 Pleased officials were left shaking their heads over such incidents as where to find enough material for a hurry, what material to use and where to find the funds.
 The show on the roads area the night has one of colorful shows. The area has had a major flourish this year with many stands completely redesigned, several extended — and many last night with a long way to go to be ready.

 The hippo, which was flown from President Luba's private plane, represents a precious animal in the East.
 The L. Madan stand was being faced yesterday, with the red carpeted roadway passing through various aspects of the country's life with the emphasis on agriculture. The display will be a show showing the country's natural resources such as gold, diamonds, rubber, tea, coffee, timber and iron. All the equipment was flown to Nairobi from London.
 Other foreign countries showing for the first time this year are Greece and Holland and the A.S.K. has already made bookings for next year for Ghana, Malaya and Brazil showing the increasing overseas interest in the show.
 Russia, which is the earlier show some interest in exhibiting has withdrawn this year, but the

A.S.K. greatest disappointment is the absence of Government representation from Uganda and Tanzania although the Tanzania National Tourist Board and a private firm, Messrs. H. T. P. Ltd., of Dar es Salaam, have come forward for the first time this year.

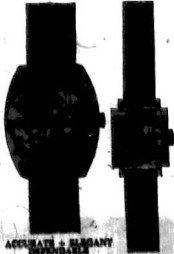

World Bank to boost fight against poverty

A vast new effort to help reduce poverty in developing nations is to be launched by the World Bank, it was announced yesterday by the bank's new president, the former U.S. Secretary of Defense, Mr. Robert McNamara.

In his first public pronouncement as president of the bank after his first 18 months in office, Mr. McNamara announced plans for the World Bank to spend about \$4,750,000,000 to develop nations in the next five years — an increase it has lost in all its previous 22 years of existence.

He also called for a new assault on the world's population problem and announced plans by the bank to finance birth control facilities.

In a major policy speech prepared for the meeting of the bank's governors in Washington Mr. McNamara said that the population explosion, more than anything else, is the major barrier to the economic development of the poor and widening the already deepening gap between them.

He stopped a hint that development aid would be cut because of the dangers of rapid population growth and tried to do something about it, despite the more pessimistic views in the quest for the world's scarce development funds.

It would be difficult for the bank's policy to inform developing countries of the extent to which rising population growth slowed their economic development, he said.

A high rate of population growth had a crippling effect on economic growth in any developing country and he emphasized the drug was quite independent of density of population.

His remarks warning on the need for birth control followed news reports that the U.S. had agreed to a new 10-year extension of the aid program to the effect of new birth control devices of wheat and rice.

Troops used with irrigation and increased use of fertilizers and pesticides also presented an opportunity for the bank to help in the development of birth control, Mr. McNamara said. "We are now on the brink of an agrarian revolution as significant as any in the history of the world," he said.

Looking back on his first six months as head of the World Bank, Mr. McNamara said he had not yet seen the U.S. Defense Department's aid to the bank's program, which he said was the "half way" to the whole life in which it has been itself most challenged by the program before.

He said he had encountered "deep, some of frustration and failure" in respect of foreign aid. "The truth is that the amount of aid they had given billions of dollars without achieving much in the way of development of the poor countries," he said.

He said that the world had been diverted to help them out of the aid of poverty which they had been asked to give for themselves.

But "aid does not work if it is not accompanied by a social revolution," Mr. McNamara added.

The situation arose for a number of reasons, he said. The richer countries, he said, were not giving aid because they were busy with their own problems.

Noting that about 1,600 rich countries and about 100 poor countries had a total annual income of \$17,000,000,000, he said that the poor countries were poorer than the rich countries.

Mr. McNamara said it was clear that the world had the opportunity to help the poor countries, but it was not doing so.

