#### 2 NEW BATTLESHIPS

Defense expenditure of \$450,000,000—the highest ever proposed in peace time—is the main feature of the Budget introduced by the President Roosevelt to Congress.

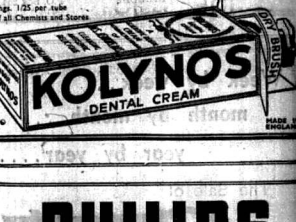

Whether the original supplier in Nairobi was making no beyond selling to us more than we should otherwise buy, I do not know, for presumably it takes the same amount of material to produce the same quantity of "hot" flour as cooled flour. It is, of course, a matter of considerable gain to have a heavy mthas, but in the circumstances, especially as these circumstances vary from day to day, I do not think it is worth making. I should be glad to see your issue of 25th Dec. and I think possibly those of us who are concerned with the use of mthas are suffering in some way.

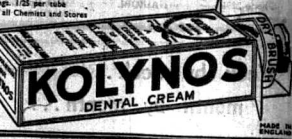

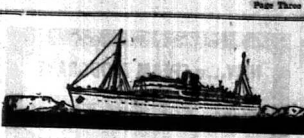

## A Policy for War:

### FARM PRODUCTION COSTS

Sir—Farmers who are pit called up for service are without any doubt only too anxious to do all in their power to help in the vital fight for freedom and justice, but however willing they are to make a special effort to increase the production of essential foods and raw materials they are faced with a most serious financial position due to low produce prices and a rising price level for all necessities required by them in working the land. The gross factor we have in fact is that although the cost of production has gone up from 10 per cent to 20 per cent, it is likely to go higher yet, we cannot use any compensating balance in produce prices.

I am fully alive to the fact that our production should be an all time gain to try to relieve the position and Mr. A. H. Smith speaking in London at a Joint East African Board meeting recently drew attention to the fact that prices for Kenya maize and other raw products at present offering do not pay the cost of production and advocated an enquiry and measures being adopted to safeguard the producers.

I submit that as up to date it has been found impossible to right this wrong in a world market which during the time has come with the advent of a New Year to investigate other local channels to help the producer through 1946.

The way and means to lower the cost of production for 1946, may, however be found in a British System plus lowering of Railway rates and from the Coast ports. I enumerate the following eight methods which, I think, give a wide field for consideration:

- (1) Rebates to both the farmer and petrol used for business purposes.
- (2) Rebates on paraffin and crude oils for farm tractor work.
- (3) Rebates on lubricating oils for farm tractor work.
- (4) Rebates on purchase price of farm implements and tractor.
- (5) Rebates on purchase price of farm implements and tractor.
- (6) Lowering of Railway rates on all farm produce sent to the Coast and inter-transit rates for farm produce.
- (7) Lowering of Railway rates on all

necessities imported for farm use such as fertilizers, bags, implements, and machinery, and to be proved on all Government taxation, car licences, land levies, etc.

I quite believe that these kind of measures would appear a serious and the farmer must produce the country's revenue. The method of lowering his costs would compensate the Government by an increase in trade through increased production on a more balanced basis. No doubt many more suggestions may be forthcoming in the near future, but this subject brooks no delay as seasons wait for no man.

There is the subject of the Parliament—Have putting its full weight, for increased production means increasing the demand for labour. We in Kenya have a vast field of potential labour which should now be organized under war conditions. I suggest a Central Labour Bureau to close touch with the tribal chiefs through the District Commissioners of Native Reserves a standard rate of wages and food for the various classes of farm work for all monthly contracts.

Capital to finance production growing in new techniques from rural banks, and special facilities provided for the farmers. Both these valuable products require an extra call on above at certain periods of the year.

(4) Why doesn't the Board of Economic Development encourage the production of motor oil for lubricating purposes? It is true that the best kind of motor oil plant for oil production does not grow in Kenya, but we could still produce it available. The use of motor oil, which is a very good lubricant for many types of machinery, would free petroleum lubricants for more important war elsewhere.

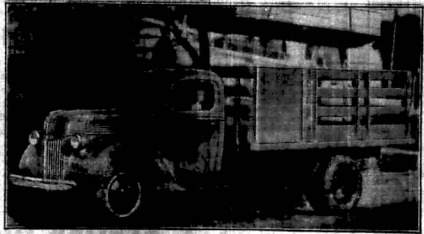

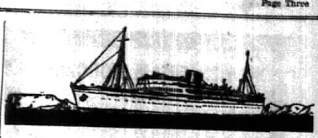

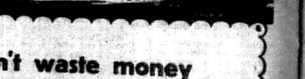
