SCOTLAND YARD OFFICIALS WORKING ON EXPLOSION Sabotage Suspected?

London, January 19. Scotland Yard officials have been working continuously on the investigation into yesterday's explosion at the Royal Gunpowder Factory at Waltham Abbey. Sabotage is suspected.

Five men were killed and a number of others injured, but mostly slightly. As far as a mile and a half from the factory doors were crunched off their hinges by the effect of the blast.

Many people in the vicinity rushed into the street thinking that bombs had been dropped.

A later message states, however, that a Home Office statement on the explosion is that on the information at present available there is no reason to suspect sabotage. An official committee has been set up to investigate the matter. (Reuter).

Willis will not come down. Britain has not yet reached the stage of clothing her people in Ersatz cloth. The great fear is that this is merely a step to rationing of clothes so that in a very short time we may all have ration cards. He did not say how few suits for the duration, which would mean that wives would enjoy darning wool and tobacco harvests even more than they do today. Some will follow. The full horror of war will only be known when silk stockings are rationed, when the women-folk have to make a ladder stretch a long way, and when we are down to selling the canary and beating a silk-worm.

The Man and His Clothes. We have all been advised by those who know, including the man who wears it, from the sister of the cousin of the aunt of whose brother is at the War Office, that heavy coats are all when Spring comes. Our flesh is being made to creep in advance, all through the long days of winter (at least those who have winter) and instead of being satisfied to go in light, knowing that at the moment air itself is less heated than the average Briton is constantly advised never to forget that if Winter comes Spring is never far behind. But it is impossible that the full horror of war will await the Spring. It is announced that owing to the shortage of wool and the difficulties of shipping "Pool Suits" are likely to be introduced both for men and women.

But it does mean that those natty Spring suitings of which our countrymen are so fond for a time be replaced by something else. Germany has done it already, and in Finland to keep the milk from freezing the enterprising Finns have been making coats for the cows out of sack.

Of course in the case of Germany the propagandist who says the stout German is having to wear a set of standardized straight-jackets is that there is not enough material to go round. But in Britain the accepted reason for it to be found in the higher flights of war-time economics because (shortage of wool and the best use of shipping space) it helps to win the war if we dress the neutral world in our best Harris Tweeds and worsteds, put the proceeds into battle dresses and live ourselves in a pool suit, but something to do with inflation, no doubt, or the theory of the downward spiral.

But that is as may be, there is some assurance that these suits (which are to be sold as ready-made) need not be as fastidiously fastidious. They will not look like a road-mender's coat plus a pair of dungarees. They may be at least as smart as the Soudan Dress which has caused so much flutter in Der es Salaam's more select circles. There will be no lack of variety in patterned materials, but the standard will be of standard quality in the wool and silk content and tailoring.

Fight With Propaganda Described A Contrast In Technique

CAPT. DOVE'S EXPERIENCE AS PRISONER. An account of his experiences as a prisoner on the Graf Spee was given from the D.B.A. by Captain Dove of the African Staff. Most of the details have already been published, particularly at the time following the arrival of the Graf Spee in Montevideo. All the German captives from the British sloop were taken to the Graf Spee. Captain Dove said that his ship was captured in territorial waters and that he was a prisoner there for 28 days. TRAPPED UNDER WRECKAGE

Men's Ordeal After Train Smash

Two men were trapped for 11 hours under wreckage of another train standing at the Station, near Manchester. A.P.S. men, using axes, saws, and crowbars, worked in the light of searchlights to free them, while ambulance workers brought relays of hot-water bottles to keep them warm. Edward Melville, of Anthony Street, Ardwick, Manchester, said: "The whole of the carriage caved in on me in the front train, and I was pulled from the wreckage by an iron bar. The carriage had been set on the platform."

EXTRA RATIONS FOR MEN ON LEAVE

Soldiers, sailors, and airmen on leave in Britain are to have more ration allowances than civilians will receive.

Every civilian is entitled each week to: 12 ounces of sugar; 4 ounces of bacon and ham (24 ounces of codfish); 4 ounces of butter. According to the Ministry of Food it was estimated that men on leave are to get an extra allowance of: 21 ounces of sugar; 4 ounces of bacon and ham; 7 ounces of butter.

The Ministry of Food also announced that men on leave will receive 12 ounces of meat a week instead of 10 ounces, as was stated. The weekly rations for women, whose provisions are supplied by shipowners, will be: Six ounces of bacon and ham, 12 ounces of butter and 24 ounces sugar.

