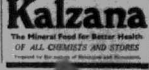

**SOIL EROSION AND ITS PREVENTION**

**Advantages of Napier Grass**  
**AN INEXPENSIVE METHOD**

Below is given the eighth of the series of papers written on the subject of soil erosion that is the Kenya Department of Agriculture in response to the inquiries of farmers and planters.

In a previous article attention was drawn to several simple, effective and inexpensive methods of reducing soil erosion on gentle slopes.

One of the best expensive methods mentioned for cultivated land was the planting of lines of Napier grass along contours.

Some of the advantages of Napier grass are: 1. Contour lines are not so noisy and lines are established quickly. 2. Planting material is cheap to buy and grows. 3. Rows planted provide material for further plantings. 4. Planting costs are low: 5. Requiring each season is not necessary as with many annual plants used to stop washes; the lines live for several years. 6. The lines do not require from the lines into cultivated land, or used; 7. If densely planted, the rows do not occupy much space in the field; 8. It is not needed for ploughing; the grass can be cut and laid to strengthen the lines; 9. It improves the condition of the soil.

Lines of Napier grass to act as stop-washes are established by planting cuttings or whole stems. Rows would be suitable, but are rarely or never available in quantity. Moreover the cost of lifting, cartage and replanting of rows would be greater than the cost of cuttings or stems.

The lines are laid out with a line and marked with sticks and more than 20 yards apart along the lines. Mature stems are chosen for making cuttings which should have three joints. Two of which are planted below the surface of the soil.

**Method of Planting**  
Planting is done by opening furrows up to six inches deep with a plough. Sticks planted at intervals of not more than 25 yards are good guides to the plough team. The cuttings are laid against the furrow side, earth is

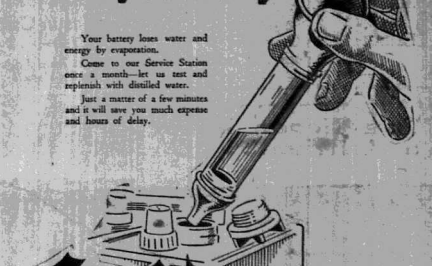

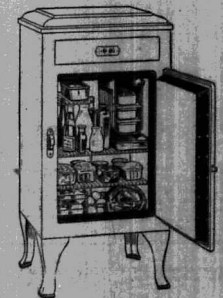

### Importance of Child Welfare AFRIAN CLINICS IN UGANDA

THE importance of child welfare and maternity care among Africans has been recognized by the medical department in East Africa as being the best and in fact the only way in which to improve the condition of the Native.

It is found, says the annual report of the Uganda Medical Department, the three chief reasons for the emphasis of this side of medical work were given as (1) that a healthy child will do less work of any sort was of infrequent occurrence, and that the disease most economically found were of a preventable nature; (2) that it seemed an unnecessary expense of money to endeavor to avert the ravages of typhoid and sanitation when relief to apply such rules had already almost certainly been obtained; and that these physicians personally impatient and fervid that the application of child welfare methods were to a small section of the community must create an antipathy over a wide circle.

#### Beacons of Light

Last year, therefore, several child welfare and maternity classes were started in various districts of Uganda. The Lady Curzon Maternity Training School at Nambundu says in its report, 1928 (printed by Sir Albert Cook):

"Each country estate should become a beacon light of hygienic maternity and safe-natal child-rearing, and in this way the surrounding sanitary districts. And then, in many parts, of the world the light of development, disease and under-nourishment, which have been the cause of the tenous millions huddled together in the over-crowded towns and cities, appear unemployed and a population living perilously near the edge of starvation, will fall back upon the light."

In Africa, however, the survival of fittest led to a very low population. African mothers were ignorant of the modern methods of the "organ," but for the last they are coming to know, and their children are being followed, even if unconsciously, for have not numerous been defined.

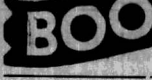

# NOTES FOR WIRELESS FANS

## "Tone Control" . . . . . A By-pass to Better Reception

With which I have been experimenting with a rather interesting little gadget, a tone control. It is a variable resistor connected to the tone button of a 15,000 ohm variable tone control in series with a 100 ohm fixed condenser. The condenser being connected across the speaker leads. It can therefore be regarded as associated with very roughly a 200 ohm condenser in a resistance or reactance of 100 ohms at 1,000 cycles (but only 10 ohms at 5,000 cycles). As frequency rises, therefore, more than the high notes are by-passed through the condenser and for this reason the speaker, at all purposes of the resistance is in a variation of the total by-passed at all frequencies. Thus at 100 cycles the effective reactance is a variable between 2,000 and 500 ohms and at 1,000 cycles between 1,000 and 210 ohms.

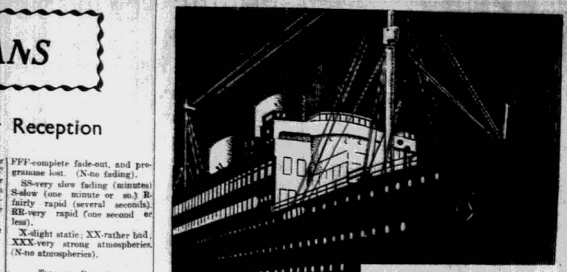

### A FAMILY FEUD

#### Appeal of Three Indians Dismissed

In July of last year a quarrel took place between several Indians in Nairobi, and on the trial Indian, Pait Khan, who was involved in the affair, had one of his teeth knocked out.

