Decree Law In France

FOR WAR'S DURATION

December 1.—The French Chamber of Deputies last night passed a decree of confidence in M. Daladier by 509 to 128 votes and gave him the necessary four-fifths majority for the war. This means that Daladier will be re-elected by the Chamber of Deputies on December 15. Daladier had called for a vote of confidence after the Finance Committee had proposed an amendment which would have restricted him to six Parliament every month to approve his new Government.

Another Nazi Plane Shot Down

December 1.—Another German plane has been a victim to British fighters of the coast of Britain. The Air Ministry announces that a German bomber aeroplane was captured and shot down on the North Sea on Wednesday by two British fighters. The crew of the bomber were rescued by a Norwegian ship and the pilot was taken to a neutral territory where he will be returned to Germany.

Twenty-four more fighters of the Royal Air Force were shot down by a German aeroplane north of the Pyrenees last night. It is reported that the plane had been shot down by a British fighter.

FINLAND A VICTIM OF EAST AND WEST GERMAN SCHEMES?

Government Resigns To Save Country From Ruin

WORLD'S ANGER

THE FINNISH GOVERNMENT RESIGNED YESTERDAY IN ORDER TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR NEGOTIATIONS TO BE RESUMED WITH THE SOVIET UNION. IT IS REPORTED, BECAUSE OF A THREAT THAT OTHERWISE RUSSIA WOULD DEVASTATE THE COUNTRY, NEVERTHELESS AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT STRESSED THERE WAS NO QUESTION OF SURRENDER BY FINLAND.

Fighting was still going on yesterday though there were no further raids by Russian aircraft on Finnish towns. There is world-wide indignation about Russia's unprovoked attack on a small independent nation and the opinion is held in some quarters that the invasion is part of a pre-arranged plan by Russia and Germany.

December 1.—The Finnish Government resigned on the early hours of this morning. There is a persistent rumour that the Russians sent an ultimatum threatening to invade Finland unless the Government resigned by 3 a.m. At two o'clock this morning Parliament was still in session after passing unanimously a vote of confidence in the Government. Nevertheless in all the circumstances and in the hope of saving the country from destruction the Government decided to resign.

One factor which it believed to be essential to the formation of a new Cabinet is the desire that all political parties be represented as they were not in the previous Cabinet. 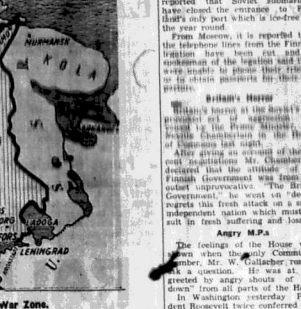



Clan Gatherings

All over Kenya this week Scotsmen have been gathering round the haggis. It is true that there has been a certain decorum, a suggestion of informality, a desire to be guileless of unseemly gaiety, about those aggregations of heno-men, and very wisely, that even a war is no adequate excuse for a breach with tradition. Hospitality is no less a virtue in war, when the pace may be greater and the ingredients more difficult to secure, than in peace when the risk is a variation in the round of social intercourse. Scots hold their reputation for hospitality in high regard, and when, as in the case of the haggis, it is inscribed in the long and unbroken records of years of Caledonian dinners it would be a shame to make of an infrequently disciplined German corporal an excuse for abandoning so excellent a habit. Those who look to the haggis as the worship of a deity, an indecorous observance in these days of strife, but the Scots regard it as the one thing that has a surest stipend for what is right, and particularly for what is proper.

Yesterday morning she was intercepted by South African bombing planes south of Cape Point and ordered to proceed to Simonstown; whereupon the crew scuttled the vessel. The survivors were picked up afterwards.

A week ago the *Watussi* slipped out of Mozambique harbour where she had sought refuge when war broke out.

Two more Nazi ships have been captured by the British Navy. They are the *Ellbek* of 2,125 tons and a 215 tons trawler, the *Sophie Busse*. Both ships are now in British ports.