More than 40 people were hurt when a crowded lift crashed 60ft. from street level to a subway of Hamilton-square Station, Liverpool. Among them were mothers with babies in arms, hospital-ship surgeons and hospital police.

When the lift reached the bottom of the shaft 10 ft. passengers were in a jammed pile on the floor. The second severe fall by another lift happened yesterday in the street, where a fleet of ambulances gathered to take them to hospital. One woman had both hands fractured. Three others escaped with sprained ankles.

Mrs. Dorothy Zuck, 23, who was accompanied by her two children, a 14-month-old baby and a girl of two, said: "At the lift began to fall I do not know how it happened. I clutched my baby, who was wearing a hat, and my daughter. Some of the men seemed to us to be down, but the lift was so crowded that it was impossible."

Mr. James Hall, a shipyard workman, said: "One woman who was carrying two babies fell backward as the lift crashed, holding the children up so they did not get hurt. She was injured, but the children were not harmed."

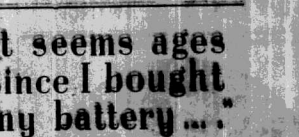

rather a hundred times be dead than live in a world under the heel of the German boot. And nothing less than the threat of that domination, aided now by the enormous weight of Russia, is the issue which is being fought. Five nations, however, have provided for Europe much more than for thankfulness and hope. German sea power such as it was is rapidly being consumed. The seas are open to Allied shipping adequately guarded by the might of the British and French navies, and it is only the weak, divided and defenceless neutrals who fall easy victims to a German Government suffering from a sense of frustration. The attempt to break Britain's command of the sea will fail but the price is being paid by those very countries for whose ultimate right to live in peace the Allies have again unshaken the sword.

The immediate future is obscure. There are signs even that the "war of nerves," aided by threats and promises of troop concentrations on the borders of neutral countries, is reaching the end of a phase. Action may follow on Friday days. The inevitable Nazis may delay for weeks. But assuredly it is not their plan to sit quietly behind a fortified line in the west and succumb to the process of attrition. Even now the sands of time are running out and if the neutrals of Europe, in any hope of avoiding conflict their days, refuse to present a united front for the warring nations based on determination to use their common power for the maintenance of peace, the German hope is that they will remain fearful and divided, an easy prey in any plan that circumstances may bring.

Today they are playing the Nazi game and conspiring in their own detraction.

German Attacks On Neutral Shipping

January 21.

During the past week two Italian, two Belgian, one Greek and one Danish, all under German mines, the Dutch liner, Arentkerk, and a Norwegian steamer: sunk by German submarines.

In the case of the Norwegian steamer, the German submarine attacked the ship first between 19 and 20 shells and then between 21 and 22 shells. The submarine's commander made no attempt to inquire as to the identity of the crew, who were left in open boats in the water.

THE Choice of the Neutrals

The First Lord of the Admiralty, in his striking and effective phrasing, which makes his speech the best propaganda for the cause of Democracy that has been heard in Great Britain, put before the small States of Europe this week-end the clear choice that lies before them. He said what has been in the minds of many people since war broke out: in brief that if the neutral countries, menaced by Germany and Russia today, handed themselves together in a solid bloc to protect their own interests, by joint action and influence to demand and ensure respect for the rights they possess under international law, they would be less likely to remain in the formidable plight which is their portion now.

In the Balkans Italy is working patiently to secure a basis of agreement and common understanding but her influence is circumscribed by her unrevoked allegiance to the Berlin-Rome Axis. While that alliance remains, and all the speeches made by responsible Italian statesmen give no indication of what is in their minds, the way of successful diplomacy are made increasingly difficult. Turkey, too, is trying to bring about a common front and on all sides in the Balkans there are indications that the advice of the larger powers to their smaller neighbours is against exploitation of the common danger for the purpose of extracting territorial adjustments at the present critical moments.

rather a hundred times be dead than live in a world under the heel of the German boot. And nothing less than the threat of that domination, aided now by the enormous weight of Russia, is the issue which is being fought. Five nations, however, have provided for Europe much more than for thankfulness and hope. German sea power such as it was is rapidly being consumed. The seas are open to Allied shipping adequately guarded by the might of the British and French navies, and it is only the weak, divided and defenceless neutrals who fall easy victims to a German Government suffering from a sense of frustration. The attempt to break Britain's command of the sea will fail but the price is being paid by those very countries for whose ultimate right to live in peace the Allies have again unshaken the sword.

