K. F. A. Market Report

The Kenya Farmers' Association (Co-Operative) Ltd. market report for the week ending January 24 is as follows:

London Market

Maize: The export of maize from the Colony has been prohibited by Government but it is hoped there may be an exportable surplus later. The price indicated has somewhat improved and we are hopeful of obtaining a figure in the range of Shs. 22/- per quarter (H.F. 100 lbs. Mon.-Sat. and when we are able to export).

Wheat: The Imperial Government is effecting the purchase of wheat at the following approximate prices (40s. overseas port):

- Australian, 26/- per quarter
- Canada, 24/- per quarter
- Barley: There is a fair demand for feed barley at Shs. 26/6d. per quarter C and P.

Beans: We are quoted Maclean's Butters at £20 per ton, small white Haricots at £22 and Kidney Beans at £23. These are all for good sample hand-picked beans.

Peas: Hand-picked Marrowtots are valued at £27 per ton, with the Peas at £24 per ton. The demand for Peas and Beans on the London market still remains strong and purchases are being made by Government.

Sunflower Seed: This market is at present "retrograde" and we are quoted as follows:—

- White ————— £12 to £16
- Striped ————— £14 to £18
- Black ————— £10 to £12

The market still remains strong and for good quality prices between £20 and £250 per ton can be obtained.

Pyrethrum: The pyrethrum market is not very active at present, but the recent drop in price would appear to have recovered somewhat and the Kenya farmers today at £130 to £145 per ton. The following has been mentioned in respect of the Brazilian Pyrethrum crop:—

The average crop of flowers in Brazil during recent years has been about 200 metric tons. 50 figures are available as to average as exports are made by dealers who usually purchase in small quantities from local growers. It is estimated that the next crop, which should be available in November, will amount to about the same quantity of approximately 200 tons. Some effort has been made to increase production, but little progress has yet been made. Shipments are usually made in fairly loose bales of about 40 lbs. each.

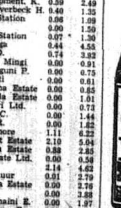

The Maize Problem

TUESDAY, JANUARY 23, 1940

The discussion which took place at the public meeting held at Thika on the 21st inst. provides little more evidence of the nature of the basic economic and social conditions of this country and its white settlement. Reduced Railway Rate Suggested

A railway inflexible flat freight rate of Shs. 3/- per ton on maize and maize meal, an announcement of which has been made, there will be no further increase in the control price of maize before September, and that the K.F.A. price may be available on or before September 1st at a price not exceeding Shs. 9/- per bag, under the conditions that the Government put forward by a public meeting at Thika on Saturday.

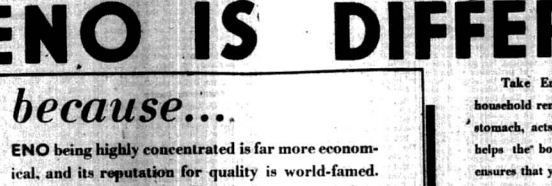

NOT DEROGATORY TO JAPANESE PRESTIGE Ambassador's View Of Liner Incident

Britain's act in stopping a Japanese liner and removing Germans was not derogatory to Japanese prestige, explained Sir Robert Craige, British Ambassador in Tokyo, to the Japanese Press. Any difficulty arising from the incident could be settled between the two Governments calmly and without anger. The official reply will be sent to Tokyo some time today.

London, January 28.—The British reply to Japan's protest against the removal of Germans from the Japanese liner will be sent to Tokyo within the next few days.

Meanwhile, the British Ambassador has made a statement to the Japanese Press clearing up some misunderstandings about the incident. He said that Great Britain wished to do nothing to injure Japanese prestige. The Japanese Navy had apparently been misled. The only question was whether the British had the right to remove all Germans of military age, or only German soldiers in the armed forces.

U. S.—Jap. Trade Pact Expires

No Signs Of New Arrangement Yet

January 28.—The treaty of commerce between the United States and Japan which was in force for 29 years has expired. At the moment there are no signs of a new treaty or other agreement to take its place. It is believed that the United States has published a long statement in Washington which the Secretary of Commerce has published. It is a statement which sets out the United States' position on the Japanese trade pact and also on the Japanese dependence on the United States for raw materials. The statement recalls that in trade with the United States, Japan has been treated as a free and equal partner. It also states that the United States supplies Japan with raw materials for her industrial needs for heavy industry and for the production of petroleum. It is stated that the United States has been ready to increase Japanese dependence on the United States as a market and as a supplier.

Important New Cotton Order

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT]
The Minister of Supply made the Central of the Cotton Industry No. 2 Order 1942. The order controlled price of any yarn on a sale by an option is maintained by selling the appropriate margin to a sum representing the cost of the raw cotton used. The system adjusted the general lines of existing voluntary yarn price arrangements.