A later message says the *Watussi* was sighted 80 miles off Cape Point by South African bombers who ordered her to proceed to Simonstown.

SET ON FIRE

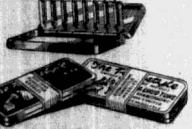

WAR TAXATION: POSTAGE STAMPS
To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir—During the last year several British Dominions and British Colonies issued postage stamps to raise funds to help their war expenditure. This means was looked upon as a useful and congenial method from most objections to increased taxation, and not only as to collect, causing little or no hardship to the payer, but also actually an added development to the Territories concerned.

I would suggest that one or two war stamps be issued now for the East African Territories during the present campaign, provided the stamps that postage is not unduly increased. 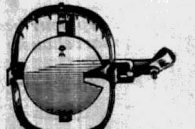

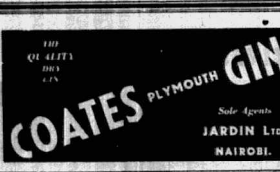

KENYA LOCUST POSITION

Much Damage To Native Maize In Meru

Following is the locust position in Kenya reported to the Kenya Agricultural Department's commonwealth locust surveyors on November 29.

NYANZA PROVINCE

Two big immature swarms entered Meru on November 27. One swarmed west to Hain and one to S. Kiloh. Locusts were reported at Maseno on the 29th.

An Officer of the Department is investigating the reported laying of Mahururu in this area, including Kiligori, Songhor and Kora. It has been indicated for some weeks.

Hoppers are being baited at Meru.

RIFT VALLEY PROVINCE

November 29. Three medium-sized swarms passed Emetete, being North. Grazing was damaged at Lokosa. Meru was reported at Maseno on the 29th.

A medium-sized swarm was seen at Nyoro.

CENTRAL PROVINCE

November 29. A medium-sized swarm was seen in the high area of Meru during the week.

Grazing was damaged.

Meru. On November 19 and 20 a large swarm from the north passed over the Orange area of Taitavi moving south-east. Great damage to native maize is reported.

Machakos. A large swarm of immature locusts are circling in various parts of the Machakos Reserve.

On November 23 a scattered swarm from the direction of Thika and Meru arrived at Mt. Kenya. The Drove Sabab area and the Reserve and Machakos Reserve.

On November 24 a small swarm was seen near the station. They appeared to be moving towards the Machakos Reserve.

On November 25 two large swarms were seen near Mt. Kenya to pass, were seen near Kilwebi.

Mt. Kenya. A report from Tanganyika states that swarms arrived at Mt. Kenya on November 23 and 24. A small swarm was reported from the direction of Machakos and later returned to the Machakos Reserve.

NORTHERN FRONTIER

November 24. A large swarm entered Masai lands and flew down to the north-west.

COAST PROVINCE

Garsia. November 17. A small swarm approaching maturity came from the west and flew down the Tana (E.I.) south-east.

Was. Reports on November 23 and 24 state a small swarm from the direction of Machakos and later returned to the Machakos Reserve.

SUMMARY

Two big swarms have entered North Kavirondo from Uganda. Large areas are likely to be laid waste.

In the Rift Valley Province swarms are still active at Emetete.

The easterly movement of locusts continues in the Meru and K. Colony. Swarms being reported from Meru, Mt. Kenya, Thika and Garsia. Laying has occurred on the Machakos Reserve boundary near El Deyro Sabab. Great damage to native maize has been caused in Meru by a swarm from the north which passed on the 29th.

OTHER TERRITORIES

Uganda. A locust swarm of November 29 has been received from the Director Agriculture, Entebbe, reading as follows:—

"Numerous flies present in the swarms, and the swarms are in Northern Buganda. Large swarms locate moving on the border of Buganda."

BRILLIANT WORK BY R. A. F.

