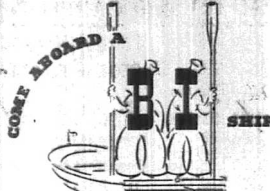

DUTCH AND SWISS TAKE FURTHER PRECAUTIONS

Martial Law On Holland's Frontier

The Netherlands Government have proclaimed Martial Law in all regions of strategic importance along the frontier with Germany and what are known as the inundation areas. There are the areas which can be quickly flooded in the event of invasion. There are unofficial reports that they have already been thoroughly soaked by the release of large quantities of water. Last night's declaration of Martial Law is the most drastic step the Government has taken recently to strengthen the frontier defences. Switzerland also has adopted further defence precautions. The Government has ordered measures to be taken in readiness for the transfer of factories from places near the frontier to the interior. The Dutch Government's measures are described in informed circles as merely a precaution designed to strengthen the defences of the country and curb espionage. They have not been taken, they say, because of any external attack. The inundation places about 50 towns and villages under martial law but no large cities are affected.

GERMANS' SUCCESS OF HEAVY GUNS IN CONVOY SYSTEM

In spite of bad weather, activity by both sides on the Western front was noted yesterday. Last night's French communications said that in the course of the day there was the usual activity of small infantry units on both sides at various points of the front. Today's communications say the Western front still remains quiet and there is little beyond patrol activity. The German communiqué speaks of small military, but not of any isolated attacks. The Germans are reinforcing the French fortifications with heavy and light field guns and one report says that shells have been fired in villages some miles behind the Maginot Line. 1000 Italian Bays. Paris military sources say that French troops beat back a German force of about 1500 men who were attempting to capture a village in the northern sector of the western front. Six German prisoners were taken. Major General the Duke of Gloucester and Lord Gort both visited military units in the front line yesterday. French planes yesterday made reconnaissance flights over the German front and returned safely.

Post For Lord Nuffield

The Air Ministry announced that Lord Nuffield has been appointed Director-General of Manufactures in the Air Ministry. He will supervise the supply services of the Royal Air Force and be responsible for the organisation which is to be set up to repair aircraft and engines. He will have the assistance of Mr. C. W. Premier Praises Empire's Efforts

Tribute To What Is Being Done In The Colonies

Mr. Chamberlain's weekly review of the war in the House of Commons this afternoon included a comment on Mr. Molotov's speech and a tribute to the keenness of the Empire to make a contribution to the war effort.

FREEDOM'S URGE

Mr. Chamberlain's speech, Mr. Chamberlain said, had been eagerly awaited in Berlin. He added, "I imagine that it occasions some disappointment in that quarter. The speech had been carefully studied by the British Government and they had not with interest the definition of Russia's future aims. Mr. Chamberlain recalled an article by Mr. Molotov in May this year in which he said that the cause of peace was the prevention of any sort of aggression. He also mentioned the position of the British Government and the fact that they would not be disturbed in any way by the actions of the Allies. Britain and France had stated those aims in plain terms and that they would not be disturbed by the great majority of people in the world.

Escaped From U-Boat

The British steamer, the 1500 ton, says she was fired on by a submarine which was sunk and her crew without damage.

Americans Annoyed

A reference to Mr. Molotov's speech in the House of Representatives at Washington yesterday in the course of the discussion of the neutrality bill. 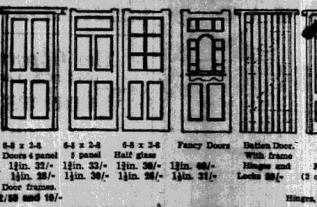

FOR KEENA How Farmers Can Best Help Britain And The Empire

The Secretary of State for the Colonies has now been able to supply some indication of the type of production upon which this Colony would be well advised to concentrate in order to meet the requirements of the United Kingdom (and of other parts of the Empire) during the war, as well as local needs.

It is desirable that Kenya should be self-supporting as regards essential foodstuffs. As regards the various export commodities the Secretary of State has issued the following information upon information supplied to him by the Ministries concerned in the United Kingdom.

Following is the schedule attached to the above communication, issued by the Chief Secretary.

Beans and Peas.—The United Kingdom requires an increased supply of beans and peas, particularly beans and peas. The matter is being taken up with the Ministry of Agriculture. It is probable that there will be an increased demand for beans for animal feeding in the United Kingdom.

Butter.—For various reasons the consumption of butter in the United Kingdom is likely to be restricted, and all available supplies from the Empire will be required in England.

Subject to the necessity for supplying other East African Territories.

PIQUANT POLITICS

While Mr. H. A. Pagan, M.P., for South Devon, is in the United Kingdom, he has been busy with the Ministry of Agriculture. It is probable that there will be an increased demand for beans for animal feeding in the United Kingdom.

