Mounting storm in U.K. over Rhodesia terms

Open revolt by more than 70 members of the Labour Party threatened the British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, last night when Parliament debated on board the warship Fearless to end the Rhodesia crisis.

The Labour M.P.s, a section of Mr. Wilson's ruling party, tabled a motion opposing the terms of Mr. Smith, which were also being debated in Salisbury yesterday by the Rhodesian Cabinet.

A Labour M.P., Mr. David Kirk, said Smith's terms would mean a vote for Mr. Wilson to force a vote on Rhodesia in the Commons debate.

Labour Ministers were strongly opposed to the Rhodesia proposal and would vote against the Government.

He was British Ambassador to Kenya from 1961 to 1964 and was High Commissioner for Kenya from 1964 to 1967.

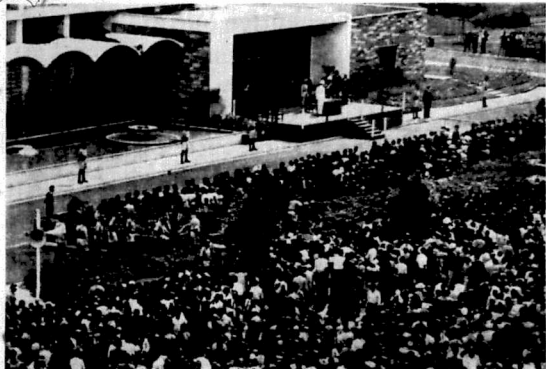
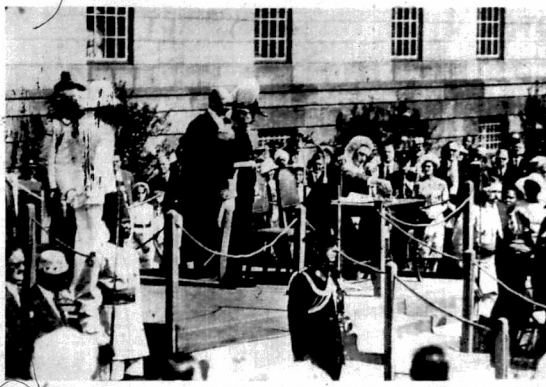

First troops begin leaving Czechoslovakia

Honolulu, Sept. 23 (AP) - The first troops of the Soviet Union are expected to begin a general withdrawal from Czechoslovakia in the next few days, according to a report from a source familiar with the situation.

The report said that the first units to leave were the 10th Guards Army, which had been stationed in the Prague area. The source said that the withdrawal was taking place in an orderly manner and that the troops were being replaced by Czechoslovak forces.

The source also said that the Czechoslovak government had received assurances from the Soviet Union that the withdrawal of its troops would not affect the status of the country as a satellite state.

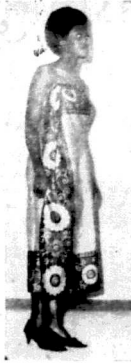

LONDON TALKS ON OIL STATE

In search of the future of rich little Brunei

What is happening about Brunei? There is no simple answer. A shroud of silence has enveloped the scene.

The young Sultan, Hassanul Bolkiah, his father, the ubiquitous Sir Omar Ali Saifuddin, who was Sultan till last October when he abdicated so that he could spend the remainder of his days in prayer and meditation and help a dozen aides in London for more than two weeks they have been conferring with a large number of British officials, mostly peace men in a British Government, and other officials of the Government. Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, Britain's Special Representative in Africa — whose favorite stamping ground was South and South-East Asia — has been visiting in London.

What are the talks about? The withdrawal of British forces from the region. The Government's "oil-rich states" plan. "I would never have expected" some more, finally.

So, word of bank and think what do you know about Brunei? It is a Sultanate having some 17,000 people. Its land area is 2,200 square miles in an area mostly fertile, surrounded by Sarawak and the South China Sea.

Under a series of agreements signed between various Governments of Britain and Brunei's present Sultan, Britain is responsible for its external affairs and defence.

