8 Nazis Killed And 60 Injured In Munich

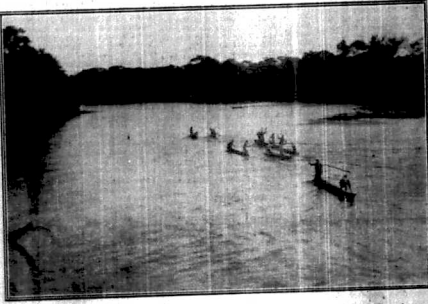

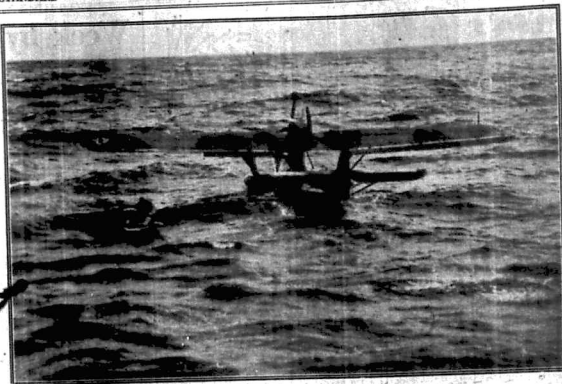

NAZI AIRMAN'S ADVENTURE
Low Flying In Britain
[STANDARD] CORRESPONDENT
London, November 2.
Hundreds of evacuated children on their way to school and people going to work in a town on the North-East coast were startled by a startling machine-gun duel between a German plane and a British pursuit plane, not more than a few hundred feet above the roof-top level of morning.
Several bursts of fire from the British plane sent the Nazi machine hurriedly off towards the north-east, low visibility preventing further observation by the townspeople.
As they ran from their homes the people of the German machine striking over the town at a very low altitude.
An A.R.P. storekeeper told with the German machine engaged in combat.
"I saw a big black machine," he said. "It would not be any higher than 200 ft. and was about a hundred yards away from me. Then a smaller plane loomed in sight."
"The machine seemed close to me so I saw the machine gunner in the second plane rise in his seat as he fired a number of rounds. The first plane, up to this point, appeared to be unaware of the fact that he was being pursued, but immediately the first round was fired the British machine the Nazi dived off at a tangent in the other direction."
Flow Low Over Sea
How a German plane, apparently the same as that over the coast a few minutes later, flew over the town within about 30 ft. of a motor-bus as a spot in Northumberland was described by the only passenger in the bus.
According to him, the plane, which was also seen by the conductor and the bus driver, circled the bus, gained height again, and made off in a north-easterly direction.
"I had been up in the country for the weekend and was returning in the bus," he said. "About 4.25 a.m. I saw a large black plane flying very low towards us. The conductor and driver thought at first that it was a British plane, but I was in the Naval Air Service in the last war and believed myself that it was a German type."
"The plane eventually came down to within 30 ft. of us, and I could plainly see the black crosses on the under side of the wings. Though the machine was going to land, but it followed the bus and crossed the road for about three minutes."
"At one time I thought the crew were going to open fire on us. I could see the pilot examining the bus, and it seemed to me as though he was trying to get his bearings from the destination board."
"Nothing happened, however, and eventually the machine turned and flew away. As soon as possible I reported the matter to the police."

