ATTORNEY GENERAL ON ALTERNATIVE TO LAW AND ORDER

The Suk Murder Trial which opened at Eldoret on Monday closed at four o'clock yesterday afternoon. A verdict of manslaughter was brought in against Mrs. Selwyn and the Native accused and Mr. Justice Webb passed the following sentences—

Mrs. Helen Selwyn—One year imprisonment. The Native accused—One month each.

In his address to the jury the Attorney General said an attempt had been made to justify the acts of the accused by reference to theft and a reduced police force and the jury had pronounced their verdict in spite of the fact that farmers of Kenya were entitled to take the law into their own hands.

He described that as a "disgraceful suggestion" and said to follow it meant anarchy.

In his summing up the Judge said he did not think the facts amounted to murder.

A Crowded Court

STANDARD SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT

The case for the defence in the Suk murder trial was resumed at 2.30 o'clock this afternoon when Mr. Margaret Arnott was called to the witness. The evidence and cross-examination of Mrs. Selwyn had occupied the attention of the court during the whole of the morning.

found them might be a miscarriage of justice. She agreed with the death certificate that the cause of death was exhaustion due to epilepsy.

The witness was in agreement with the Attorney General that regarding the need for operations she agreed also that there was authority for not giving injections in cases of blood poisoning.

At a later stage in her own examination the Judge reminded Dr. Arnell that she was not appearing as an advocate.

Continuing in answer to further questions by the Attorney General, she testified that Keren had been induced with blood poisoning by her husband.

At a later stage the Judge said "You seem to think you are on trial."

Dr. Arnell: Well, the Attorney General asked me to put words into my mouth (laughter).

The witness admitted that all the natives who had been beaten by Keren, she said, constituted a large number of the population of the country.

Following this remark the cross examination developed into a good measure of a duel between the Attorney General and the witness.

On finishing her evidence Dr. Arnell expressed the view that she had no reason to believe that Keren was not a brutal or callous woman and was a violent character.

In re-examination, in reply to Mr. Shaw, Dr. Arnell testified that she considered that Keren's treatment in hospital was incorrect and entirely inadequate.

Mr. Shaw. And again: If they were suffering from the beating it is likely that Mrs. Selwyn would send them to the police in the condition alleged?

I later in his address Mr. Shaw referred to the "Indians" inquiry and sufficient treatment of Keren by the doctor at the African Native Hospital.

The Court was crowded in the afternoon and sleep was only obtained by the Attorney General rising to address the jury.

Dealing with the question of general aid the Attorney General said the accused had not an unlawful act and if the jury were satisfied that Keren died as a result of that act, even if she had been sane.

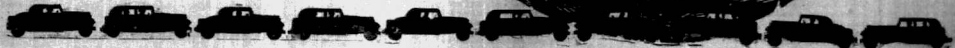

The singing is extremely good and Mr. Saville has been very subtle in introducing those operatic passages which are sufficiently well-known, but which yet avoid the reproach of being of the hack-saved-the-most-luckiest. The film was undoubtedly on the long side.

#### Critic Finds

Miss Cecilia Fields provides a problem which English film studios are yet to solve. This film avows that a director could wish for—personality, humor, and originality. In the North of England she makes a greater appeal to the film public than almost any other actress, English or American. But she has yet to make a good film. The story of "Sieg at War" was written by Mr. J. B. Priestley and is directed by Mr. David Lean, evidence that a real effort has been made to provide her with a vehicle worthy of her talent. But Mr. Lean seems to have confused something of her infectious good humor and gained nothing thereby in his film. "Sieg at War" is a sincere effort to make a film which should truly represent an aspect of English life, but it is not really successful. In it Miss Fields is not quite herself, and yet apart from her pictures she lacks individuality of her own. But for the purpose of getting Blackpool on the map it is admirable.

#### British Scores in Italy

Britain has scored a triumph at the International Film Exhibition in Venice. The judging committee have announced that "Man of Straw" was the best film of the entire exhibition. This film, directed by Mr. Robert Flaherty, has been awarded Silver Montelini's Gold Trophy.

