Revolutionaries Again Active in Spain

GOVERNMENT STATED TO HAVE POSITION IN HAND

Lively Skirmishes

TEMPER OF EXTREMISTS REVEALED BY GRIM STORIES FROM PROVINCES

Serious fighting was renewed in parts of Spain after a quiet spell on Monday, but the latest reports indicate that the Government has the revolution in hand and that the rebels are gradually being suppressed. Although definite figures are not available, it is estimated that five hundred people were killed and two thousand injured in the disturbances.

Grim stories from the provinces show the temper of the extremists. At Havana the barracks of the Civil Guards were blown up, but the inmates and their families being killed. Near Barcelona a priest was sprinkled with petrol and burned to death. Several churches were destroyed.

The situation is still delicate, particularly as the Anarchist Syndicalists, who belong to the National Federation of Labour, have decided to support the strike movement started by the Socialists. The Government has threatened the railways with anticipation of a militant general railway strike. Railwaymen may be shot if the spot if they refuse to work.

Rebels Gradually Being Suppressed

Barcelona, Sunday. Fighting was renewed in Madrid and Barcelona last night but the Government is gradually suppressing the rebels. The Madrid unscrupulous and also the Motril barracks. The police have arrested the rebel leaders outside Catalonia.

Severe Fighting

The revolutionary committee of the Socialist Youth Movement was arrested in a private house in Madrid for four days and directing operations. Many people have been arrested, including three members of the committee.

Carolina Seized

The news seized the village of Carolina and set fire to the house of the local leader. Four thousand officers were sent to the town and the rebels were routed and fled to the mountains. The rebels fled the village during which two women were killed and eight wounded. The rebels are being pursued by the Government forces.

New De Havilland "Comet" Machines

The first of the three De Havilland "Comet" aeroplanes, which have been ordered for the Melbourne Trophy Speed Air Race from England to Australia, passed official tests yesterday and today. REVOLUTIONARIES AGAIN ACTIVE IN SPAIN
(Continued from page 1.)

Cabinet Sitting
The Cabinet is now sitting. It is probable it will decide to call up the first and second army reserves which adds men up to 30 years of age. The Fascist leader, Gen. De Rivera, was received by the Premier, Senor Llorca, to whom he offered the services of his 50,000 followers. The telephone girls have been firing inside the exchange for the past four days. They are keeping the line running to Paris and one to London.

Telephone Line Out
The telephone line from London and Paris to Barcelona has been cut. A detachment of troops arrived in the nick of time to prevent the Anarchists cutting off the water supply to Barcelona. Fifty-two soldiers were killed when a heavy pack of shock troops was dynamited to-day by rebels in Asturias.

Firing in City
Barcelona, Oct. 9. Lively skirmishes occurred here this morning between the rebels and the Government troops. Heavy firing was heard in several parts of the city, especially in Catalonia Square and outside the telephone headquarters.

Official Statement
Madrid, Oct. 9. The Home Secretary has issued a statement in which he declares that the revolution has completely failed and that the Republican plan to secure control of Madrid and Asturias was not achieved. Only a few isolated groups of rebels outside Oviedo continue to cause trouble. The situation in the capital is quieter. Halfway communications have been re-established throughout Spain with the exception of Asturias.

Courts Martial
After a lengthy sitting the Cabinet announced that courts martial will be convened to-day. Most of the trials will be held in Barcelona. Messages from Barcelona indicate that isolated fighting is continuing, but the military are in control of the situation.

It was very necessary that the Government of Nyaland, should initiate work on Lake Shirwa and Zomba mountains as it might be the scene of a possible invasion and that area should be intensively surveyed. The Kifwele flats at Mtsaka should be carefully watched and an aerial survey made of the Uruw-Tanganyika lowlands of North Rhodesia. The grounds at Mwanabiqui should also be closely observed.

It was suggested that all countries south of the Sahara should produce vegetation maps to show the extent and nature of the grasslands because such grasslands were possible habitats and reservations of the red locusts and if possible these should be supplemented by photographs. Prof. Fozz and that South Africa keenly appreciated the danger of invasion by the red locust and they had had later experience of an enormous invasion during the past year or so. The Government of the Union of S.A. had worked the lines suggested by Mr. Mecheimier and although observations had not actually been continued it was hoped to undertake such work in close co-operation with the Control Committee in London and he fully agreed that this work was of the very greatest importance.

French and Spanish Help

The French Delegation requests that facilities should be given to entomologists to make observations on the River of Lake Chad. Don Juan de Vera Calabala on behalf of the Spanish Government informed the Conference that they would give every facility to the work being carried out in Spanish territory which offer was gratefully received by all the delegates present and they tendered their united thanks to the Spanish Government. The President then congratulated the Conference on the work they had done and adjourned the meeting until Monday to enable the Secretary-General in the meantime to draft the resolutions that had been agreed.

Goodhouse, as I will constantly prove at the proper time and place.

Breeding Camps
"Two—All those Crown lands (Union and South-West Africa) are and always have been uncontrolled locust breeding camps and eggs are now again being laid on the western and eastern boundaries of Goodhouse.
"Three—As there was great trouble uncontrolled in flying mosquito-blyte patrol once a month (being taken seriously) and although we have a sleep inspector and two policemen as Goodhouse remains uncontrolled, I am forced in self-defence, to demand damages from the Government—damages already sustained and yet to be sustained from volunteers or their owners, which are bound to cross from Crown land into Goodhouse."

