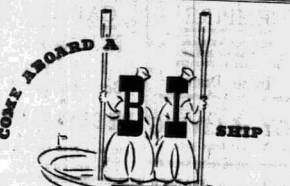

Civil Service Leave

Early in the present session of the Kenya Legislative Council it was officially stated, in reply to questions, that the problem of leave for the Civil Service was under consideration. We presume that as the Colony's Budget is being discussed, and provision has to be made for passages, the Government will be prepared at an early date to tell the country what it proposes to do. It is nearly a month since the official answer was given and nobody can deny that a month is enough time even for a Colonial Government to consider and decide.

Some people seem to think the East African Standard is pressing the Government to send its officers on leave without consideration of the fact that there is a war. That is not the position. It is the whole Civil Service as a war-time contribution voluntarily resolved to give up the leave privileges so that the passage money could be saved

for other purposes which are properly grateful. But that is not the question. What we are anxious to avoid is the situation that arose at the end of the last war when large numbers of officers had twelve and eighteen months accumulated leave due to them which they were compelled to take, with the consequence that the Service was dislocated and the whole Colony suffered from the results. The Service today is much bigger, and what is more important is the fact that Kenya is not a war theatre. Therefore we have argued that instead of accumulating leave obligations and spending public money bringing back wages who went to the Government to pay them, the Government should decide to allow the leave system to operate as near to normal as possible and that even "lay-offs" men should eventually be allowed to go on holiday since, if they were removed, from their posts and sent to England or any other reason, the Colony's work would go on just as usual and the argument of indelicateness has little application.

Uganda has made up its mind. The Government issued a statement on Monday afternoon in which we published on the 7th inst. announcing that leave will be 'reinstated' subject to the exigencies of the situation and shipping accommodation. The Government of Uganda is also encouraging officers who do not want to go to the United Kingdom to take their holidays elsewhere and is even offering advice on suitable holiday resorts if the officer is given his leave he must take it. It did not spend at least three months away from Uganda, exclusive of travelling time, will be allowed full passage grants, so even if the amount does not exceed what he would have been entitled to get on a voyage to Britain and back. When he returns from his leave, the officer will be obliged to work four and will be credited with any unspent proportion of his leave. 

tragedy of the suffering that must fall on members of a barbarous nation.

From Bismarck he passed to that famous figure now known as "The Old Man of Doorn". He was a grandson of Queen Victoria, and in the opinion of the lecturer, was a shortcoming and back-sliding, but he never wanted or intended to be a War Lord.

It is a curious fact that many people remembered the name of the man in his white uniform riding his great white horse, he never thought of fighting, just to love and die the War Lord of Europe, and his advisers were not more dramatic actors, Germany had a life, what they awaited a try to his will.

If Germany Had Won

There was no need to question the Treaty of Versailles, but it was intrusive to consider the terms Germany was prepared to offer Britain had she been victorious. A German army of occupation was to be established in Kent, part of Sussex, Portsmouth, Colchester, Aldershot, and the like. Germany was to take over the British Colonies and Dominions in Africa, the Gibraltar, Malta, Bombay and Calcutta for a start.

The British Army before 1914 had been long neglected for many years. Lord Roberts' appeal had been neglected, and the outbreak of those who had reason to see what was happening and had knowledge of what was bound to take place if his policy was pursued met with no response. The real work of an army should be to prevent war, just as the real work of a doctor should be to prevent disease. It was due to the ferocious behaviour of countries and patients that wars and diseases can effect so much devastation of mankind.

Colonel Marriott told that he worked with the Russians and did not consider that we had anything to fear from them. BRITISH AIRCRAFT SUPERIOR TO GERMAN MACHINES
Impressive Review By Air Minister

Practice has proved the superiority of British over German aircraft and in a review of the work of the Royal Air Force the Secretary of State for Air gave instances to demonstrate that the Allies are daily getting nearer to the establishment of ascendancy in the air.

In the course of a statement in the House of Commons yesterday the Air Minister, Sir Kingsley Wood, said that our fighter squadrons had taken such a heavy toll of their superiority that the enemy's aircraft, both bombers and fighters, might justifiably be assumed. Our Hurricanes and Spitfires had been in contact with Dorniers, Messerschmitts and Heinkels. There was no doubt that our machines possessed a decisive margin of advantage. Even more encouraging was the superiority which had shown itself over the German fighters. They had not only twice the altitude of Messerschmitts but were superior both in control and manoeuvrability at all speeds.

Cosial Patrol
Speaking in praise of the coastal patrol, the Minister said that 40 flights had been made on which more than 19,000 miles of air had been flown. The results of these flights were being analysed, but it was stated that the patrol was doing its work very well.

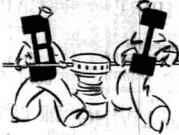

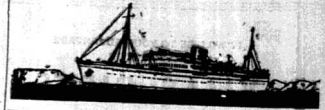

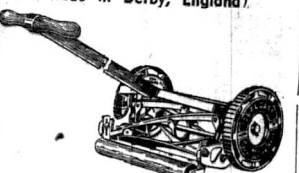

Britain Ready to Negotiate

BUT NOT ON HITLER'S TERMS SAYS LORD HALIFAX

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Lord Halifax, speaking in the House of Lords in a Foreign Affairs debate, said: "I entirely decline to see this country put into the dock in international affairs and held in any way to blame comparably with Germany for the tragedy into which the world has moved."