The immediate future is obscure. There are signs even that the "war of nerves," aided by threats and promises of troop concentrations on the borders of neutral countries, is reaching the end of a phase. Action may follow on Friday days. The inevitable Nazis may delay for weeks. But assuredly it is not their plan to sit quietly behind a fortified line in the west and succumb to the process of attrition. Even now the sands of time are running out and if the neutrals of Europe, in any hope of avoiding conflict their days, refuse to present a united front for the warring nations based on determination to use their common power for the maintenance of peace, the German hope is that they will remain fearful and divided, an easy prey in any plan that circumstances may bring.

Today they are playing the Nazi game and conspiring in their own detraction.

The Kenya Farmers' Association from European-grown maize had put three years' 62,614 bags of maize at an average of 21,318 shillings per annum.

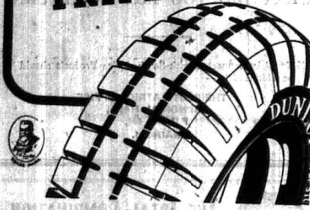

The Maize Problem. The discussion which took place at the public meeting held on Saturday last provides still more evidence of the basic economic difficulties of this country and its white settlement. These problems have merely been aggravated by the war; they are not caused by it. In the case of maize they have been aggravated also by drought and the consequent famine conditions in the Native Reserves. All factors have been given urgency and emphasis by the increasing costs of production brought about by the war, reflected in part in the policy of the British Government to permit the British exporter to sell his goods overseas at controlled rising prices while controlling the price at which Colonial products are bought. The problem remains today as it was when we first discussed the war-cost problem policy of Kenya five months ago, that of discovering a method by which the producer of primary products, and the consumer of primary products, can obtain an adequate margin of profit on his production. No official solution of that question has yet been forthcoming and until it is found there is little prospect of success in planning increased agricultural output whether as a contribution to the Empire's war effort or for new markets. But the fixation of the price of maize at a higher price indicates that the principle at least has been acknowledged. The action of the Supply Board of

Kenya and Uganda provides evidence that, so far as the maize-grower is concerned, the Government of the two countries have publicly announced their acceptance of the fact that the maize farmer is entitled by the adjustment of State policy to a price based on the fact that he must have a profit on his undertaking. Having made that acknowledgment in respect of maize, the Government will find it difficult to deny its application to other crops. But having taken the step of increasing the price of maize, the Government of Kenya is now faced with the problem of fitting action into the present unilateral policy of the Colony. To do so the Railway and the public (the latter through the Colonial Treasurer) are now to be asked to make the increase price possible by a reduction in the form of reduced rail rates.

Clearly the maize industry has a good case. No body of producers can continue to operate below production costs and no section of the community, whatever their own difficulties, can expect to pay maize or any other commodity at a price which is not to be increased by putting the burden on the public, the limit of such a policy is not far to seek. It cannot, however, be assumed that because the Supply Board has fixed an arbitrary figure the problem of the Maize industry is solved. On the contrary the makeshifts and resulting distortions will increasingly compel a comprehensive examination of the whole policy of the State in relation to its basic industry of agricultural production.

The Chairman of the Kenya Farmers' Association made the point that maize from European sources was an essential factor in the economic life of the Colony. Maize growing is essential to the life of the Colony than any other crop and it is necessary to improve its economic conditions. POINTS FROM TANGANYIKA COMMISSIONER'S EVIDENCE

RUSSIANS LAUNCH ANOTHER BIG OFFENSIVE

But All Assaults So Far Repulsed

The Russians are believed to have launched another big offensive against Finland, but the reports so far indicate that all assaults have been repulsed with heavy loss of both men and material.

Recent improvement in Russian air tactics has aroused comment and Swedish reports suggest that Nazi aircraft have come to the aid of the Soviets.

Once again the Russian troops have used loudspeakers in exhorting the Finns to surrender and threatening that Germans are coming to help the Soviet.

Last night's Finnish communication reports further detail the Russian offensive over Lake Ladoga. It was killed and a number of tanks were separated along the front. The Finns are now making the north-west of Lake Ladoga. Two of them, the Russians lost about 400 men and five tanks, while in the other three attacks, all were killed. The bodies included five tanks and two armoured cars on the south side of the Lake about 120 ground from the Finnish line. The Finns are now holding the bodies of several hundred men and several armoured cars.