Cruiser Hit At Heligoland U-BOAT SUNK
A daring raid on the naval base at Heligoland, in which a direct hit with a heavy bomb was scored on a German cruiser, and in which other vessels may have been damaged, was one of two brilliant exploits by the Royal Air Force during the weekend.

The second was the sinking of a German submarine by a patrol plane. Here again a direct hit was secured, the bomb exploding at the base of the conning tower, and hurling parts of the submarine high into the air.

The Royal Air Force took part in two brilliant exploits yesterday—the bombing of a German cruiser and the sinking of a German submarine. The German wireless has admitted that the raid had been successful. In a later statement the German Navy Agency declares that owing to heavy anti-aircraft fire the submarine was only able to drop a few bombs which caused very slight material damage.

The submarine was seen to be on the credit of a plane which was patrolling over the North Sea and saw a German submarine about 100 miles from land. The plane first saw the submarine through its binoculars about eight miles away. It was apparently of the large sea-going type. 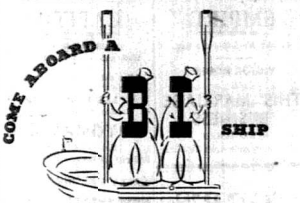

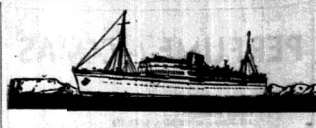

WAR EXPENDITURE

The Government of Kenya is budgeting for a deficit next year of £53,400.

Despite the new taxation the estimate of the 1940 revenue is £265,000 less than the estimate for 1939. This is principally an expected heavy fall in the Customs revenue which is principally an Government to budget for a decrease from that source of £265,000.

Kenya's expenditure is put at £2,652,576. The military costs have not been definitely fixed and the Budget includes the 1939 figure plus an arbitrary addition of 25 per cent.

Expenditure has also been inflated by the cost of the many new civil activities arising out of the war, such as cost of keeping camps, conscription, Information Committee, etc., all of which are new.

The Draft Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure for 1940 were laid on the table of the Kenya Legislative Council yesterday. It is expected in a memorandum on the subject that they have been passed on the principle that as far as possible no new services should be provided other than those existing in 1939. These are essential for the most possible cost.

Some of the military or naval expenditure have been included in the Budget. The increase of £200,000 is at present being discussed by the East African Government. The British Government is accordingly, pending a final agreement with the Government, has included the figure of the 1939 expenditure and has increased it by £200,000.

The effect of the new taxation is not so great as was expected by the fact that a new vote has been added "War Expenditure (Civil)" the amount of the Estimate under this heading is £1,680,000.

The Watch On The Skies
HOW OBSERVER CORPS WORKS

(By David Symon)
Since August 24 all posts of British observers have been continuously manned. Their watch is at night and day to gain first warning of the approach of any plane from the air; their men are trained to locate, identify and track every aeroplane, friendly or foreign, crossing their country. One observer has seen six weeks of August, therefore, volunteer observers throughout their lives to suit this call to heres and there is now a spending of full-time men, the majority give part-time service outside business hours.

By dawn, therefore is for the early morning shift—from 6 a.m. until breakfast time—3.00 p.m. or 9 a.m. (23.00 to 1.00) as we are learning to call it, and wakes at 12.00. One observer usually, heats the soup or coffee left by thoughtful hands—the cat as an interested but puzzled audience—and then continues his work and the striped smelter (our only uniform), slings out as done through the sleeping stables, post the all-ways open door and arranged lights of the fire station, across a corner of the dormitory. One realizes that the night is not so dark after all as it seems, though the visibility and the bathing blackness of the woods.

Our post, overlooking the curving valley of the River Derwent, has a clear view for 10 miles to the east and five to the south. Beyond the ridge of the north-eastern skyline is a good "B.A.F." horizon, from which at intervals the near of engines being kept warm in case of attack.

