United States Textile Industry Crippled

MINOR CLASHES BETWEEN STRIKERS AND POLICE

Peaceful Picketing WALK-OUT ESTIMATED TO BE LESS THAN FIFTY PER CENT. EFFECTIVE

The textile industry in the United States has been crippled by the strike of operatives in many of the cotton, silk, artificial silk and woolen worsted mills, but is not entirely at a standstill. The workers are demanding shorter hours.

The employers hold that at least 250,000 cotton operatives were still at work on Tuesday. On the other hand the American Federation of Silk Workers claims complete success for the silk section of the strike.

Many Mills Still Working

England and the South while the New England minor clashes between strikers, police and factory guards are reported. An estimated strike in New York 30,000 men on strike and 70,000 are still working. 80,000 are on strike and a major number working in North and South Carolina. Meanwhile, 10,000 cotton operatives have been ordered to strike at St. Louis and another 5,000 at Kansas City.

Minor Outbreaks

Minor outbreaks of violence have occurred in several of the States, particularly in South Carolina where large bands of Deputy Sheriffs were picked to force following workers to the plants over a dispute over a strike attempting to close a mill.

The interests of the farmer and the manufacturer, though in cooperation in the long run are antagonistic in the early stages, particularly in the country is organized on a higher and better basis which increases agricultural output and it is to be expected from the country's point of view if the agricultural industry relations by restriction of production. The textile strike may prove a test for the industry which all his courage and ingenuity will be needed to survive. The forces are arrayed against him, even the farmer of the country, very potent of a country which has to find many of its markets abroad and simultaneously maintains a tariff policy which injures impoverished farmers. The New Deal and the great changes in the economic order which it presents will need careful study during the next few months.

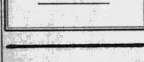

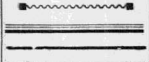

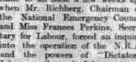

"I propose from our chief interest. Here the Japanese are persisting in growing. Fifty-one per cent of the rice grown in the East of Japan, 30 per cent from the United Kingdom, 5 per cent from India, and the balance from other countries. The penetration by Japan in our market is done not only to cheapness, but to the fact that this rice is identified by the Government given to every dealer catering for the taste of the clients.

Impartial Preference

"This Chamber has always stood for the Empire. We will support any measures which the Home Government may take to secure it. "While on the question of Imperial preference, may I request the High Commissioner to point out the steps which Uganda has taken to secure their influence on the part of Uganda cotton in India as this will help us very much. "There is another subject which I should like to touch on. There has been agitation here with regard to the depreciation of our currency. Uganda Chamber has always expressed the opinion that there should be no change as it would be prejudicial to the future prospects of Uganda.

Co-Operation Advocated

"This territory has always advocated co-operation with the neighbouring territories. But this need not be translated as meaning that we are prepared to accept the same taxation. Unfortunately during the last year, in spite of official assurances given, taxation such as the Package Tax, Graduate Non-Native Poll Tax and Tax on Capital—has been introduced. This will hinder the development of trade and the bringing in of more capital to this country. We trust this matter will receive full consideration from the Uganda and Home Governments and that taxation will be reduced.

"I wish our visitors a very happy time here and hope that they will return home they will not forget Uganda."

Grievances

De H. H. Hunter, C.B.E., D.L.D., also referred to the un-avoidable absence of His Excellency and treated that he would make a speedy recovery. In succession the toast to the Governor—proposed by the Chairman who mentioned that he was the sole survivor of the foundation members of the Chamber, which had come into existence almost 50 years ago. "The President" he said, "has touched on some of our grievances: the absence of an aerodrome at Kampala, and the way in which we are treated under the present legislation introduced into our neighbouring territories and the purpose of bettering their budgets.

Inferiority Complex

"Uganda has been accused of suffering from an inferiority complex. This has arisen out of a statement made by the late Mr. Percy Pirbright when giving evidence before the Joint Parliamentary Commission. "As Mr. Pirbright was one of the strongest supporters of our Protectorate and fought strenuously on our behalf, I do not think he would be taken at his face value. What I think has may have meant to express that we were not sufficiently vocal. We are all too busy developing our wonderful resources to have much time to give to politics.

