to the point of deciding during the next few months that it will be wiser to sacrifice Mr. Chamberlain and his Inner Cabinet than to pay the price which, in his present mood, he is prepared to be willing to let in consideration. The Rome talk will throw light on whether that choice will have to be made.

## RAILWAY TRAFFIC

### Figures For 10 Months

Approximate traffic receipts made to the Kenya and Uganda Railway for the months of October, November and December, 1928, are £184,212 as compared with £174,000 for the corresponding period of 1927.

During the first ten months of 1928 approximate receipts were £223,286, as against £216,850 for the corresponding period of 1927, and £277,585 for the corresponding period last year.

Total export traffic received at the Coast for the first ten months of 1928 was 262,826 tons—a decrease of 4.6 per cent on the total for the period last year; import traffic raised from 240,000 tons in 1927 to 249,000 tons, an increase of 3.8 per cent; total public traffic was 104,628 tons, an increase of 4 per cent. The total train mileage on the line during the ten months was 2,282,448 as compared with 2,238,848 for the corresponding period last year.

The list of commodities of greatest importance imported is reproduced from a statement published by the Kenya and Uganda Railway which shows that compared with October 1927 cement dropped by 1,028 tons to 17,709 tons; motor cars by 79 tons to 11 tons; iron and steel by 1,103 tons to 444 tons; and sugar by 2,445 tons to 505 tons; but corn increased from 2,346 tons to 3,464 tons and oil and kerosene from 1,141 tons to 1,419 tons respectively.

In the exports, coffee rose by 769 tons to 1,831 tons and cotton seed by 1,216 and 1,869 to 2,538 and 2,598 tons respectively; maize by 1,225 tons to 2,245 tons and sugar by 811 tons to 1,373 tons. The only really substantial decrease in exports during the month was in ground rubber which dropped by 817 tons to 84 tons.

The Vicar, the Rev. J. H. Simpson, stated that he had felt in doubt as to the propriety of allowing this service as a missionary to the "Ghetto" but had done so with the proviso that he was to have the satisfaction.

"The couple who have eaten the fish and chips in the church were a man and a woman; for the church, a great deal of thought has been done to check this practice. Last week someone distributed leaflets outside the church, but the vicar said: 'I will deprive the man of his rights, but I will not deprive the woman of the opportunity of doing good.'

Mr. Simpson wonders if the people who smoked the church were a sign of general mental degeneracy in the Ghetto—a gratifying idea.

"It is such a case," he said, "that I should have been able to come to the aid of the man and woman. In that case I should have been able to give the man a job, but the vicar said: 'The vicar is not a missionary in his own right, but you know what you stand with him.'