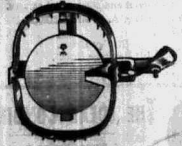

HIS MAJESTY IN THE FRONT LINE

The King is at present visiting British troops in France and yesterday His Majesty was in the front line.

The visit came as a complete surprise to the soldiers who did not know of it until they heard the announcement by the B.B.C. London, Dec. 5. His Majesty the King is on a visit to the British troops in France, shortly after midnight on Monday he reached the Headquarters of the British Expeditionary Force, having accompanied staff cars, flying a military standard, in wet and breezy weather. The visit was a complete surprise to the soldiers who heard of it for the first time through the B.B.C. news bulletin. Actually, the King and two women were the only civilian persons present when the King was accompanied by the G.O.C. Viscount Gort and the head of staff, General Gough, at British Headquarters. The news spread quickly and caused much excitement among the troops. The King had crossed the Channel in a glider, in very rough weather, escorted by destroyers and aircraft.

Angry at Calling of the League

Word-wide Indignation

The world-wide wave of anger at Russia's rejection of Finland has been increased by the Soviet's invasion of Finland's peace move and Russia's refusal to attend the League Council to discuss Finland's appeal.

The British liner "The Esmeralda" was sailed on a Liverpool port yesterday after its arrival from the West Indies.

U.S.A. Attitude. The United States has already made clear her attitude by the moratorium on the export of aircraft to the Soviet in the first instance. In Washington it is not expected to recall the London declaration, especially as the wishes to keep on the Embassy in Moscow as a peace of information. It is also held that the withdrawal of the Ambassador might make more difficult the United States' contribution towards the neutral power.

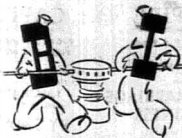

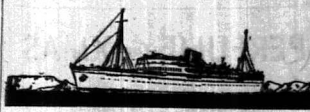

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

MATRIMONIAL BILL PASSED
Advantages Outweigh Disadvantages

As was anticipated, the Matrimonial Bill was the subject of spirited debate both in Select Committee and when the Council met yesterday. The report was made by Mr. Grogan, Chairman of the Matrimonial Causes (Amendment) Bill has passed its third reading.

The Council the Hon. S. Gherrie defended his action in submitting a minority report of one and declared that he could not support a measure which failed to protect the Kenya-born wife from the hardship that might arise from the fact of her husband's domicile in a Dominion. The majority of Members supported the Bill on the ground that its advantages outweigh the disadvantages.

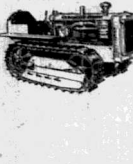

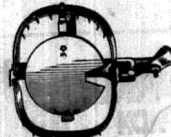

CHEERED WHEREVER HE WENT

His Majesty the King had a great reception from British troops and French civilians alike when he visited the Western front on Tuesday. Everywhere he was greeted with cheers.

The King carried out a heavy programme during which he inspected troops and fortifications near the front line.

December 6.
The King spent the whole of Monday with his troops on the Western Front. He was accompanied on his tour by G.O.C., Viscount Gort, the Duke of Gloucester and also by the British and French officers. According to all reports at the front, the King has left a vivid impression on British soldiers and French civilians alike.

He spent most of the morning with the Royal Air Force and met a number of pilots still wearing their flying kit. He talked with some of the most famous British and French pilots. The King was then seen to go to the front line and on the way stopped to talk and walk through the ranks of the hundreds of soldiers drawn up in this along a country road. Afterwards he went to inspect gun emplacements in muddy gardens and finally ended up in a sector of the front by a famous regiment of Canadian troops. They were wearing their familiar gaiters and they made a stiff attention as if they were in a parade at the Victoria and Albert Hall. At this point, the King, who was wearing a brown frock coat and spoke with many a smile.

It was reported that he was greeted by his wife, the Queen, and the King's children. Afterwards he went to inspect gun emplacements in muddy gardens and finally ended up in a sector of the front by a famous regiment of Canadian troops. They were wearing their familiar gaiters and they made a stiff attention as if they were in a parade at the Victoria and Albert Hall. At this point, the King, who was wearing a brown frock coat and spoke with many a smile.