Mr. Alexander Korda's latest film "The Private Life of Don Juan" was awarded the Silver Medal for the best film shown in the exhibition before being publicly released. Gold Medals for the best acting were awarded to Wallace Berry and Katherine Hepburn.

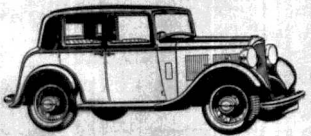

Twelve Lives Lost in Tragic Railway Smash

EXPRESS CRASHES INTO REAR OF LOCAL TRAIN Two Coaches Telescoped

FORTY INJURED IN COLLISION NEAR WARRINGTON

In consequence of an express passenger train crashing into the rear of a local "motor-train" at Warrington, on Friday evening, twelve people are reported dead and forty injured.

The first two coaches of the express, in which most of the casualties occurred, were telescoped, and two others were derailed. The engine of the local was overturned and the two rear coaches which were unoccupied, smashed.

Rescue work was undertaken by breakdown gangs which were promptly on the scene. They were assisted by volunteers, including passengers who escaped injury. Urgent messages for doctors and nurses met with speedy response.

Main Line Completely Blocked

Yen women are in the Warrington railway all very seriously injured. Mr. Daniel Slingsby, and other high officials of the M.S. & L.M.S. Division, Blackpool, have left for the scene of the disaster. The express had called at Warrington at 4.50 p.m. The local train, which was on the main line, is totally blocked, and it is unlikely that it will be cleared before morning.

Special trains, run from each side of the wreck, are taking uninjured passengers for the remainder of their journey.

Police Not Cleared

Mr. Hilly, Sept. 25, the death of ten persons and injuries to others, occurred in a collision between the local train at 9.15 a.m. on Saturday night. One coach struck first, but the second was struck by the engine, and the passengers killed.

Official Statements

An official M.S. & L.M.S. statement says that an official inquiry will be held into the crash. It is believed that the driver of the express was at fault, but his only fault has not yet been recovered. The driver was injured.

Women Seriously Injured

The dead were taken to the Warrington Mental Hospital and the injured to the Warrington Hospital, of which there are 26 beds.

Wollen, Chairman of the Board, at a public meeting of the Thika District Association at the Thika Sports Club on Friday evening.

At the close of his remarks he stated that the Coffee Board had been advised of rumours to the effect that it had abandoned its proposals for the reorganisation of marketing. The Board wished it to be known that such rumours were baseless and that it was continuing with its work and its investigations.

In accordance with its own expressed policy, and with the unanimous instruction of the last coffee conference, it was establishing the closest possible contact with all trade interests—both in Nairobi and London.

### Trade Support Essential

It is noted to remove any misunderstanding in the minds of planters. The Board would reiterate that the whole basis of the scheme is that it has put forward to control the functions of the Kenya coffee industry with the least possible disturbance to existing markets.

To summarize the scheme—the Board wishes, with the co-operation of all essential trade interests, to ensure the proper functioning of Kenya coffee to all its markets. The Board aims to supply a "blending London" market with the quantity and the quality of coffee which the market requires and which it can profitably absorb.

### Central Exchange in London

AN old and very valued correspondent has sent me the following letter which has been written to "The Times":

Sir,—May I intrude on the interesting discussion now current in your columns on the propriety of using adjectives to describe the undesirable forms of the new English? I desire to put in a plea for a virtue new metaphor in the place of one which, I submit, though still widely used, is by the day becoming less apt.

Fear, Sir, is not the moral responsibility of the golfer over whelming? Is a game tempting with temptation he must in no way improve his lie or intimidate in word or deed, if not in thought, his opponent. He must be able to succeed accurately, up to double figures if necessary. He must remain on the most reliable terms, in spite of the closest scrutiny, with his adversary for some two and a half hours.

The golfer must possess the qualities of sympathy, sympathy and intellectual independence, and untiring will control. Hints on Umpiring Annual General Meeting

Control of the Game This Week's Matches

THE attention to rules have been dealt with during the past two weeks, but there are still several rules which seem to cause difficulty and I will review these later.