Not Politically Minded

"We are not politically minded and we have no objection to our neighbour going on having his own, and we are hereditary holders, and who, while still in their cradles, had Cabinet Ministers to take with, and therefore, have had of such success persons as Secretaries of State and Governors.

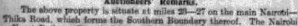

Marketing Problems

REPRESENTATIVES OF KENYA COFFEE BOARD INVITED TO ATTEND

The Secretary of the Kenya Farmers' Association and the Chairman and Secretary of the Coffee Board of Kenya have recently visited Tanganyika to discuss with producers some of the problems affecting the maize and coffee industries.

These meetings, which are described by the Moshi Correspondent as the first of a series of meetings to be marked by a spirit of close co-operation, should do much to further the common interests of producers in both Territories.

The President of the Coffee Board of Kenya was able personally to reply to questions regarding proposed coffee marketing scheme and Empire coffee exchange while the Secretary of the Kenya Farmers' Association discussed the formation of a Tanganyika Maize Board.

The Maize Industry

Mr. Henriet's address was a most interesting one, and he dealt with the various aspects of the maize industry in Kenya, including the production, marketing, and distribution of the crop.

American Liner a Blazing Wreck

WHILE RETURNING FROM PLEASURE CRUISE
Passengers Trapped in Cabins
SIXTY DEAD AND SEVENTY-THREE PERSONS STILL MISSING

While off the coast of New Jersey, American liner "Morro Castle" returning from a luxury cruise, burst into flames amidships. First reports stated that she was struck by lightning but these were later contradicted.

This sudden disaster took place at night, many passengers, asleep in their cabins, were trapped by the flames. Others so the surviving members of the crew state, were so frightened that they would not take to the boats.

Reports of the number of casualties vary considerably but it now appears certain that at least a hundred persons of the 170 hundred and fifty on board, are either dead or missing. Many were rescued by vessels which rushed to the scene, though some of the crew, including the sailing Captain, remained on the ship till she was beached. The Captain himself had died of heart-failure shortly before the fire broke out.

Harrowing Scenes

Asbury Park (New Jersey).
Fire has broken out on the American liner "Morro Castle," bound to New York from Savannah with 141 passengers and a crew of 50 on board.
According to R.O.S. wireless messages received from the ship, the vessel was on a pleasure cruise from New York to Cape Hatteras, North Carolina, when the fire broke out. The British liner "Mermaid of Bermuda," on a meeting, the vessel which is 20 miles south of the stranded liner.
The "Mermaid" was ordered to stop and assist the "Morro Castle" and is picking up survivors. Two other liners have also arrived at the scene. The Asbury Park Coast Guard station reports that 14 survivors have been landed by the "Spring Tide".

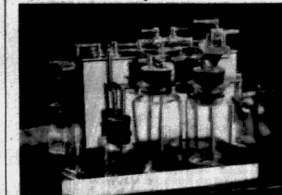

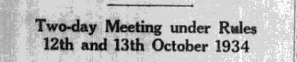

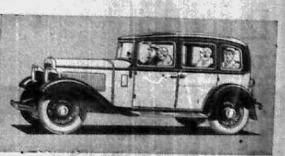

Apricot Fritters

DRAIN the syrup from a tin of apricots, put the fruit into a glass, pour over it a small wine-glass of brandy, and stand aside till required. Make a batter—put three tablespoonfuls flour into a basin, pour a dessertspoonful of olive oil into the centre, then very gradually add a gill of cold water, stirring continually with a wooden spoon. When the mixture is of the proper consistency, beat with the spoon for ten minutes, then ladle it stand for half an hour. Have ready a pan containing deep boiling fat, and a small tin of apricots in a basin, pour the brandy from the apricots, dip the fruit into the batter, then drop it into the boiling fat, and cook till browned. Drain on paper, and serve with icing sugar, and serve hot.