GERMAN RAIDS FAIL

On the Western front, the number of raids which according to last night's French communiqué, all failed. It is not stated whether the raids took place, but German patrols have recently been very active around Vimmeurg near the Rhine. The persistence of these raids, in spite of failure, suggests that the Germans are desperately anxious to obtain information and to capture prisoners.

The official German news agency speaks of French artillery fire near the Luxembourg frontier. Several French patrols were in action and were repulsed by Allied armor.

A later report says that the Germans have carried out fewer than six raids in the past 24 hours in an attempt to take prisoners. Not only have the attempts failed completely but they themselves have lost several men.—(Reuter)

Inexcusable Aggression

A WARNING

Germany's miscalculation of the consequences of its aggression in the war is the subject of comment in the Manchester Guardian, which reviews the official Finnish statement after the signing of the Statute of Westminster in 1931, under which in all but common language it was recognized that the separate peoples, it was supposed, were to be united. "It needed only a situation in which one of the peoples of the Empire, the King was given, conflicting advice in different directions to fall to its knees. This situation, it was seen as British, with her European entanglements, became involved in a war in which she either had to fight or to retreat. In Canada would embark on nothing but fear of her neighbor that Australia, with her eye on the Pacific, would make no effort that lessened her capacity to fight her own problems. South Africa, with its racial difficulties of race and colour, would withhold her aid.

At least, that is the line that Halifax said that, by an agreement which he thought would give him a free hand to attack Poland, Herr Hitler had bartered what was not his property to barter, namely, the liberties of the Baltic people.

The Foreign Secretary warned the British people against being turned aside from their war aims because of recent developments. "The present German Government is directly responsible for Russia's invasion of Finland was the thesis developed by the British Foreign Secretary, Lord Halifax, in the House of Lords.

Today, the 22nd anniversary of Finland's declaration of independence which she was driven out of the Bolsheviks' hands for seven years, Lord Halifax said that the British people should be reminded that Finland's independence was helped by Germany and 3,000 German soldiers gave their lives in the cause of Finnish freedom. Today the Germans are on the other side, having agreed to Russia's invasion as the price of Russian friendship. Today's celebrations in Finland are necessarily less extensive than usual and the President, M. Kaali, who spoke of Russia's denunciation of the non-aggression pact with Finland, said that the safety of Leningrad did not come into the question as Finland had been attacked all along her Eastern frontier.

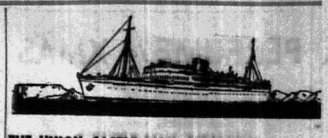

SHIPPING SPACE SIDELIGHTS ON THE WAR ...

Tanganyika And A Fair Share

There will be no shipping conference at Christmas. Six weeks before the outbreak of the war the British warlike restrictions and will be allowed open until a date to be fixed. Britain has arranged to buy 200,000 tons of scrap iron from the U.S. This represents about 10 per cent of the total of U.S. scrap iron exports in 1932.

TRAVELLERS TO EUROPE

Visas Required

The following visa requirements should be studied by those intending to travel to France, Italy or Portugal.

In future all foreigners, without exception, travelling in France must be in possession of a national passport and a French Consular visa. In the case of British subjects of European descent resident in Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika and colonial dependencies for visas, which will be issued without charge, should be made either at the French Consulate at Nairobi, or to the Consul Agents at Mombasa, Dar es Salaam and Zanzibar.

All other persons requiring visas in Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika and Zanzibar must present themselves in person at the French Consulate, Nairobi. In such cases visas can only be issued after reference to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in France.

Holder of British passports travelling to Italy either for residential purposes or in transit, are required to obtain an Italian Consular visa. The fee charged for such visa is two Italian lire.

Portuguese Consular visas are required on the passports of foreigners of every nationality travelling to Portugal.
