TALKS BRIEFING

The Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Ian Smith, yesterday conferred with his full private cabinet, briefing them on Britain's new six-point proposals for ending the Rhodesian independence crisis.

Before the meeting began, Mr. Smith talked in private with the Rhodesian Front Chairman, Mr. Rufus Nkomo, who demanded that the proposals be presented to a neutral outsider on Friday night.

Mr. Nkomo said that he would address the nation on the radio to announce the British proposals and the breakdown of the Rhodesian Front.

Mr. Nkomo's broadcast promised that the proposals would be presented on Friday at a time when the Cabinet was meeting to discuss the proposals.

Mr. Smith has specifically said that the Government would not meet and comment on the proposals before announcing its own acceptance or rejection.

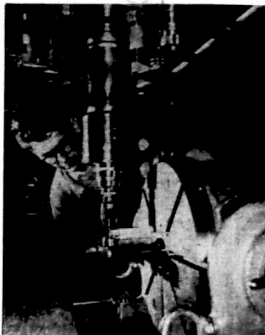

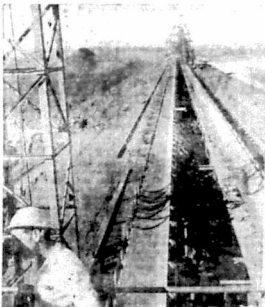

£480,000 DROP IN FARM EARNINGS

Overall agricultural earnings in Eastern Province fell last year by £480,000, local authorities in 1967 were £3,775,938 compared with earnings in 1966 of £4,255,938. This was disclosed in the 1967 annual report of the Eastern Assistant Director for Agriculture, Mr. J. Kilian.

Cotton production retained a set back from the poor distribution of rains and heavy infestation of stem and American bollworm. The report revealed that out of the 56,723 acres sown in 1967, 1967 season there was an effective acreage of only 27,700 and the potential yield of 15,000 bales was reduced to 2,300 bales worth only £480,000 as compared with 725 bales in 1966 worth £1,255,938.

Mr. Kilian added that coffee continued to be the main cash crop for the province with a value for 1967 of £2,051,141 in 1966 to £1,960,000.

S. Vietnam 'has no say' on bombing decision

The U.S. Vice-President, Mr. Humphrey, said at the week-end that the South Vietnamese Government had no power over the bombing of North Vietnam.

He held a nationwide audience on the programme, "Face The Nation" that the bombing of North Vietnam was a purely American undertaking and that any discussion regarding its continuation or termination was purely American.

Mr. Humphrey, the Democratic candidate for President, expressed the hope that Saigon would be cooperative on the matter.

While he felt that the bombing might be an acceptable risk, Mr. Humphrey stressed that the matter was in President Johnson's hands, until January 20 when he will step down.

"I will not substitute my opinion in that of the President," he added.

At the Vietnam peace talks in Paris a major issue is expected to be the cessation of bombing.

The South Vietnamese government, Mr. Nguyen Thanh Lu, said that he would like to see the bombing stop before it is too late to have any effect.

Mr. Humphrey considered the war as a stalemate between the U.S. and North Vietnam, but he said that the development of the war is believed to be in the hands of the North Vietnamese.
