



WHERE ARE THE NO. 1 GOLFERS?

NATIONAL SPORTS STADIUM

A PLEN BISHOPMAN must be made soon about the provision of a National Sports Stadium for Kenya. When the first and second phases of the stadium were completed, it was made ready for occupancy on the Oborn Highway site in Mombasa, a national event.

Kenya has a claim to be host to any continental or world championship and neighboring villages to have the visiting teams. When suitable facilities are ready, the stadium should be ready for the All-Africa Games, but should extend to the Commonwealth and cover the Olympic Games.

Once a site has been chosen and the ground given, there is no reason why the appropriate authorities should not begin working out the possibilities of attracting international events for the five or ten years ago without waiting for the entire stadium and facilities to be finished. Before approaching to select the arena, the most essential is to select the arena. Too much time has been wasted discussing the merits and demerits of the three sites (Ngara and Nairobi Dam sites). Sir Derek Erskine, who is the principal architect of the stadium, has been invited to the National Playing Fields Association of Great Britain and will be the guest speaker at the National Sports Stadium, £1,100,000 was raised for this project. Sir money spent primarily by Sir Derek, all this has gone into preliminary work on the site, in the triangle between the railway line and where the Langata Road turns off Ngara Highway. This work has been completed and this site has been completed.

The Nairobi Dam site lies further along the Langata Road (opposite Ngara). The National Sports Stadium decided to recommend the Government to consider building the stadium on the dam site after it had been decided, but has not yet started. Sir Derek Erskine has stated that £1,000,000 could be raised for the purpose over 20 years, which Sir Derek regards as too much and too long.

Advantages of a third site

The most serious objection to both sites, namely, is that of access roads capable of carrying the heavy traffic which would converge on a national stadium. Agreed, a track at the year of the dam could be improved into a road running in the direction of Kilibera village, which all traffic would be confined to the Langata road. Moreover, the dam site is rocky and probably unsuitable for turfing as a sports arena without heavily expensive excavations and leveling.

Why not inject some radical new thinking? Has either of these sites the latest advantages of an area lying across on the left of the Mombasa road, up to the airport turn-off? Many scores of football fields there seem to be entirely suited for conversion into sports fields, swimming pools and so on. There would be plenty of open space left over for car parking and the village.

Traffic would present no problem. Besides the two access roads on the Mombasa road, existing roads to the east to the Marigata and Thika directions. All three sites are served by the railway but the third has the additional advantage of being adjacent to the airport. From an aesthetic point of view, this site would fit admirably with the proposal advanced by Mr. Sir Barbe Baker who suggested planting a "Welcome avenue" of trees leading away from the airport. What an entrancing introduction to Kenya it would be if visitors leaving the airport could drive along an avenue of trees and then turn on to a main road leading the national park. This site is not so used, by contrast there is the danger that the land will be developed for housing estates or an industrial area, which would make a most dreary approach to the city in the present.