THE ELECTED MEMBERS' POLICY

To the Editor "E. A. Standard." Sir—I trust that you will permit me to rectify an important omission in the report of the speech delivered by the acting Governor of the Elected Members at Nairobi last week.

Major Cavonius' laudable reply laid stress on the fact that the Leader, Lord Francis Scott, speaking in Legislative Council last week, had announced the settled policy of the Elected Members Organisation as follows:—

- (1) Continued adherence to the income tax as opposed to the direct form of taxation.
- (2) The Budget to be balanced.
- (3) The "alternative" tax to be taken off at the end of the year as agreed.

Lord Francis added that Elected Members desired to make their policy as regards the financial position generally clear this month (May 1934) so that Government should be under no illusion whatever as to the true position.

It is relevant to add that Elected Members have no intention of being drawn into any Conference or discussion as to how money is to be found to balance the Budget. Government has had two years to put their house in order and the time has now come to call upon them to show results. No further taxation direct or indirect will be considered by the "alternative" tax agreed upon to help them to balance the late budget must be withdrawn as agreed the year.

In taking this stand, Elected Members call upon the Executive to support them unreservedly in the fight for drastic economies that lie before them. This was the substance of Major Cavonius' laudable speech. Otherwise, however, raised, a singularity out of place at the present time had regard to the present trend in prices of all primary products.

SOIL EROSION AND ITS PREVENTION

Necessary Preparations for Dry Season

CONSERVING HERBAGE

Wash Steps to be Grown on Cultivated Land

Below is given the seventh of the series of articles on the subject of soil erosion that the Kenya Department of Agriculture is issuing for the guidance of farmers and planters.

Soil Erosion and Planning

It is a mistake to imagine that in the absence of capital for adoption of these measures, little can be done. Much can be done in normal circumstances at low cost, provided the necessary forethought and planning is brought to bear on the problem at the right time (during the wet season wash steps should be grown on cultivated land, and during the dry season efforts should be made to conserve sufficient herbage on pastures to prevent erosion during the non-growing period).

At the commencement of the year

At the commencement of the year the management of cultivated land and pasture should be directed to the adoption throughout of the following measures, which are neither expensive nor difficult.

Cultivated Land

As far as farm management allows, break the flatter land available on the low land plant lines of Napier grass along the contours of slopes occur occasionally. Plant similar lines of Napier grass on low already cropped. Plant crops along the contours, but up a down slopes, however gradual the slope may be.

Adopt methods of strip cropping, that is, plant lines of low growing crops such as potatoes, beans and fodder crop between strips of Napier and other crops which, to the surface soil to wash off. Plant grass measures to increase the capacity of soil to absorb water by reducing soil crust and maintaining a crumb structure, thus preventing consolidation of soil. Plant grass measures to increase the water-holding capacity of the soil, thus aiding pervasion of water and reducing runoff.

Convert sloping land into pasture. Plant steep slopes with trees to provide fuel and building material, and to maintain the flow of springs.

Pasture

Promote the vegetable covering of the soil by provision of burning of weed, and prevention of overgrazing. Adopt a system of rotational grazing by means of paddocking.

Reduction of erosion on soil should be effected by the adoption of the above methods, despite the fact that it may take two, three or more years to cover all cultivated lands in the system and a longer period to organize pastures. At lower altitudes of the Colony, the dry season has already set in. This year the rainfall has been sparse, and it has been difficult to provide fodder for the dry months. In these circumstances grazing will be much in demand and it may be difficult to keep cattle without the executive grazing of those pastures liable to erosion.

High Altitudes

At higher altitudes, however, rains have been ample and growth of grass excellent. Therefore grass can be conserved at the end of the wet dry season and the soil kept covered.

High Altitudes (continued)

This aspect of soil erosion should constantly be kept in mind against the dry period early next year and the commencement of the rainy season.

Thus if pasture land of one part of the farm is subject to erosion, this part may be grazed heavily during the wet season, but in the winter, the soil cover and to prevent erosion at the next rains, cattle should be kept off this portion of the farm during the dry season.

This point is yet another illustration of the necessity for the growing of sufficient food-stuffs for use of stock during the dry season.
