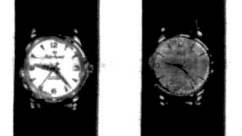

Kenya accused of leading Somali policy

EMERSON BALE SELASSIE of Ethiopia yesterday complained to the United States Deputy Foreign Minister, Mr. Malik, that by venturing into the Republic of Somalia the Soviet Union was aiding Somalia's expansion policy, which was directed against both Ethiopia and Kenya.

The Emperor said that Soviet arms had been captured in border clashes with Somali forces. Ethiopia would not recognize Somali forces and would continue to support Somali forces being sent to Somalia and being used against Ethiopia.

'Avowed expansionism'

The Emperor emphasized to Mr. Malik that Somalia had an "avowed expansionist policy," directed against Ethiopia and Kenya, and wanted that by sending Somalia arms.


During his visit, the Russian Minister also held talks with the Ethiopian Prime Minister, Mr. A. H. Wolde, and the Foreign Minister, Mr. K. M. Alemayehu.

No justification for war The Peking announcement said the Chinese plane was on a training flight, was shot down over Malaya in Vietnam Province, about 10 miles from the border with North Vietnam.

The People's Daily, the main Communist Party paper, said the Chinese people were greatly excited that they were war provocation," but observers in the Chinese capital said that despite their fervor, the official announcement of the incident made clear that China does not regard it as justification for war or armed intervention in Vietnam.

An American Phnom Penh correspondent said that the MiG-17 was downed in the Gulf of Thailand, about 100 miles from the border with North Vietnam. He said that the Chinese plane was shot down by a MiG-17, and that the Americans had shot down a MiG-17.