It did not control raw cotton prices, but with certain exceptions, it regulated the prices of single cotton yarn of American, Egyptian and by prescribing specific margins for each type and quality. In general, the margin had been approximately lower than those at present prevailing.
About five hundred spinning mills with more than a thousand weaving sheds and a quarter of a million operatives mainly in Lancashire and Yorkshire will be affected by the new order.

The address was a huge and enthusiastic one, frequently bursting into cheers as the famous British statesman made his point in characteristic style. A few persistent interrupters, however, had to be ejected from the hall.

"This is no time for ease and comfort," he declared; "this is a time to dare and to endure".

In the course of his speech in the Chamber, Mr. Winston Churchill, addressing an immense audience in Manchester City Hall said:

"During my forty years of public life I have addressed many meetings in this hall, but never one like this. We have been for five months at war with the most powerful military power and the world's greatest sea power. This was the longest September since 1914, and it was expected that very soon our cities would be charred by explosion and by fire, and our people would be driven and chased to plan for the end of January, 1918, a great catastrophe such as I see before me this afternoon."

"I know of nothing more remarkable in the long history of this country than the willingness to encounter the unknown and to face and endure whatever might be coming, which was shown in September of this year. It was the day when the people of this island in the discharge of their duty were called upon to enter into a war which was never to end. There never was a war which was so long, so hard, so desperate, so one into every home and there never was a war which was so long and entered with the same united confidence that, God helping, they could do it."

No Partial War

"This was no war planned and entered upon by a Government for a class or a party ideal. The Government laboured for peace to the very end and during those last days the only fear in Britain was lest we might be down by their awful superiority in military facilities, and to the very end we stood forward in one great body into a struggle against great and opposing armies, and against our own, faithlessness, and cruelty from within."

"I cannot tell what the course of the struggle will be. We cannot tell what the end will be. We do not know how long it will last or what it will cost. Harold Crumpton, aged 37, of Borden-road, Spalding, Birmingham, said at the inquest on his wife that six months ago she asked him to go out with another woman.

After a visit to the other woman he returned home and found his wife had been there—she was drunk and passed out.

Crumpton said he met her wife while he was driving from his first wife's home to the other woman's home. He was told she was there by the woman's husband.

"About a year ago I met a single girl who I knew I was married," he said. "I was drunk and went out with her."

Dr. W. H. Davison, the coroner at Birmingham, said they were living together for four years and had got a divorce with two children, a son and another woman with two.

"It is not usual in this court to take evidence like this," Dr. Davison said. "It is the only police complaint in which that man has been found guilty of adultery."

Crumpton admitted that he had found his wife with another man. He tried to conceal the note.

Dr. Davison said the note began: "I am writing Evelyn 'not' but it is for your husband."

Evelyn, David's other woman, said that Mrs. Crumpton wrote to her a few days before her death. The letter began: "I am writing you to give my husband up."

"The jury found that the witness, Miss Wilford Crumpton, murdered her daughter in cold blood and committed suicide while in a strained condition of mind."

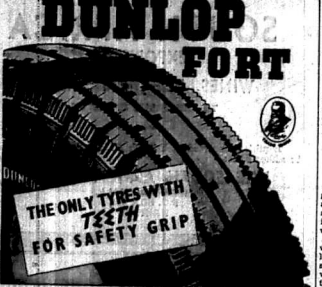

ANTI RIDER PEST CAMPAIGN

Hopeful Results Of Cooperative Effort

The following outlines of the progress of the anti-rinderpest campaign gives some idea of the work that has been done and also of other sort of war—that against the ever-present menace of animal disease.

Latest surveys indicate that considerable success has attended the efforts to check rinderpest, and it is expected that a further conference to reorganize the position will be held in Rhodesia.

"It has been found," says the old man, "that both small as well as the carcases and the hides which were used, that were left to rot, have been found to have the virus in them. We have now to leave our villages."

This is how the situation of the Matsiaba district of Northern Rhodesia looks at the moment.

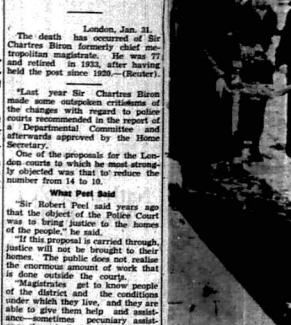

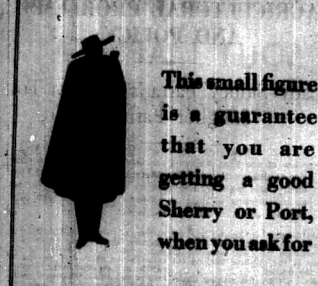

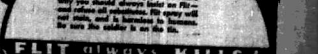

Big Scale Air Raids On British Coast

NAZI BOIMB ATTACKS ON SHIPS NEAR NORTH SEA

The most ambitious air raid on the British coast attacked by the Germans since the war took place on Monday. The area of operations extended from Scotland to the south east of England.

