Widespread Air Activity over North Sea

BOMBERS vs. FIGHTERS: GERMAN BASE BOMBED: BRITISH COAST RAIDED

There has been very considerable aerial activity over the North Sea during the past few days. On Wednesday, British bombers were attacked by Germany's new 'destroyer planes' and three of the Messerschmidts were shot down. One R.A.F. machine was lost.

Yesterday morning, German raiders paid Britain widespread visits and crossed the coast at various points. They were escorted by anti-aircraft fire and fighter patrols and bombs were dropped.

British planes, patrolling over the sea, were in action last night. The German base was bombed and the British coast raided.

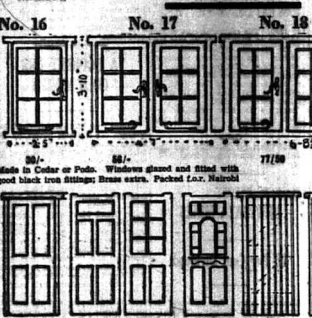

PUBLICITY APPEAL GONE? Effect of Income Tax. [STANDARD] CORRESPONDENT. When the Daily Star Chamberlain, met the subject of the appeal on the agenda the Chairman (Mr. Leslie) stated that the Management Committee had sent a letter to the Chief Secretary pointing out the difficulties caused by the extremely short notice given before the introduction of the Income Tax Bill and the effect that it would have on commercial interests and development. The Chief Secretary had replied that as the matter was considered by Legislative Council (it was in the Bill for two days after the date of the Chief Secretary's reply) it would not be possible for him to deal with the points raised by the Chamberlain. Mr. R. V. Stone, who is a member of the Legislative Council as well as the Chamberlain, stated that the points mentioned by the Chamberlain were put on record in the statements made from the official side. 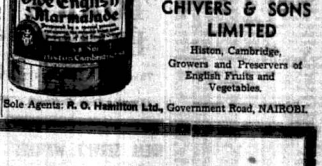

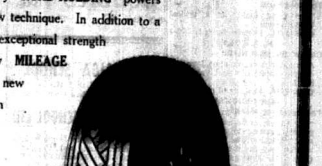

LOCUST OUTBREAK FOR 1934

Less Menacing until The Long Rains

After a general survey of locust movements in the territories during 1933, Mr. A. P. O. Michelmore, the Entomologist, draws the conclusion, as a tentative forecast for 1934, that the early months of this year situation will be less menacing than it was a year ago. During the long rains, however, there is danger of a more severe invasion than occurred in 1933.

The following note on the locust prospects for Kenya at the beginning of 1934 is by Mr. A. P. O. Michelmore, entomologist:— The locust infestation generally of the Migratory Locust, which is coming year after year on the present coast, is serious, the danger of invasion from the north and west, (Sudan), East Africa and Uganda, and the decrease of swarms to the south (Tanganyika). The present position is one which may be compared with that of a year ago.

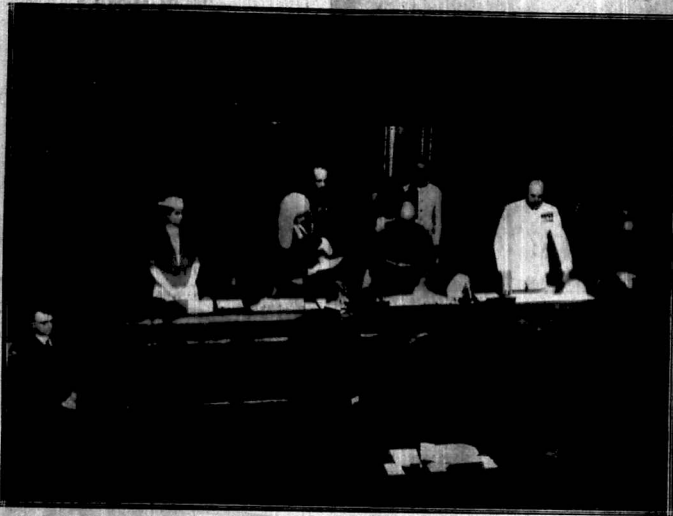

"BOTH ON LAND AND IN THE AIR, WHAT IS HAPPENING NOW IS MERELY A PRELIMINARY TO THE MAIN STRUGGLE," DECLARED MR. CHAMBERLAIN IN A SPEECH ON TUESDAY IN WHICH HE REVIEWED THE WAR EFFORT OF THE ALLIES.