ETHER WAR STARTS

10 FINE FOR ASSAULT
False Robbery Story
A remarkable story of the alleged robbery with violence of a young Indian in the Fort Hill Bazaar was today supported Court Justice before his Honour the Chief Justice Sir Joseph Sheridan and the District Judge, Mr. J. G. O'Connell. Two Indians, Khabaji Nohani and Anant Singh, were charged with three counts: robbery with violence, assault causing bodily harm and unlawful wounding.
Annoyed at having lasted all day, and continued after the usual hour for the sitting of the court, Khabaji was acquitted on all counts and Nohani was convicted of assault causing bodily harm, and acquitted on the other two counts.
Mr. O'Connell, presiding by the Attorney General, appeared for the Prosecution, and Mr. E. P. Fitzgerald, for the defence.
Robbery Story
The complainant, 18-year-old Ramji Dault, employed by an Indian firm, was taken to the office of the Trading Company's store on the instructions of his employer, when he was attacked by the two accused, resulting in bodily harm from sticks on the head and arms. The money, which was a bag, had dropped to the ground and, according to the complainant, was picked up by the two accused. He fell back because of the attack and stood for long with his hands raised in protest to his assistance.
"The two men," Mr. O'Connell said, "did not remember going to the District Commissioner's office to report the matter to the hospital that night (evidence showed that he was taken to the D.C.'s and to the hospital for treatment) and the witness felt remembered was waiting up in the morning with a bandaged head."
In cross-examination he admitted that he had previously quarrelled with the two accused and they had both been fined for fighting.
Dault declared that he arrived on the scene after the alleged assault and took part in the fight. He had a complaint with a knife in his hand. Nohani declared that the complainant had drawn a knife on him and that he had used his stick in self defence.
"The two men," Mr. O'Connell said, "were not allowed to be examined by his Lordship, two of the witnesses gave it in their opinion that the complainant was not a robber. The complainant was not involved and that Ramji had threatened to assault him with a knife. The third witness agreed with his Lordship's opinion on the first two points but was doubtful on the last point."
His Lordship gave judgment, and said that in his agreement with the complainant that there never was a robbery. The evidence as a whole, he said, suggested that the robbery charge was an "afterthought". As to whether Khabaji was implicated in any way the evidence also pointed to the fact that the witness, who happened had happened as the result of bad blood between the second accused and Ramji. But he did not believe second accused's story.
The first accused was acquitted for lack of evidence. The second accused, Nohani Singh, 200, (in default of his bail) was fined £10 and ordered to pay his 100/- compensation to Ramji Dault.

Remembrance Day in a Changed Setting —Continued from page 1— The right to live in peace with their neighbours and to live in freedom under a Government of their own choosing. They had come together, he said, to convey to their fellow men the same simple ideals which money has had to abandon the American, British and French dead and to give to their very lives. The redemptive character of these ideals with the hope and memory of the first Armistice still live in our minds. We want the whole world to be happy.

As a matter of fact, Lord Mayor of London said he was very happy to respond to Mayor La Guardia's invitation to speak to the citizens of New York from London, the capital of British freedom. On this day they had been in the same place and liberty now once again threatened by the force of violence and lawlessness. It was his high privilege and grave responsibility to be throughout the armistice year which they shared, the Chief Magistrate of the great city of London, the heart of the British Commonwealth and the wealth of Nations. The title which he bore was a symbol of the great tradition which was London's most cherished possession, the tradition of just lawfully administered justice. Not community today was more devoted to power than the city of London for the foundations of her prosperity rested on the strength and integrity of the laws of the nations of the world in the pursuit of free commerce. But the call of duty and the disturbance of all its activities had thrown unwisely all of these resources and splendid gifts of the struggle. There could be no better label of their condition than what was at stake in this conflict, and their determination that the right must prevail.

Mayor La Guardia and the Lord Mayor of London were then greeted by the President of the Paris Municipal Council who spoke of the bonds of unity between the cities of France to the fallen sons of Great Britain. "Once again," he said, "Britain is at our side fighting for liberty."

In London there were very few of the ordinary symbols of Armistice but the fragments of war were everywhere. The red Flinders poppies were there, too, as the people carrying their gas masks passed about their surroundings. London with its suburbs and boarded up windows and air raid shelters. In Whitehall, by the Cenotaph, there was no official address, as it is one observer said, all the essential of the Day of Remembrance could be held.

Wreaths were laid by representatives of all the Old Comrades Associations and Regimental organizations. The wreath from the King was made of Flinders poppies and French symbols. There were several wreaths from members of the Royal Family and many from private citizens including mothers and wives bereaved by the war. One of the wreaths at the Cenotaph was laid by the Polish Mission, which had also presented a wreath to the feet of Marshal Pilsudski's memorial at Victoria.

The life of London went on but the silence was there, an involuntary silence. Traffic and pedestrians and office workers in the surrounding buildings were all silent. But there was a two minutes silence at the service at Westminster Abbey following an address delivered by the Duke, Many British and French soldiers in uniform were present.