Everything else, in theory at least, is left to the Bruneians. In effect, this means — or meant till last October — that all these powers are concentrated in the Sultan.

When Sir Omar Ali Saifuddin

abdicated and nominated his eldest son to take his place, there was some doubt about his valid signature of "reigning" by a heritage.

He has not, and Brunei today has, probably, not one ruler but two. The significant point is that the people of Brunei have never had a real say in this abdication, hence silent abdications.

For some time Britain has been urging constitutional reforms which would lead to greater participation by Bruneians in the affairs of the country.

It has been said that the former Sultan abdicated because this present was building up and he was not able to bend the knee himself.

What it comes to is that the talks in London must be on these two central points — defence and constitutional reforms. They are related. With the risks run in a war, the Sultan would lose a considerable income — almost entirely from royalties on the sale of crude oil from the Shell Company area which, in fact, it produced 4,000,000 tons.

The following year the oil price rose by 1,000,000 tons. Brunei is the fourth largest oil producer in the Commonwealth, and the new oilfields have the potential to go into full production. Shell makes something out of it.

Brunei has not been threatened by invasion by any other power in 100 years but almost certainly will be in the near future. The Sultan's abdication has been a real shock to a start.

During his years of abdications, the Sultan faced an internal situation which was described as an "official Indonesian-bid".

The war ended in 1963. The Indonesian-occupied Sarawak had left a great legacy. The Sultan's personal party, Rukun, had won 54 of 67 seats at the five general elections of August 1963.

Indonesian elections, however, were nothing to the advantage. Sultan Sir Omar Ali Saifuddin's party was basically voted afterwards. This being the part of electoral victory, Sultan Ahmad took it in December and almost won the day.

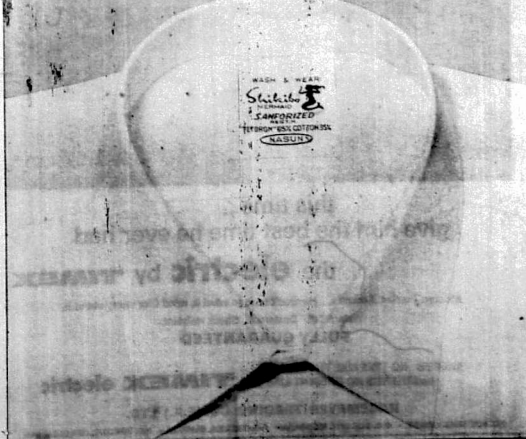

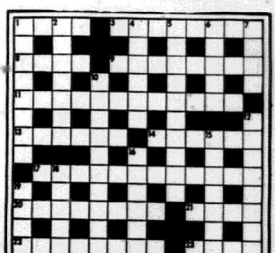

What has emerged with startling clarity from the free trade exchange in London is that NIBMAR is prepared to sacrifice Rhodesia. This being so, it is not surprising that when they really want to see Mr. Alex Douglas-Homer's words.

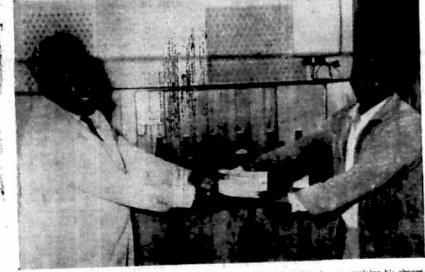

Plan to shut U.S. out of Vietnam summit

The United States is expected to be excluded from a summit conference of allied countries in Vietnam which will be held in the Hanoi area, the *Herald* has reported.

The newspaper obtained the text of a letter from the Australian, New Zealand, Philippines, South Korea, South Vietnam and Thailand.

The purpose of the proposal is to confine the summit to countries which are not at war, and to adopt a common stand about the Vietnam war for presentation in Washington.

The six allies would like to take an active part in final negotiations to bring the war to a halt. The *Herald* said that they would not accept a total halt to the U.S. bombing of North Vietnam until a final conference of all the warring parties had taken place.