It was not until eleven months had elapsed that three Indians, Jawar Singh, Gulam Noor Khan and Mohamed Sharrif, were charged with the offence. They were tried by the Resident Magistrate, Nairobi, and were all acquitted in July of this year. The first two accused were each fined Shs. 200, with the alternative of six weeks' hard labour, while the third accused was fined Shs. 500, with the alternative of one month's hard labour.

The trial Magistrate described the assault as being a most brutal one, actuated by a revenge for past offences between the family and the complainant and his son.

The three accused appealed against their respective sentences and sentences of Mr. Justice Webb and Mr. Acting Judge the Gamble, who heard the appeal in the Supreme Court, Nairobi, on Monday. In giving judgment their Honours dismissed the appeal. There was ample evidence to justify the Resident Magistrate in coming to the conclusion which he did, they observed, and they did not consider that the sentences were excessive in the circumstances. "If it was true that this assault was the culmination of an old dispute between the parties, it was just as well that the appellants should have been given a lesson."

#### APPEAL DISMISSED

#### Native Who Stole Methylated Spirits

Christopher Warent s/o Jeremiah Ng'otha, a native who was sentenced last June to four months' hard labour for abducting an appeal against his conviction and sentence to Mr. Justice Webb and Mr. Acting Judge Gamble sitting in the Supreme Court, Nairobi, yesterday.

Christopher Warent had originally been charged with entering the premises of "Dax's" hardware and Westmorland House, Nairobi, by smashing a plate glass window with a stone. He had stolen bottles of methylated spirits. The trial Magistrate found that it was a serious case of offence and one which should be brought from becoming common in the town.

Their Honours confirmed the conviction and sentence, and the appeal was dismissed.

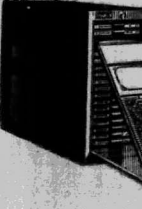

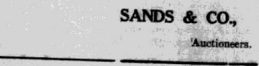

### Kenya Finance

#### THE EFFECTS OF NATIVE TAXATION

To the Editor:—E. A. Standard! Sir,—In reading this letter written by "Bilbore" in your weekly issue of September 15th, it seemed to me that he had got hold of the stick by the wrong end.

It seems incredible that "Bilbore" does not realize that the Native is overtaxed. The fact that the revenue derived from Native taxes is largely expended in industrial, social and educational work further fact that these services are being supplied from the Native means that the Native must be able to afford a certain amount of leisure and recreation. As a farmer, I employ a few hands. I give them a month's rest every eight shillings a month, and I would say I have the greatest difficulty in finding even this small amount. Being squatters they work about eight months in the year which means that their earnings are about forty-eight shillings. Owing to bad conditions, their crops have partially failed and in most cases the harvest has been insufficient for the needs of the household. The average monthly income of the average native working on a farm is being taxed up to 40 per cent. of his earnings. And in some cases it is even higher than this.

After carefully reading over with "Bilbore" letter, I agree that Mr. Dykes states things as he is hearing about it, that the Native is overtaxed. Mr. Dykes does not say that the European is, on that account, under-taxed.

The whole crux of the matter is that we all, Europeans and Natives alike, overtaxed. The taxation is based on the 1920 price level of commodities, and the tax-tation was already burdensome in 1920. Our receipts for exports are about one-third of that which we obtained for each article exported in 1920. The production charges (i.e. taxation, rents and transport) are taken together, slightly greater or less in 1924.

I make no pretension that my remarks will be entirely correct, but I do not realize that the trading centres imposed on the Native means no more to the native population of East Africa than a huge and unmitigated market for both agricultural and industrial.

Formerly the Native was one of my best customers. He is now as a customer a negligible quantity. He has to cash available to purchase goods or food. Every available shilling is taken by taxation while still leaving the wretched Native in debt and, further, more, under-credited. And I trust that it is often obtained by inconsistent bargaining.

"Sweeps" letter published in

your weekly of September 15 is a telling answer to "Bilbore". You are making the point that the majority of farmers in Kenya, with no particular knowledge of or interest in State Finance, either reading the arguments, far and away, that the Government is either tending to increase its revenue or to increase its expenditure in such a manner as to be unworkable and that under this heading the interests of the Native and European are concerned. It seems quite obvious to me that taxation is the simplest method of adding this and other necessary funds.

### NAIBES

To the Editor:—E. A. Standard! Sir,—During the last few years the Rabies muzzum has spread, despite the destruction of large numbers of dogs, hyenas and jackals, from the Abyssinian border north to Kakamega, Eldoret and Soy.

North of those places there is a natural barrier which would be well used to prevent the disease spreading further in that direction; this is the Nzoia river which runs in the Cherangani mountains and down to Lake Tanganyika.

It is often stated that animals infested with hydrophobia are afraid of water and will not cross rivers. I would say, therefore, that the line of the Nzoia river is held against further advance north of the disease. To do this, rivers and bridges (and they are not numerous) must be stopped in such a way that no animals can pass over naturally at night. This would necessitate the construction of barriers, being water and will not cross rivers, and close the barriers to allow vehicles etc. to pass.

In the Native Reserves through which the Nzoia flows, it would be necessary to warn the Chiefs to forbid dogs being brought across the river in canoes. If these suggestions are carried out there is every hope that the spread of Rabies further north may be stopped. If the disease crosses the Nzoia nothing will stop its spread right through to the frontiers of Kenya and Uganda, and the Sudan, as jackals are very numerous over our borders and further north.

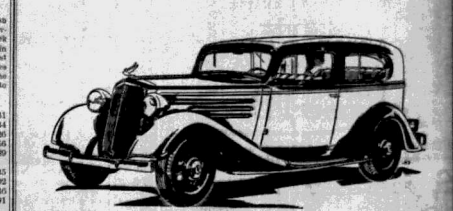