The raids were repeated on a similar scale yesterday.

A number of ships were bombed from the air and there were some casualties.

More neutral vessels have been torpedoed in the North Sea.

RUSSIANS BOMB HOSPITALS

Russian bombers claim to have shot down 11 civilian victims in widespread air raids over Leningrad in southern Finland yesterday.

An official statement says that about 50 people were killed and 200 wounded in an air raid on Hango yesterday.

In addition, Russian planes attacked two hospitals, killing about 20 nurses and patients.

There were many casualties too, as the result of two air raids—one on Abo, the worst this town has so far had, and another on a hospital near the front line on the Keretlin Isthmus.

ALLIES AND RUMANIAN OIL

Recent developments in the Rumanian oil problem have given rise to interest reports about diplomatic discussions between the Allies and Rumania.

The object of these talks is that the Allies had threatened to break off relations with Rumania if she refused to supply oil.

The Rumanian Government has announced that she is ready to supply oil to the Allies.

AMERICAN RELIEF

A Swedish newspaper has announced that the United States Relief Committee is providing food, clothing and other supplies to the people of Finland.

The committee has announced that it has sent 100 tons of supplies to Finland.

The supplies include flour, sugar, and other necessities.

NAZI PLANES OVER HOLLAND

German planes were seen over North-Holland and Central Holland last evening. They were chased by Dutch air patrols and anti-aircraft guns opened fire on them.

The Dutch Government is making representations in Berlin about this further violation of Dutch neutrality.

APPEAL FOR ECONOMY

Although the bacon ration in Britain has just been doubled, transport difficulties due to the bad weather have caused Government to appeal for economy in certain other directions.

One appeal nearly asks people to eat more mutton and less beef, and a second calls for economy in the use of fuel.

The weather makes it difficult to maintain supplies of coal to consuming areas.

U.S.A. AND JAPAN

The American Ambassador in China has arrived at Hankow, a port about 60 miles from the Japanese frontier.

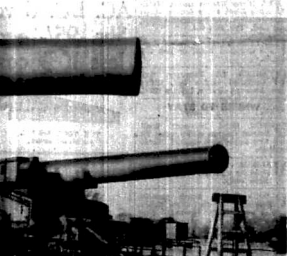
His journey to the Yangtze was uneventful, but he did not expect to make attempts on his life.

He is the representative of a foreign power to visit Hankow since the Japanese garrison said yesterday that Japan was willing to accept the privileges to American citizens in relation to the Yangtze.

N. ZEALAND HELPS EARTHQUAKE VICTIMS

New Zealand has donated 2,000 New Zealand pounds to the British National Fund for the relief of earthquake sufferers.

M. Daladier Warns French People

MUST NOT TAKE WAR TOO LIGHTLY

January 30. M. Daladier broadcast to his country last night and warned people on the home front against taking the war too lightly.

France, he said, was serene and safe, but Frenchmen must be ready to sacrifice everything they had for the common effort.

After five months of war it became more and more certain that the home front must not only be prepared for a long and hard struggle, but also aimed at the systematic destruction of the victor.

Germany desired, not only to dominate, but destroy nations. The workers and peasants of Germany were slaves of their Nazi masters.

Germany had already had the same fate as the peoples of Bohemia and Poland were the slaves of those slaves.

France would win because she was determined to win, but it was not enough to win the war by force on the physical fronts and talk about a young virile Germany (forced into a war she did not want).

Campaign Against Road Deaths

London, Jan. 30. A nationwide campaign to reduce the number of road deaths (about 10,000 a year) has been started by the Minister of Transport, Mr. Joan Wallace.

He revealed that the new speed limit of 20 miles per hour was fixed as a result of tests made with his own car.

The campaign will take the form of short propaganda films and talks, but will operate chiefly through the cooperation of the newspapers.

MORE AIRCRAFT FROM U.S.A.

January 30. The British Government has placed an order worth about \$43 million for more aircraft from the United States.

This announcement has been made by the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation which states that the order is for 200 bombers of a new type and also more fighters.

The machines are faster and larger than any built previously by Government from Lockheed Corporation.

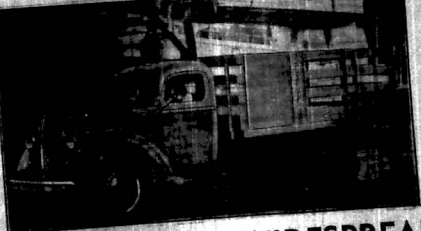

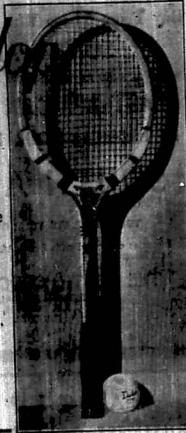
