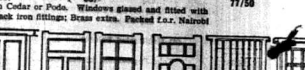

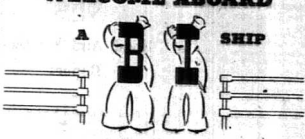

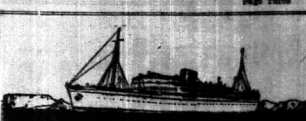

Kenya Butter Price

Government Increase In Local Price Being Considered

Important statement regarding the future of butter prices in Kenya was made at the annual meeting held in Nakuru this week. The Chairman of the Kenya Co-operative Creamery, Ltd., stated that the price of butter in Kenya had fallen to 12s per cwt. and that the Government was considering an increase in the local price.

It was stated that the Government was considering an increase in the local price of butter from 12s to 14s per cwt. This would be a significant increase for the local market. 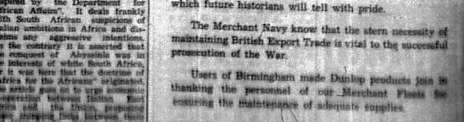

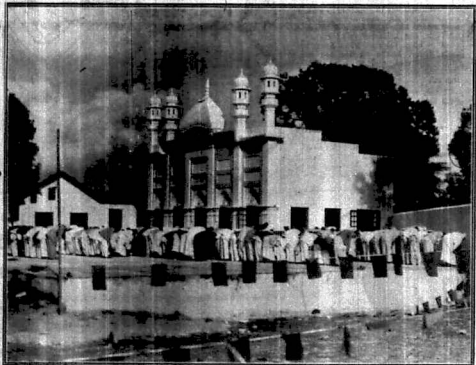

THE FOOD OF THE PLANT

By A. G. SCOTT WATSON, School of Rural Economy, Oxford University.

LONG before the days of agricultural science the farmer had discovered for himself that certain substances, applied to the soil, improved the growth of plants. Some of these—dung, wood ashes and leaf-mould—were derived from plants; others, like bones and fish-bone, were mineral—fertilizers.

The first of these compounds to be formed in the plant is the simple sugar glucose or dextrose. This is made from carbon dioxide taken by the roots. The sugar is quickly converted to starch.

The protein comes in the form of amino acids, which are combined with sugar to form proteins. These are the building blocks of the plant's body.

The early notion was that the plant took its food from the soil. It is now known that the plant takes its food from the air and the soil.

SEQUEL TO MUNICH EXPLOSION

ARREST OF ALLEGED BRITISH AGENTS

Further reports were received last Friday indicating serious divergences of opinion between German leaders. Hitler's desire to start a big offensive against the Allies at once is said to be opposed by his High Command.

Another message says that leading officers of the Air Force have been arrested by order of the head of the Gestapo. A blood purge similar to that of five years ago but more brutal in character is said to be taking place in Germany as a sequel to the Munich bomb explosion.

There are also further reports of the restrictive measures being taken against the Czechs. Many of those arrested are said to have been taken to one of the most dreaded of German concentration camps.

The German Government's rejection of the mediation offer. The Netherlands Government has left for Holland to report on the situation. The failure of the German Government to make a written reply to the mediation offer has provoked much comment. The Czech Legation, Prague, has made a statement to the effect that the German Government has taken away more than 1,200 students in buses.

Two thousand Nazi reinforcements arrived later in the city with long convoys of motor vehicles and machine guns. It is believed to be the Nazi retaliation for the demonstration earlier this week when students gathered near the tomb of the Lincoln Warrior shouting "Freedom and peace for our Czechs." Another message says that in Austrian factories resistance to the Nazis is becoming more active; machinery has been interfered with and industrial plant develops mysterious defects.

Divided German

Neutral correspondents in Berlin are almost all agreed in their reports that serious conflicts among the leaders in Germany and hostilities and divided counsel as to Germany's policy are being manifested. All day yesterday Hitler received a constant stream of military reports. He is reported to have been in a bad temper. It is stated that the German High Command is opposed to this. His hesitation in making a further effort from the Austrians is attributed to the realization that should the attempt fail the Army might thrust Hitler aside and seize power.

Traitor

The Foreign Secretary, Von Ribbentrop, is reported to have signed an anti-Comintern Pact and also to have agreed with Russia, in reports which are being widely reported. It is also reported that he is threatening letters to him as a traitor because he has invited German troops to a concentration camp the day after Munich explosion. Thousands of leaders were distributed in Prague according to the German Police of arranging of the expedition.

As a result of all these facts, the Nazis find themselves today in complete and appalling isolation. There is no doubt whatever in any nation that the overthrow of the Nazi power will be greeted by the whole world with a great sigh of relief.

Mr. Neutra, Germany's Minister of Health, is a reality. It is a reality that the Western powers are standing in line. Time is on our side.

BIGGER INSURANCE ON SHIPPING
The Liberty Bells, while pointing out that the Allies are superior in numbers with the rights of neutrals, says they have a certain logic and they are far from being satisfied with the insurance shipping by insurance action. The insurance action between Germany and neutrals is not commensurate today to the indignation of neutrals.

Premier Visits Air Force
The Prime Minister, Lord Chamberlain paid a visit yesterday to the headquarters of the Royal Air Force and was received by Air Chief Marshal Sir Hugh Dowding.

Further evidence of mine laying in Germany, in defiance of the provisions of international law, was provided on Friday night when it became known that a large mine-laying German mine had been washed up on the coast of Denmark.

This does not include the mine picked up by a vessel. Their mine-laying is indicated by reports that German mines were picked up recently in a single night.

Her crew numbering 127 and also 35 passengers were rescued. Many of the passengers are said to be South Africans who have been on board since the outbreak of war. When picked up they were in desperate plight. The crew were taken prisoners.

It is learned in London that Allied warships have captured three German cargo boats of the South America coast.—(Reuters)