The Premier referred to the prodigious mobilisation of man-power in Britain and, alluding to what some people thought were the unnecessary air raids previously mentioned, pointed out that danger from this quarter for diminishing, might well have begun as yet.

He spoke in glowing terms of the bravery of the Finns, and said in Britain's collaboration with France not only a military alliance but the basis for rebuilding Europe after the war.

"The German people must realize," he concluded, "that the responsibility for the prolongation of this war and the suffering in it lies as well as that of the tyrant who stands over them."

The Prime Minister, during his first speech to the Mansion House on Tuesday, gave a summary of a series of ministerial discussions with Mr. Chamberlain on the war.

Mr. Chamberlain began his speech with a pledge that all his efforts would be directed to the purpose of winning the war, however long it might be. "The New Year had just gone by and the time for action is at hand," he said. "The Premier, before this, has given a general statement on the Western Front, both on land and in the air which is happening now is merely a preliminary to the main struggle."

"At the battle we had been pressing in instead. A survey of the last four months was not unimpressive. Britain had lost less than 20 per cent of her merchant shipping. We have sent 10 million tons of British shipping within the high seas every day. On the other hand, the pressure on the enemy was probably increasing in proportion to our."

FREIGHT RATES INCREASE DISCUSSED

[STANDARD'S COMMENTARY] Dar es Salaam.

The report of a sub-committee of the Dar es Salaam Chamber of Commerce appointed to consider local freight rates was discussed at the recent meeting of the Chamber. Eventually the report was referred back to the sub-committee for amplification and an amendment should be referred to a committee independent of shippers and shipping interests was defeated.

REPERCUSSIONS OF THE WAR

Prospect Of New Exports

[FROM A CORRESPONDENT.]

London. Conference between motor manufacturers, the Ministry of Supply and the Board of Trade have resulted in a plan, to increase the export of British motor cars and commercial vehicles all over the world, and especially to secure a share in the new limited export-market of Germany, which last year traded 1,500 vehicles out of the Reich.

Already since war began Britain has sent overseas at least 1,000 motor cars a week. Under the new scheme a detailed arrangement for supplies of basic materials has been worked out, and planned for at least 12 months ahead, and manufacturing have already started to draw up future production schedules.

In British Colonial territories, notably East and West Africa, Rhodesia, the West Indies, Ceylon, Malaya, Hongkong, Malia, Cyprus and British Guiana, the demand for light motor cars and commercial vehicles is recognized as a special feature in which the export activity of the British motor industry is engaged.

Now that Malaya and Ceylon have placed embargoes or restrictions on vehicles from other sources, British manufacturers are especially gratified that they can be recognized by the maintenance of supplies from the home country. But even where such formal embargoes are absent, the industry inclines to pursue its steady advance against international competition through private channels.

Our overseas customers are now assured supplies both of cars and commercial vehicles, the arrangement being on the basis that export orders shall be fully met. The export interests of the motor industry are therefore safeguarded in the most possible under present conditions," said Mr. William E. Hooton, president of the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders, speaking for a British industry whose direct annual contribution from the sources to the nation's economic life is valued at £350,000,000.

The country's resources are so vast in raw materials and manufacturing ability that the large-scale export trade development in no way jeopardizes the production requirements for road and air transport and other essential equipment.

Onside of all British vehicles produced were regularly exported, but this proportion will be increased to 50 per cent of the world market value of British motor vehicles was £230,000,000. Since 1937, the annual export figure of 100,000 vehicles has been reached. The total elimination of German sea-borne export trade is capable of increasing the proportion of British motor manufacturers, because competition was largely in the light or class in which British pre-eminence is acknowledged throughout the world.

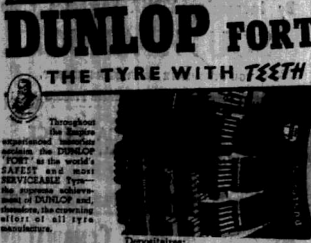