Proposed Johnson is continuing his efforts on the Hanoi and Saigon fronts to bring about a halt to the bombing track and a ceasefire, in the hope that the

breakthrough is to be hoped for with some success as possible.

The fact that the Hanoi of the summit conference had been made which would have allowed Mr. Johnson to halt the aerial attacks is not stopping them from continuing secret conversations aimed at opening the way to serious peace negotiations through the back channel.

The Hanoi statement is not considered in Washington circles as a final decision regarding the United States plan.

Mr. Johnson's visit to Vietnam was reported 25 miles from Hanoi early yesterday. Vietnam bombing was also reported in the *Herald* as a provision which is required by the South U.S. Embassy.

U.S. intelligence officers said the satellite in the Saigon sector were units of the South Vietnamese Army which took part in the attack on February and the second strike against the North Vietnamese base camp. It is not yet clear how long they had been active or how they were killed.

American Marines in northern Quang Nam Province clashed with the units of the North Vietnamese, killing 22 there were no Marine deaths and four were injured.

South Vietnamese troops killed 17 North Vietnamese soldiers and destroyed 150 tonnes of the North Vietnamese supplies, including 100 tonnes of rice, 100 tonnes of sugar, 100 tonnes of oil, 100 tonnes of medicine, 100 tonnes of clothing, 100 tonnes of shoes, 100 tonnes of food, 100 tonnes of other supplies.

Two of the 25 shells aimed at the North Vietnamese base camp at the first raid failed. The others were further off target. There were no injuries of damage, the spokesman said. — *Agency*

Time to overcome injured feelings says Czechs' leader

The Czechoslovak Communist Party has held its 14th Congress in Prague, the party's first since a chemical factory at Pardubice.

The party held a clandestine 14th Congress during the Soviet occupation in August to study important economic and political changes, but the congress was later declared illegal.

The 14th congress will submit to the Czechoslovak people a programme of party activities, and define a more precise line for the party's future.

Mr. Dubcek justified the signing of the treaty on "temporary assistance" of Soviet troops in Czechoslovakia, stating that Czechoslovak rulers desire to apply honestly the Moscow agreements. Signing the

treaty constituted the necessary step to obtaining the withdrawal of the overwhelming majority of the troops.

The treaty also consolidated relations with countries of the socialist community, which included Czechoslovakia had common interests, based with the separate states.

The time had come to overcome mutual feelings, to face up to new realities and return to daily tasks and the Czechoslovak Communist Party would place greater stress on international politics.

"We must openly tell the population that we do not intend to find rest in the expectancy of superpower aggressions."

Mr. Dubcek pledged there would be no return to bureaucratic centralism in economic life, and said workers should be directly associated with decision-making.

Soviet Air Force units evacuated Bratislava Airport on Saturday. Radio Prague reported.

Also at Bratislava, three Soviet generals visited the Slovak Communist Party secretary, Mr. Jozef Husak, that they were leaving the country at the head of a large number of their troops, the Czech news agency reported.

The Soviet commander at the same time told Mr. Husak of arrangements which had been taken for the temporary quartering of two Soviet units which will be stationed in the area, it according.