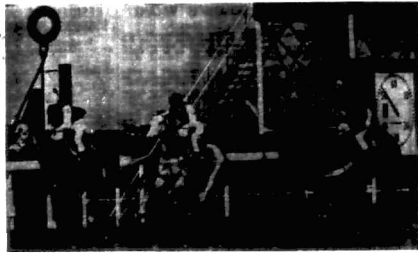

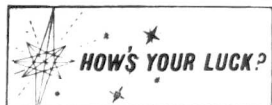

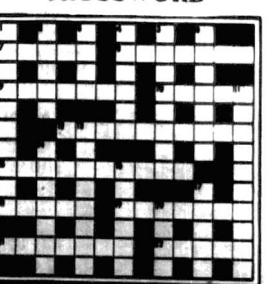

Farmers — and produce — get Show off to great start

Nairobi was in a festive mood yesterday with more than 3,500 people paying to see the first day of Nairobi Show and promising a record crowd for the official opening today by President Tubman of Liberia.

The number of paying visitors yesterday, coupled with the more than usual farming interest in the early events, made it one of the busiest first days in the history of the Show.

The first day usually labelled Trade Day, was this year re-named Farmers' Day because of the Agricultural Society of Kenya's decision to bring forward the Fairstock Show from December to coincide with the Nairobi Show.

Farmers expressed their approval of this move by bringing forward animals of top quality in the fairstock classes which, in turn, fetched good prices at the afternoon's auction — the champion animal fetching K250.

Part of the afternoon was conducted by Senator Henry, a former Canadian Minister for Agriculture and one of the Ministers of Cabinet.

The speaker who is said to have received the highest price ever paid for a bull under the banner who has the reputation of being able to sell milk as fast as it leaves the udder, also had a banner, that officials can put them in the auction ring, and a banner probably made a significant contribution to the price paid yesterday.

The truck broke down and the only alternative to the town could carry only eight of the animals, so Mr. Bouchala had the unpleasant choice of which to leave behind. The other eight made the journey safe.

Today President Tubman of Liberia will formally open the show, and President Tubman is scheduled to take the salute at the end of the fair's events in the arena.

In his memories of last year's show when a number of exhibitors of the Presidential security guards, the Agricultural Society of Kenya and other exhibitors expressed their appreciation for the fair's success.

As a result a recommendation has been made to members of the public — other than exhibitors — to bring their own animals to the show.

Mr. Tubman is expected to arrive in Nairobi at 10 a.m. and will spend the morning visiting the livestock areas and agricultural exhibits.

They will visit the trade area after the official opening at 111 and President Tubman is expected to take the salute at the end of the fair's events in the arena.

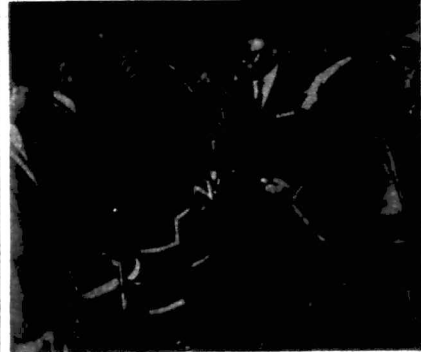

Mr. Humphrey's decision

Mr. Hubert Humphrey's declaration that he would be willing to stop the bombing of North Vietnam and take steps to "de-Americanize" the war, if elected President, has been examined in its context. It was made by a man well aware that so far he has been fighting a losing battle for the White House.

Public opinion polls give the Republican candidate, Mr. Richard Nixon, a clear lead. Mr. Humphrey is trailing in the campaign to such an extent that it has been seriously suggested that he might be ousted to an ignominious third place by the segregationist, George Wallace, who views America's internal problems as more acute than on her external ones. He is a naive, unaccomplished, and still astonishingly good and is no longer a rank outsider.

This is not to condemn Mr. Humphrey of insincerity, or to say he has changed his mind on Vietnam. He is rallying his flagging support among uncommitted voters. There has been sign previously that he has had misgivings on America's Vietnam policy.