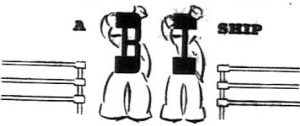

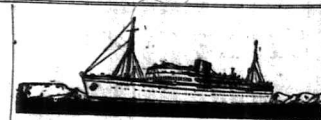

Union Will See War Through To The End

SMUTS' STIRRING REPLY TO HERTZOG

Increasing Resolution of People To Stand By The Empire

"We shall see the matter through to the end. To ask us to leave our Allies in the middle of the struggle would be the most fatal mistake. If South Africa turned back now no Afrikaner could ever hold up his head again."

With these words General Smuts, the Union Prime Minister, answered a remarkable speech by the former Premier, General Hertzog, in which the latter had urged the ending of war against Germany.

It had been suggested, indeed General Smuts, that Parliament's decision to come in with the rest of the Empire would be followed by widespread trouble in the Union. That had not occurred and every day saw increasing resolution on the part of the people to stand by the Empire.

Cape Town, Jan. 24. The South African Parliament held yesterday debate on a motion by General Hertzog, former Prime Minister, in favour of ending the war against Germany. General Smuts, South African Premier, made a stirring and immediate reply and moved an amendment to the effect that Parliament should be followed by widespread trouble in the Union. That had not occurred and every day saw increasing resolution on the part of the people to stand by the Empire.

General Hertzog argued that South Africa was at war with Germany because of the declaration of war against Germany.

2nd Newfoundland Contingent Arrives

London, January 24. One hundred members of the 2nd Newfoundland contingent from Newfoundland arrived at the Victoria Embankment today. They form the second contingent of newly volunteers from the island of Newfoundland. The men who came from all parts of Newfoundland, are fine and many of them have been trained in the hard school of the Newfoundland fighting fleet. They were described by the commanding officer as the best group of young men he had ever seen. They proceeded to several camps in Britain for training.

ANOTHER BRITISH FLOTILLA-LEADER SUNK

Fearing That There Are No Survivors

Another British destroyer flotilla-leader and two more Norwegian steamers have been sunk off the British coast either by mine or torpedo.

The Admiralty announced late last night that the destroyer H.M.S. *Blanche* has been sunk by a mine or torpedo and it is feared that there are no survivors. The *Blanche* was carrying a crew of 175 and was a destroyer-leader of 1,475 tons. She was en route from Portsmouth in 1939 and had a complement of 300. Her armament included five 4.7 guns, seven of smaller calibre, and eight 21-inch torpedo tubes. She cost over £200,000.

German Raiders Chased Off

London, January 24. Three German planes, believed to be Heinkel bombers, were chased off the coast tonight over the Shetland Islands and on an air warning was given when landed for fuel on hour.

Fighter squadrons were sent up in pursuit. One German plane dived into a harbour but did not attack. (Reuter)

Delay To Shipping Unavoidable

Jan. 24. It was denied in London yesterday that there had been any discrimination between American and Italian ships to the Gibraltar Channel. The United States Government has protested that American ships have been delayed longer than Italian vessels.

It was pointed out in London that many Italian ships carry bulk cargo, and as such are more difficult to examine more quickly than the freight carrying American vessels.

British ship owners, moreover, are in a hurry to get advance information about cargo where the United States owners have sent in advance guarantees regarding the destination of the cargo and agree to hold up the goods at the port of destination should the Italian-Contracted Control raise any later question.

Although everything is being done to get ships away as quickly as possible, much of the delay is unavoidable except by use of the new system. (Reuter)

Violation Of Concordat

Jan. 24. Last night the Vatican spokesman dealt with further attacks on the concordat between Italy and Germany. The spokesman said that all religious teaching in professional training schools had been abolished and that this measure was a flagrant violation of the concordat with the Vatican. (Reuter)

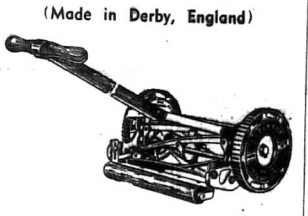

THE TEA MARKET (CORRESPONDENT) London. The tea market is gradually getting into order. It was reduced to a state by the Government's order a few days following the outbreak of war.