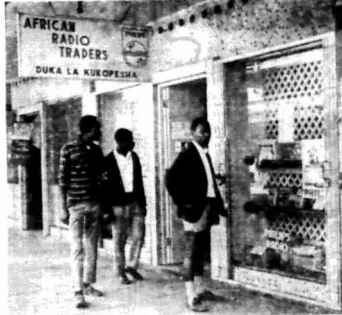

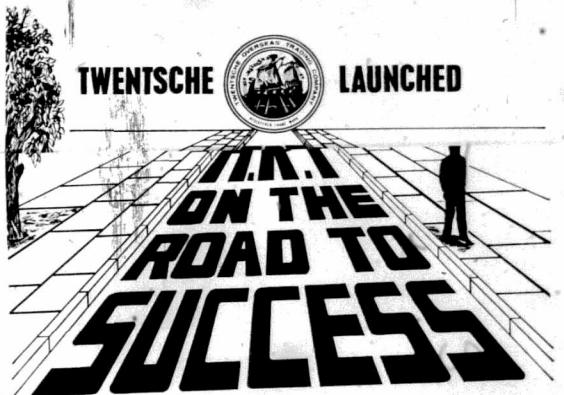

Punishment for crime

Two important declarations about punishment for crime have been made by the Attorney-General in Kenya's National Assembly. When Mr. Kariuki was replying to the debate on the estimates for his office, he said that the opportunity exists about curbing exchange control and capital flight for crime.

"Significantly, some people have adopted the attitude that it is 'fair game' to evade the country's regulations. They say that to beat the income tax authorities or circumvent any form of taxation and control measures on the annual."

Several reports have been published about smuggling gold and the seizure of shares with proceeds brought in from the coast. Recent legislation has tightened up the regulations, in the sense that the chances of "beat the game" are reduced.

"Avoidance" of legalised exchange has been reduced. The prosecutive funds have been strengthened in a secure conviction. Enforcement has been increased for individuals and companies found guilty.

The Attorney-General said the law made by Parliament Act will be effective in curbing severe sentences passed for currency offences. Mr. Nyamwaya said the courts will adopt a tougher attitude. Otherwise, he warned, the Government would be forced to introduce a Bill to provide for mandatory sentences for this class of crime.

Kenya does not possess vast resources of foreign currencies and cannot afford to lose them. It is suggested that the Government should be more strict in dealing with criminals. The things which are not allowed with guns, knives, poisons, and anti-social behaviour is also prohibited in any one country or breed, are not the victims of unemployment as much of their deliberate choice to live that is instead of working for a decent living.

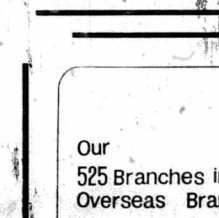

PAKISTAN'S DEVELOPMENT DECADE

INDUSTRY

Change that took in the whole economy

With a bold economic programme in 1947 and having inherited five industrial units, Pakistan was faced with the gigantic task of changing the structure of its almost wholly agricultural economy.

In 1955 the economic structure continued to be more or less the same as in 1947. Industries employed only 9 per cent of the G.N.P. against 40 per cent of agriculture. Over 90 per cent of the total exports were coming from the cotton and the wool textile industries. Over 10 per cent of the total population received an unprecedented industrial leadership of 4-10. The Ministry of Industries and Commerce, established in 1955, initiated the reforms from agriculture and industry for living standards of the people.

At the very outset, the crucial importance of the industrial sector was realised and a high priority attached to its growth. An comprehensive industrial policy was announced in 1959. It laid emphasis on accelerated industrial expansion largely by using indigenous resources, mobilisation of domestic investment, increasing employment opportunities, and the establishment of those industries which either earned foreign exchange or made important contributions to export earnings. A target substitution programme or provided strength to the other sectors of economy.

To achieve these objectives, a pragmatic approach was adopted. The industrial development of the private sector along with incentives was favoured to the maximum possible extent.

Governmental interventions were allowed to the private enterprise where it included the following: liberal depreciation allowances, tax concessions, etc.

Procedures for sanctioning in industry were simplified and financial institutions created to assist entrepreneurs with credit facilities. The technique of bringing out industrial investment contracts providing guidelines to the prospective entrepreneurs successfully introduced.

The importance of foreign private investment was recognised not only as a catalyst for the overall recovery but also as a source of a career of technical know-how. Attractive concessions were offered to foreign investors.

The entire industrial field was opened to the private sector and the role of public sector was confined only to the areas where either the private sector was unwilling or incapable or where national interests so demanded.

In fact, the public sector was introduced in a supplementary manner to the private sector and policy of progressive diversification of industrial enterprises, especially in East Pakistan.

