SOMALIA WARNED ON ATTACKS

'Speak out in Mogadishu' says Kenya

THE Kenya Government said yesterday that it viewed with great concern the fact that Tanzania should have been chosen by Somalia as a platform from which to make vituperative and unpatriotic remarks about Kenya.

It was referring to the statement issued by the Somali Embassy in Dar es Salaam on Tuesday (and criticised by the East African Standard yesterday) which accused Kenya of indulging in "anti-African and anti-Socialist propaganda".

The Kenya Government described the remarks of the Ambassador as a vituperative and unwarranted attack on Kenya of the type which was becoming all too common recently and to which little attention was paid.

It pointed out that Kenya had patiently retained its standing the Government or people of Somalia, despite repeated abusive press reports. It was found it difficult to understand, however, how this type of malicious propaganda could be broadcast from the Nairobi meeting of leaders of member States of the Organisation for African Unity.

At that meeting the leaders had bound themselves to conduct propaganda against member States, and in fact had undertaken personally to investigate and put an end to such propaganda.

RHODESIA A REBELLION HELD UP

N. decision may be given on Monday

There will be no decision on Rhodesia in the United Nations until the end of the crisis. The council's president, Mr. J. G. de Beers, said informal talks would take place with African States in the interim. The council's fourth session has failed to reach a decision on African proposals for Britain to use force.

Zambia's Foreign Minister, Mr. Kapwepwe, said Britain wanted to grant independence to a minority government in Rhodesia with so-called guarantees for progress to majority rule. 'Zambia cannot be expected to co-operate in this pernicious sell-out,' he said.

Meanwhile, British and Rhodesian officials yesterday ended the first phase of exploratory talks in London on the crisis, but agreed to meet again after a period for reflection in Salisbury.

An agreed official statement said the contacts were made to discuss what could be done to bring about a settlement. It was thought likely the second round of talks would be in Salisbury.

Rebel threat to destroy air base

A THREAT to destroy the huge Da Nang air base unless United States marines interposed to leave Government troops to withdraw, came yesterday from rebel South Vietnamese troops besieged at Da Nang.

The threat to the U.S. marine force commanding the base was reported by Communist monks breaking the rebellion. The monks claimed that 15 people were killed and over 100 wounded in heavy street fighting as Government forces fought towards the main town.

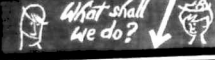

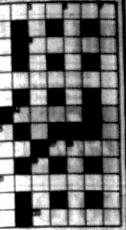

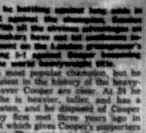

KAUNDA THREATENS BRITAIN

Urge expulsion from Commonwealth

...KAUNDA of Zambia yesterday told a rally in Lusaka that Britain's expulsion from the Commonwealth is the only way to bring about the end of the current conference. He said the conference must be held in June and he opposed any postponement. Britain has proposed that the talks be put off until autumn.

Mr. Thombe out again

MR. THOMBE'S EXPULSION from the Congolese Parliament and the accusations of high treason against him is evidence of yet another turn of the political wheel in Leopoldville. A few weeks ago he was expelled from the Government for making an alliance with Mr. Thombe to strengthen his military position. His supporters were appointed to influential posts.

The former Katanga leader has been branded as a traitor before, of course, when he defected the secession to restore it to the jurisdiction of the Leopoldville Government. Additionally, and despite the concerted disapproval of other independent African countries, he survived this shame to return as Prime Minister of the whole Congo nation.

By the use of foreign mercenaries to spearhead the intervention Congolese Army troops, Mr. Thombe and Mr. Mobutu (now his bitter enemy) were able to crush the rebellion which had sprung up in several provinces after the catastrophe of July 1965 was later suppressed by Communist arms and money.

With the rebellion virtually at an end early this year, Mr. Mobutu seized power bloodily, ousting first President Kasavubu and then Mr. Thombe. Since then the former Prime Minister has spent much time in Belgium, reportedly for medical treatment. However, the Belgian-Belgian feeling is again strong in the Congo, and this fact, together with the fact that Mr. Thombe might revert to his old campaign for Katanga's secession, may be behind the decision to oust him from office.

On the frantic scenes of Congo politics, he might even yet come up again into the limelight. During his period as Prime Minister he gained a good deal of respect by the senseless brutalities of the years of the revolt, but his name remained anathema outside. But if he still holds his disruptive drive of the years of the revolt, he may be better to retire from politics and find another outlet for his remarkable, if questionable gift of persuasion.