The Foreign Secretary continued: "We have always been ready to negotiate. We were prepared before the war and we have never closed the door to negotiations in any way."

"We realize the difficulty of making peace after a long and bitter struggle but do not think that difficulties would be any greater than those which would attend any effort to make a post-war peace. Such a peace would be capable of misrepresentation in Germany as the end of a war not altogether unsuccessful and not too easily and therefore not too discouraging to the German mind in the future."

Lord Halifax said he was quite certain Hitler was "anxious" to make peace on his own terms. He was not so sure that Hitler was anxious for peace on terms which would make for the peace of Europe.

Continuing, Lord Halifax said: "It is now clear that we have a stand to take before we can get any deal. It would be wrong for us to stop before we had done our utmost to secure these things."

"Nothing improves me more at the Foreign Office from day to day than that nearly every foreign representative whom I have the opportunity of meeting tells me that he is profoundly impressed by the outstanding military and political achievements in all quarters in this country."

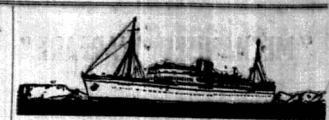

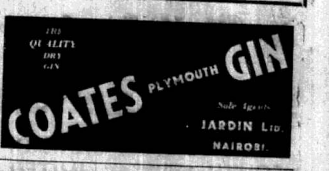

Fight After A Party

MURDER CHARGE REDUCED

A fatal fracas between two Kikuyu after a beer-drinking party was described before Mr. Justice Thacker and three assessors at the Law Courts in Nairobi on Thursday and Wednesday when Kamau /Njiru was found guilty of the murder of Karanja G. Njathu. The charge was reduced to manslaughter.

Mr. Slaney appeared for the Crown and Mr. Ross represented the defence. According to the prosecution, the crime was committed on the Mombasa Estate, Nairobi, on September 25, it being alleged that accused struck Karanja on the head with a stick, causing injuries from which he died next day. Karanja was employed at Nairobi Aerodrome.

It was stated that the accused had a blow on the side of the head, but he was not seriously injured. Evidence was then given by a number of witnesses who saw several women meet at the home of Kamau /Njiru on the night of September 25 and began drinking from a bottle of rum. One witness said that the whole lot of them were drinking and that they were drunk.

There was an incident between Karanja and Kamau at which they were kept apart from fighting in the hut. Karanja was then taken to the hospital and died next day. The accused was found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to 18 months imprisonment.

Road And Weather Report

From information received from the Meteorological Department and other sources, the R.E.A.A. reports that very dry conditions have prevailed throughout Kenya and Uganda this week. Good crops are reported from Central and South-East Tanganyika.

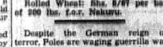

A Policy for War

AGRICULTURE

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—I offer you my congratulations on your leading article of December 5, "A Policy for War," a Memorandum on Agriculture in accordance with the usual policy of your paper you call for action as opposed to mere platitudes.

I regret I cannot write in so complimentary vein on the article headed "Between the Hammer and the Anvil," which appeared in the Agricultural Section of your issue of December 12, since therein you set out a certain attitude I refer to paragraphs in notices which were issued recently. I am sure that you would not have been so complimentary to the Government's policy. You discuss the various aspects of the problem, but you do not go beyond the financial aspects of the Kenya Government and give, and which the Imperial Government cannot give to Kenya lands, and declare to give to other Colonies and Dependencies.

I am not, I think, far out if I assume that the writer of the above had in mind some other Memorandum to the Production Board framed by a Sub-Committee of the Subukia Farmers' Association to which you were good enough to give prominence in your issue of November 22. As one of the members of the sub-Committee, I take up my pen to reiterate the importance of your main points, etc.

(1) That in the absence of definite decisions from the British Government, the Kenya Government must itself make up its mind to take the Colony definitely, and if once, whether it requires the maintenance of the acreage under arable or an increase, and, in the latter event, the percentage of its increase.

(2) That the Kenya Government should at once accept the risk—very small as I hope presently to show of financial loss in the event of the 1940 cereal crop proving

complete or even a comparative failure. I certainly personally believe that it would be reasonable to recover, in addition to the cereal, but I am not sure that the farmer a reasonable profit.

It is rather typical of Kenya that at the present moment when the pig industry has rare opportunity to develop an export trade the prospect should be maintained by a rapid increase in the number of pigs owned by natives in the Kiikuyu reserve. It is estimated that in the districts around Nairobi there are at least 4,000 pigs owned by natives and there is good reason to believe that a high percentage of these pigs are indigenous and are being bred by their owners.

In fact, of a batch of 18 native owned pigs, recently killed under proper supervision, were heavily infested with measles. So far the incidence of pig measles on European owned farms has been negligible but it needs little imagination to visualize the possibility of a rapid spread of the disease throughout the colony unless drastic measures are at once taken. If that tragedy occurred the pig industry would suffer a reverse from which it would take years to recover and any scheme for development would, of a necessity, be greatly hampered.

If not impracticable for several years to determine that both the Department of Veterinary Services and the Department of Agriculture advised against the raising of pigs, the encouragement given to the Kiikuyu to become pig breeders. PLANT PROTECTION THE IMPORT OF PLANTS, FRUITS AND SEEDS

The Department of Agriculture's Requirements

THE importation of plants, fruits, seeds, etc., into Kenya from any foreign country is regulated by Orders made under the Plant Protection Act, 1930.