Earlier the U.S. spokesman at the U.N., Mr. George Ball, resigned after refusing to back the Government on Vietnam, following the example of his predecessor, Mr. Arthur Goldberg. Both Mr. Ball and Mr. Humphrey's campaign staff and he may well have been swayed by them.

Hubert Humphrey's decision may have come too late to close the gap in the Democratic ranks. It will probably help much in catching up with Mr. Nixon, since the average American's distillation with the Government is as much, if not more, over its failure to deal adequately with racial tensions and to keep down living costs.

Relatively unknown a few months ago, he quickly became the standard-bearer of the liberal and mostly youthful wing of the Democratic Party opposed to the Government's Vietnam policy. Senator Robert Kennedy's sudden entry into the Presidential campaign overshadowed him for a time, but Mr. Kennedy's tragic killing Mr. McCarthy was

left as the only opponent of any stature for Mr. Humphrey. Though he was not strong enough to win the nomination from the Vice-President, his influence remains strong within the party.

So, as often happens in politics, we see the victor adopting the programme of the vanquished. (Many people consider President Johnson having won the 1964 election by denouncing Senator Barry Goldwater as a wild man, has gone further in "escalating" the Vietnam war than his opponent would have done.) Mr. Humphrey carried the day in Chicago by opposing Senator Goldwater's demands for an end to the bombing and a mutual withdrawal of U.S. and North Vietnamese troops from South Vietnam. Now he proposes these very things.

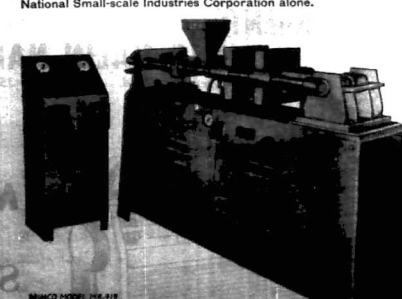

The atom bomb has clearly demonstrated to me that non-violence is the only force in the world. Before it, the atom bomb is of no effect.

In this article, the last in a series of three printed in the "East African Standard" during the past week, Abu Abraham gives an anthology of Gandhi's thoughts.

The two opposite forces are wholly different in kind, the one physical and material, the other spiritual and moral. The one is utterly superior to the other and, by a very nature, has an edge. The force of the spirit is more progressive and endures.

What is more, that force is not confined to the skin, muscle and bone, but it is capable of being awakened by religious training.

It is further to be observed that without the recognition of the value and the effort to realize it, there is no escape from self-destruction. The remedy lies in every individual training himself to express in every work of his the respect of response to his neighbors.

Peace will never come until the Great Powers consciously decide

to disarm themselves. It seems to me that recent events must force that belief on the Great Powers.

I have an implicit faith, a faith that today burns brighter than ever, after half a century's experience of unbroken practice of non-violence—that mankind may only be saved through non-violence.

Peace is unattainable by part performance of conditions, even as a chemical combination is impossible without complete fulfilment of the conditions of attainment thereof.

If the recognized leaders of mankind who have controlled over the engines of destruction were to renounce their use with full knowledge of its implications, permanent peace could be obtained.

Thousands, indeed tens of thousands, depend for their existence on a very active working of the force of truth or love. Little quarters of millions of famished in their daily lives are

for condemnation even of the fiercest distribution because of the likelihood of its leading to violence. No good profit, however, could be carried on without blood. It is only with the loss of power living if it is not attended with large-scale violence.

Passive resistance is a method of accomplishing by personal suffering. It is the reverse of resistance to force. When I refuse to do a thing that is repugnant to my conscience, I use force.

For instance, the Government of the day has passed a law which I do not like. I do not like to apply the penalty for its breach. I can only force it to observe its own law.

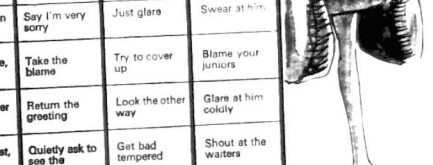

Mr. Humphrey promises halt to bombing of N. Vietnam, if elected

The U.S. Vice-President, Mr. Hubert H. Humphrey, who is the Democratic presidential candidate, said in South Lake City yesterday that if elected, he would be prepared to halt the bombing of North Vietnam.

