SECURITY LEGISLATION DEBATE, TODAY

28-day limit placed on special powers

House of Representatives will be asked today to approve a bill to amend the Constitution and the Preservation of Public Order Act giving the President powers to make special regulations in the interests of public security.

The Bill was published as a special issue of the Kenya Gazette last night and the Government will ask the House to take it through all its stages today. Permission to take it through all its stages is granted if all M.P.s present agree to the request.

The amendments terminate one complete clause and parts of two other clauses — of the Constitution (fundamental rights and freedoms of the individual).

The main amendments concern one clause of the Constitution which provides for the declaration of a State of Emergency. The word "Emergency" is dropped and is replaced by a provision for the President to issue special powers proposed under the new public security legislation.

HOUSE MAY DISCUSS BOUNDARY CHANGES

The Kenya House of Representatives will discuss the amendments to the Constitution and the Preservation of Public Order Act today.

The amendments are expected to be passed by the House today.

Eight-month period

One of the new Constitutional provisions is that President must seek Parliament approval of his action in making those powers within 28 days. If approval is refused, the powers may be exercised in a subsequent period which is not more than 28 days.

Only the President will be able to exercise the special powers which will not be available to a deputy acting in his stead. The President may also decide to revoke the special powers from continuing to use powers (which would require a fresh mandate without the approval of Parliament).

A FORMER Congolese Prime Minister, Evariste Kisumu, and three other men were yesterday arrested after the Congolese Government claimed that they had plotted to overthrow President Kasavubu.

All four men are to be tried by a military tribunal for high treason.

They are found guilty if it is proved that they were engaged in a public hanging in the city's main square. The Government spokesman said that the four men were arrested by police last night.

After the arrests Gen. Mobutu made a radio broadcast in which he said that the Government would take steps to ensure the stability of the country.

The President called on the Congolese people to remain calm and continue to support the Government and the people of the country.

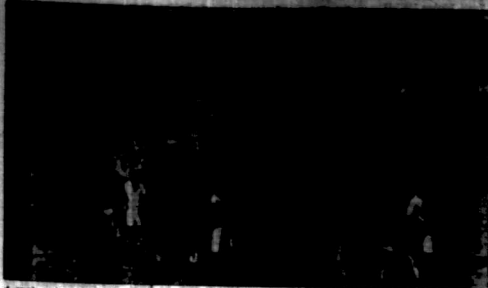

NATIONAL SPORTS STADIUM

Many scores of football fields there seem to be entirely suited for conversion into sports fields, swimming pools and so on. There would be plenty of open space left over for car parking and the village.

Traffic would present no problem. Besides the two access roads on the Mombasa road, existing roads to the east lead to the Marjany and Thika directions. All three sites are served by the railway but the third has the additional advantage of being adjacent to the airport. From an aesthetic point of view, this site would fit admirably with the proposal advanced by Mr. Sir Berke Baker who suggested planting a "Welcome avenue" of trees leading away from the airport. What an entrancing introduction to Kenya it would be if visitors leaving the airport could drive along an avenue of trees and then turn on to a main road leading the national park and sports fields on either side. If this site is not used, by contrast there is the danger that the land will be developed for housing estates or an industrial area, which would make a most dreary approach to the city in the present.

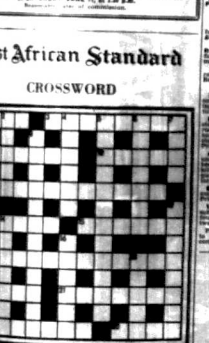

DEVELOPMENT BUDGET UP HALF

5 1/2 m. to be spent on boosting education