One of the major planks of the socio-economic objective of a broad-based economic growth was to ensure the widest possible dispersal of industrial centres. Before 1947 the concept of modern small industry did not exist and the cottage industries which were receiving attention of the Government were the handloom, pottery, the artizan industry, etc.

The new Government realised also the concept of small and cottage industries and gave it a permanent place in the economy of Pakistan. A large number of industrial centres were established in different parts of the country to give a fully to medium, small and cottage industries.

Preferential treatment was given to the handloom industry in the shape of large allocations of public sector development outlays.

lower custom duties on capital machinery, higher tax holidays, prompt encouragement to private entrepreneurs.

The policy was successfully implemented during the Second Plan Period.

In contrast to the existing structure during the Second Plan Period, the Third Five Year Plan placed a heavy emphasis on industrial growth and a large allocation was made out of the total plan outlay.

In the first two years of the Third Plan industrial growth exceeded that of a slightly deflated agricultural sector.

The industrial sector registered increases of 6 to 11 per cent in 1965 and 1966 respectively. However, in the Third Year the momentum was regained and growth rate of 13 per cent was achieved.

The textile, dyestuff and jute mills industries policy of the Government has paid rich dividends. A major portion of total goods requirements is being met by local manufacturers, some growing steadily in the capital goods industry, and others in the intermediate and sophisticated lines.

The export of commodities has gone down from 10 per cent in 1957-58 to 20 per cent in 1967-68.

Although a major producer of the world's wool, East Pakistan did not have a single spinning mill until 1957-58. Factories that came up with modern machinery produced 12,575 tons of hosiery and 1,275 tons of blankets.

To develop the wool industry requires a combination of private and public financing. It is a long and arduous task for quartering the pace of industrial growth.

In the last two years the total number of spin factories has gone up to eight and the installed capacity has touched the figure of 12,440 spindles, looms and treadle looms and more than double what was in existence in 1957-58. Actual production almost trebled and reached the figure of 46,207 tons in 1967-68.

Cotton Textile
The cotton textile industry also presents an equally fascinating story. The installed capacity in 1957-58 was 14 private spinning and 29,000 looms. These figures rose to 28,744 spindles and 37,714 looms in 1967-68. Textiles have not only been used for uniforms and 46,736 looms. The production of cotton 3,000 yards in 1967-68, but also for uniforms and 46,736 looms.

Sugar Industry
In 1957-58 sugar production was 119,000 tons and the total production was 155,809 tons. During the last two years the sugar industry made rapid strides and the production capacity reached the figure of 4,19,000 tons in 1967-68 and the actual production has gone up to 4,07,000 tons in 1967-68.

Cement Industry
One of the few industries that existed in Pakistan at the time of independence was that of cement. The annual production in 1947-48 was 1,00,000 tons. By 1957-58 it increased to 1,17,000 tons.

Paper and Board Industry
Although by 1947 the Subcontinent was producing approximately 1,00,000 tons of paper by machine, the only paper being made in Pakistan then at Independence was hand-made paper produced in Jhelum and Sialkot which was insignificant. The present production capacity has risen from 15,000 tons in 1957-58 to more than 1,00,000 tons in 1967-68.

Fertiliser Industry
Before 1947 there were only two fertiliser factories* one at Dabhal with a capacity of 50,000 tons of ammonium sulphate and the other at Ludhiana with a capacity of 1,00,000 tons. Superphosphate

ACCELERATING RATE OF GROWTH

The highlights of the Pakistan Economic Survey 1967-68 issued on June 2 to the members of the National Assembly by Mr. N. M. Ullah, Minister for Finance, are:-

The Growth Rate of Pakistan's Gross National Product at constant factor cost of 1959-60 has gone up from 4.6 per cent in 1965-66 to 5 per cent in 1966-67 and 8.3 per cent in 1967-68. The average growth rate during the first three years of the Third Five Year Plan is 6.1 per cent.

According to preliminary estimates, the Third Plan's target of an annual growth rate of 6.5 per cent will be achieved.