Mr. Humphrey's statement marked the first time since his election that he had differed from President Johnson's policy.

What he would like to do, he said, is to be willing to begin good faith negotiations if we stop the present limited bombing of the north."

Mr. Humphrey said: "I would be willing to stop the bombing of the north because I believe that is the only way to get negotiations and a shorter war on for our troops."

To answer exactly the risk taken by the United States, Mr. Humphrey said he would take "no consideration at all" of "willingness to negotiate" with North Vietnam.

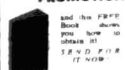

Student power

After a long and warring journey, East Africa's athletes have arrived in Mexico City to join the third Olympic contingent. Kenya's contingent is expected to be "shown" in New York which will be attributed to officiousness but, worse might have been colour discrimination.

Though planning began five years ago, Mexico has not managed to put the finishing touches to the arrangements for the Games. While the athletes seem reasonably satisfied, facilities for spectators are equally inadequate, and so are accommodation and transport for the anticipated influx of 15,000 visitors.

Despite everything said about isolating politics from sport, the Olympic movement has encountered political difficulties time after time. This year's event seems to be no different, then all beginning with the threatened mass boycott until South African participation was cancelled, followed by objections to the Russian presence after the invasion of Czechoslovakia and now the student riots in Mexico City itself.

Mexico can scarcely be considered ideal for athletic because, at 7,500ft., it is feared the altitude will affect health and performance. However, this is where Kenya's competitors will gain by comparison with those from 'Sea level countries'.

The latest reports of the student riots say a mass demonstration at the university was called off. The rebel 'Committee of Ten' explained it wanted to 'gain the situation before the Games' and instead of causing a riot, athletes, opted for a quiet dialogue with one might have thought the best way of reaching agreement in the decade in the first place.

At the same time, a 'wide-spread military operation' was threatened to coincide with the opening of the Games. As the communiqué from the 'Army of Liberation' is evident that the student leaders, or their manipulators, are determined to get all the publicity they can, rather than launch real guerrilla operations.

This statement is reminiscent of a report current months ago when some of the students tried to harass themselves in the university grounds. A 'sit-in' demonstration was planned which might have been a highly organised plot which will bring into action in the days to come.

No clear account has been given of the grievances which have motivated the students and bloodshed variously attributed to violation of student autonomy, police brutality, their bourgeois and Communist influences, Mexico's economic situation, the presence of certain having ties with Cuba and the United States, and other elements are emerging from the student's statements. If Communist imposed, the 'student power' there and manifested in other institutions, is certainly a 'hot' subject.

Some of the student fervour has undoubtedly been incited by Rudi Debraj, who is serving a prison sentence of 10 years in Bolivia for murder, robbery and treason, among his revolutionary activities. He is the author of the 'Revolution in Mexico', which is more than an angry young man's tirade against the present government, but a call for action to implement Marxist theories and has become a kind of bible for student rebellion in many parts of the world.

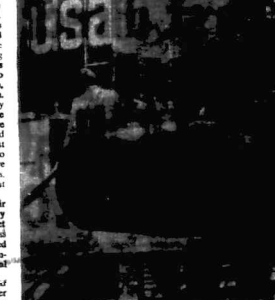

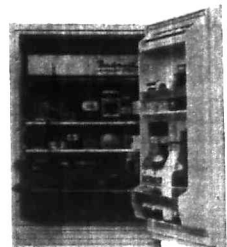

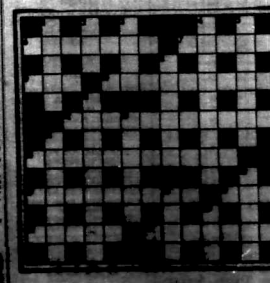