This week we will deal with points for umpires during the progress of a game. The game has long been under the first duty of an umpire to see that he is in a position where he can best supervise the play. There may be any line or last line rule, it must be one of the way of the player, but one thing is certain, and that is that he must not remain stationary. Move up and back along the line as the play advances, or recedes, and the umpire to prevent any field position to be regulated by the position of the third defender coming from the goal-line. It is not an umpire can be off-side if he has three opponents nearer their own goal line than he is when the ball is hit or rolled in to him.

As the attacker approaches the goal the umpire should keep well out of the way of players and, if necessary, stand outside the goal if the ball is close to the touch line. If the ball has not reached its twenty-five yards area and is on the left side of the goal it must be in or near where that circle joins the goal-line, as from the touch-line he cannot usually get a clear view of the far edge of the circle, and by being near the goal-line it can easily be seen if the ball crosses the goal-line or not. An umpire should never allow himself to be caught in mid-air with the ball before himself and the touch-line or he will be in someone's way when the ball is control, also the defense may be unlighted.

Co-Operation

A few words as regard co-operation between the two umpires controlling a game. The umpires association makes a point of appointing disinterested umpires and these should realize that they are present, not to perform separate tasks, but to do one task jointly for the benefit of the game as a whole.

There are umpires who take it as a personal affront if a penalty is given in their half and think that the quality of their umpiring is being questioned. They fail to realize that on man can always see everything and that the game, as a whole, is the main thing to be careful, however, the other half where the other umpire is in a better position to see. He has probably seen the incident as well and more clearly than his colleague and is putting the "advantage" rule into play.

There are many umpires who unfortunately think it is necessary to penalize every minute infringement, quite regardless of the fact that no one is either the winner as the loser because of the infringement. There are many small infringements which when committed amount a great deal to the advantage of one side. Big on the game, but which are totally insignificant when committed far away from an opponent. In cases where a small un-intentional offence gains no advantage it may be allowed to pass.

But it was thought that the locusts would be uniformly few and that the swarms would be of the ground of risk of damage to livestock and crops through contact with the acacia is not so great.

Professor Fourie said that he had just received a report from the collector in South Africa which stated that very successful results had been obtained for the use of acetars.

Without any more experiments it was thought that the type of machine that had been used in the service of Imperial Airways had now been equipped as a locust-dusting machine.

The most efficient type of plane was the acro-cargo, and a recommendation was going to be made to the Government in that South Africa that more acro-cargo planes should be used in locust-dusting.

Mr. Johnston stated that although swarms after they had settled was to be preferred as it was much cheaper than the use of locusts in flight should continue further experiments in the direction to be made.

It was suggested that the locusts should be dusted with a fine spray of locust-dusting machine.

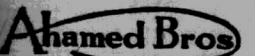

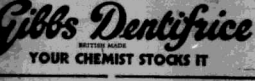

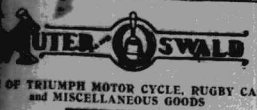

**FLOTSAM AT LAMU**

How the Cassarian Tree Came to Manda Island

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]

Swinging across the southern portion of the Indian Ocean comes a strong and deep current that strikes the coast of Africa in the neighbourhood of Cape Delgado and Mozambique and then divides north and south. The northern branch leaves our shores and runs at about four miles per hour in the Mozambique Channel, and at some miles or so in the south-east monsoon. This current, and as well as being strong south-west winds—brings up all sorts of flotsam and other things.

Then, the cassarian is indigenous to Australia, yet it is found, as planned by the sea-shore, at Manda Island. The appearance of a jelly-like mass. As specimens at this spot cannot be traced to human influence, or to birds, so that the inference is that the seeds were water-borne by this current all the way from Australia at some far distant date.

**Prize Money**

Of more positive proof of this current and of the course that it takes were the scientific messages in bottles that were thrown overboard from troopships in Australian waters during the great war, and the long, torpedo-shaped cylinder that came sailing over the sea and was identified as being of the same pattern as those used in the construction of the Ho-wang, a radio employed on the steamship line to link the British Isles with New Zealand many years back, and was never heard of again.