Supplies.—The Sugar Corporation in the United Kingdom has offered to purchase all surplus sugar available during the next few months to furnish the United Kingdom requirements.

Wool.—Adequate supplies of wool for the United Kingdom are available in the form of raw wool, as well as in the form of yarn and cloth.

Coffee.—No control of supplies or prices has been imposed upon the United Kingdom by the Ministry of Agriculture.

Copra and Oil Seeds.—The United Kingdom requirements of copra oil seeds will be met by the export of copra and oil seeds.

Flax.—The Ministry of Supply in the United Kingdom is interested in the export of flax and flax seed.

Waxes and Bases.—No duties or taxes are imposed upon the export of waxes and bases.

Iron and Steel.—The United Kingdom requirements of iron and steel are being met by the export of iron and steel.

Commissions and Kenya Tea.—The Kenya Tea Commission has been established to regulate the export of tea from Kenya.

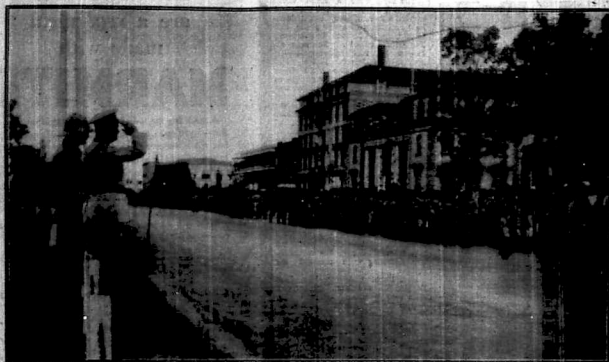

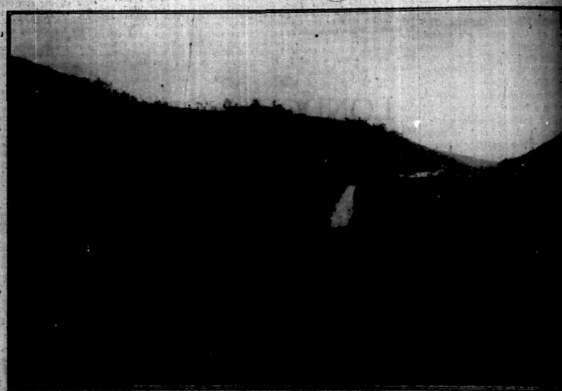

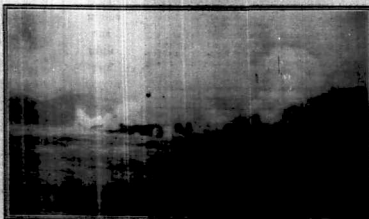

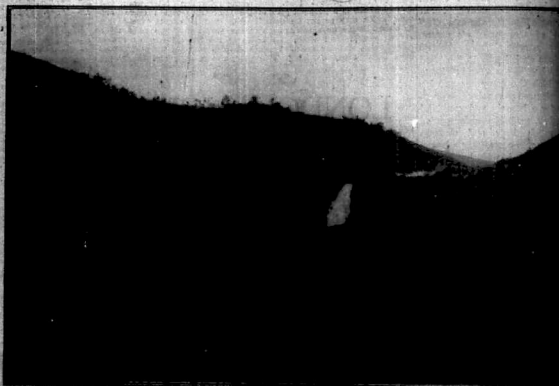

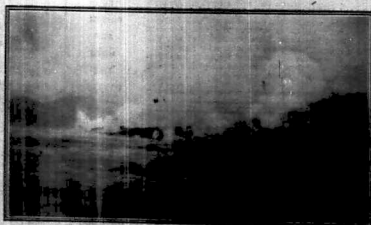

WHERE do the German Army go from now? To win this war and to save his regime, Hitler's Adolf has to seek a path whereon he can renew the war-movement wherewith he captured Poland. tenant should surely be available in some capacity, other than that of a witness, to guide the Government.
The question of rest restriction is difficult because there are several factors which enter into it. An unrelenting increase would distort many other aspects of living costs and would probably lead also to a demand for an increase in the housing allowances paid to Civil Servants, adding to the general burden of the taxpayer. At the moment, too, there is an acute shortage, as few people are able to go on holiday, particularly to the Government, and the result is the dislocation of business, a reduction in employment and the fact that a fair number of families are having to live on allowances from wage-earners now in uniform, rent increases would manifestly add to family difficulties. It is reported that the rent rack has already begun in the Asian living quarters and, as the Mombasa strike enquiry tended to show, and as recent investigations of the housing problem in Nairobi have also proved, the rent factor is even now no inconsiderable burden on the town African.
