

ASSIDEN M.P.s Call for expulsion of gruñtled Ministers

ASSIDEN M.P.s and other supporters of the proposed opposition party have had their passports taken from them on the grounds that they may be travelling to other countries to surrender the officials as soon as possible.

The Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. J. P. Kari, who said officials had called on him soon after the interim treasurer of the Nairobi branch of the proposed Kenya People's Union, Mr. E. Mwakaya, claimed that the former Vice-President, Mr. Odunga, was among a number of M.P.A. Senators and trade union leaders whose passports had been demanded. Mr. Odunga told the East African Standard from Kisumu last night, however, that his passport had not been withdrawn.

In a statement last night the Minister for Home Affairs, Mr. Mutitu, pointed out that "passports are not to be withdrawn according to any citizen wishing to travel overseas."

"It was a recognized practice that a government should be interposed to know and ensure the security of its citizens whenever they may be travelling."

Instability temporary

ONEKOKO QUITS GOVERNMENT

Agreement over Kanu policies

President Kenyatta, Mr. Achung Onko yesterday resigned from his appointment as Minister for Information and Broadcasting in the Kenya Government. Mr. Onko had been resigned from the ruling party, Kanu.

Mr. Onko expressed sadness at parting with President Kenyatta, but said he felt his continuance in the Government would be an embarrassment, and made clear that he would be supporting Government and Kanu policies on foreign affairs, land, agriculture, East African Federation and other matters.

Referring to the former Minister, a Kanu statement said the resignation was "as expected" and his complaints "were grave". Asking him to explain his "sudden departure" to Mr. Kenyatta, the statement revealed that in a "brief" Day speech Mr. Onko had referred to the President as a man of great integrity who enabled everything before him to succeed.

Challenging Mr. Onko to resign his parliamentary seat and seek a new mandate from the Nakuru voters, the Kanu statement said he had been elected to belong to and support the party of Mr. Kenyatta. This was echoed by Mr. Onko's former deputy - the Assistant Minister for Information, Mr. Othman (Makindu) West.

Constitution amendments

Similar demands to the dissenting M.P.s have been made in many statements backing the President Government and Kanu, which continue to be received from all over the country.

Meanwhile, it was claimed in Nairobi that the pro-Kanu Kenya Party (K.P.P.) had received a letter from the Government asking it to consider the possibility of joining the Government.

Mr. Onko's resignation was announced in a public rally at Kenyatta Stadium, on Monday at 6.30 p.m.

ATTACK ON CABINET AND PARTY

Kenya's Minister for Information and Broadcasting, Mr. Achung Onko, yesterday resigned his Cabinet post and from Kanu.

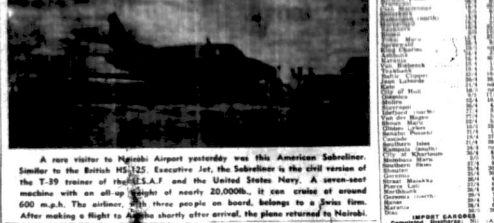