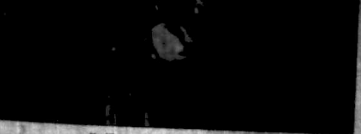

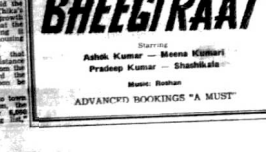

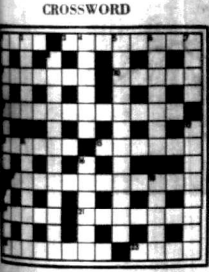

Unconfirmed reports current in Kampala, which was under dark curfew, variously said the Kabaka had been killed, was under arrest or had escaped. An official Government statement announcing the "victorious occupation" of the palace did not give any clue to his whereabouts.

This statement (reported in column 3) said the objective of the attack on the palace was to capture a cache of illegal arms and no mention was made of any intention to arrest the Kabaka, who was on Monday accused of treason by President Obote.

The Battle of Mengo Hill was mounted a day after the declaration by the President of a State of Emergency in Buganda. No official figures of casualties were available last night, but some estimates put the death toll among Government forces at 40 and on the Kabaka side as high as 200.

The Government spokesman listed 25 deaths in earlier incidents in a civilian and night police. People on the 272 and Kabaka's walking troops exchanged fire as the operation unfolded. At first the crack of small arms and automatic weapons rained through the night, but later the exchange was replaced by the rattling of machine guns. Later the sound of mortar and heavy gun fire could be heard. The buildings burning inside the palace complex, the smoke of which drifted over the hill, was the only sign of fire from positions in the palace which stands on a hill and has a border of electrified wire.

For nearly 18 hours, Kampala and other parts of Buganda had virtually no communications with the outside world except by wireless. Uganda Radio gave news of conflict after the hour of the fall of the palace. The Government spokesman said that the Government had received reports that the King had fled to the east of the lake. 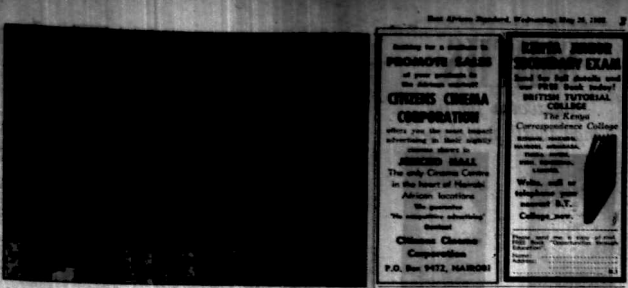

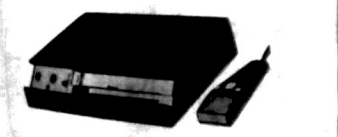

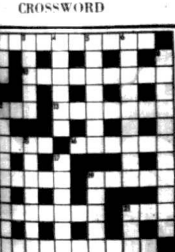

ABAKA'S FATE STILL UNKNOWN

Mr. Obote gives no answer to rumours

Speculation about whether the Kabaka of Buganda was dead or imprisoned last night — more than 24 hours after his palace on the hill had been captured by troops of the Uganda Army in a day of bitter fighting.

Mr. Obote, who displaced the Kabaka from the post of President last month and introduced a new Constitution reducing Buganda's autonomous powers, told the National Assembly last night that he had evidence that Sir Edward was planning to mount organised rebellion against the one-man's of Uganda (see Cols. 4 and 5).

Bodies taken away

During the day scores of Buganda arrested in court in Kampala, accused of plotting and causing damage. Other reports claimed that troops had moved from the Kabaka's Palace to round up individuals who were not out to work in the palace area leading bodies on trucks. Eye-witnesses said several hundred bodies were taken away in the trucks and that troops also took some articles from the palace.

A group of Buganda men avoided all reference to the Kabaka's fate when they were taken to the palace. One however, said that he had heard but had been told the Palace fighting. Another claimed that 20 people died in the fighting and that 100 were being held in custody.

Uganda Radio again avoided all reference to the Kabaka's fate when it reported that the Kabaka's Palace was being used as a military base. Three representatives of the Kabaka's Palace were taken away from Kampala and kept confined to their quarters.

ARMY MOPPING UP AFTER BATTLE

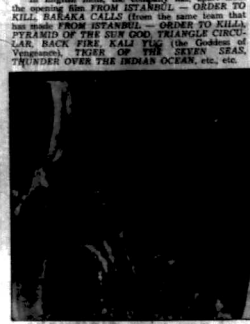

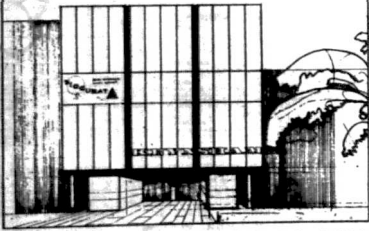