Damage Continues
"Besides the losses I have already stated, I cannot possibly continue farming operations—vegetables and manure are being eaten off as soon as they are sown because the locusts continue to come and volunteers are bound to come from the uncontrolled Crown land as soon as rain falls."
"All this ruin lay on me not because of criminal negligence and incompetence of those who were paid to cope with the plague in these many years. They ran into the Kalahari wasting the Union's millions of pounds within the locusts, while they allowed locusts to breed and swarm within the Crown lands of the Union and South-West, to run the only irremediable form in these parts."

Workmen Diminished
"I have one to diminish my workmen because to continue, as at present, to try to raise any crop, is to ignore the situation, as long as this locust danger exists and is ignored the situation."
"How am I to meet my liabilities with my wheat crop, my meat season's citrus crop, my vegetables and meales destroyed? And this on top of great flood losses and damage to the irrigation lands only eight months ago."

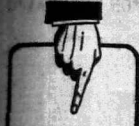

YUGO-SLAVIA'S KING ASSASSINATED

(Continued from page 1.)

morning and went at once to the Prefecture, where the body of the late King lay.

Later the remains of Mr. Barbois were removed from the Hotel Dieu, where he had died, and the Prefecture and the bodies of the King of Yugo-Slavia and of the French statesman now lie side by side, well covered by their National flag, with a guard of French and Yugo-Slav Generals.

General Georges, who was also slain by an assassin, is expected to recover.

Universal Horror

It is doubted if any political crime has ever caused such universal horror and condemnation, and these sentiments coupled with deep sympathy for the families and anxious of the dead King and dead statesman are expressed in the Press of every country.

In Britain the newspapers without exception pay tribute to the intense sympathy to their respective countries which were the common characteristics of King Alexander and Mr. Barbois.

"The Times" also says that from the general European standpoint, King Alexander's murder is all the more disastrous since he had long maintained a firm and able hand on the foreign policy of his country. He had played an important part in the formation of the Little Entente and had repeatedly proved that he was no Christianist. His readiness to meet King Boris of Bulgaria halfway on the road to understanding had greatly improved the prospects of the Balkan agreement.

His last and fatal journey had been undertaken with the object of better relationship between his Country and Italy as an essential preliminary to Franco-Balkan understanding on which so much depends. "The Times" adds that all will smile in sympathy with the French that just at this moment when Mr. Barbois was bent upon recording the long-standing differences between his country and Italy, his influence should have been so cruelly ravaged from European diplomacy.

Message of Sympathy

At the Yugo-Slav Legation this morning members of the Diplomatic Corps began to call at an early hour and the Minister received a great number of mes-

sages of sympathy and condolence. The Balkan Situation (Continued from page 1.)

London, October 10.
New commentaries on the tangled situation in the Balkans arising from the assassination of King Alexander are the subject of leading articles in this morning's papers, all of which pay tribute to the King's patriotism and to his efforts to achieve a better understanding of Europe. "The Times" says there were signs that King Alexander's high personal character and devotion to duty had begun to win back many of the Croats when his policy had alienated, while the threatening reappearance of Germany and the threat to Austrian independence had ruffled many doubters to the King's side.

The "Daily Telegraph" declares that King Alexander's death at the beginning of his important negotiations breaks in a time when they change duty, his courageous statesmanship and leadership towards a better understanding between France, Italy and Yugo-Slavia.

Queen's Grief

A message from Marcelline announces that Queen Marie died in his bed and looking pale and broken with grief arrived there and was greeted at the station by the Minister of Marine and his Military, Naval and Civil authorities. She proceeded in a motor car to the Prefecture where the King's body is lying in state, and the entire death chamber accompanied by Madame Herriot. The two ladies who are both Daughters of Honour showed admirable courage and dignity in their distressing circumstances.

It is learned that during her journey to Marcelline the Queen fainted several times and she had a serious breakdown at Lyons.

MAILS STOLEN

From Travelling Post Office Vans

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]
Very extensive use of the Travelling Post Office vans on the trains is being made by the public. Everyone seems to want to the "standard" mail, just a few minutes before the train starts.

There seems to be an inherent confidence and trust of the public for these Travelling Post Office vans, but recent events suggest that the confidence is misplaced. Such letters are said to have been manipulated in various ways by the native employees who are in charge of the P.O. vans and many of them never reach their destination.

On the Tabora-Mwanza railway line, near Shinyanga, a bundle of such letters was found in a ditch, close to the line. Also in a house in Tabora, where the P.O. van employees stay for a few days at a time, when they change duty, some 25 letters have been discovered by Police. Two of the envelopes have been punished, one at Tabora by a sentence of eight months' hard labour, and another at Mwanza by 12 months.

These happenings which frequently take place, cause much despair to those who are sending the mails that the native, when released, will be fit to hold positions of trust in the Government service.

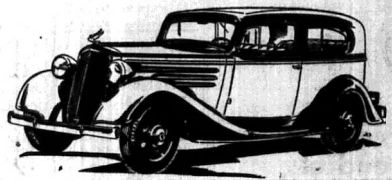

Tambach

The outcrop below Tambach was examined following the statement that "limonite" had been found there and would be available for the farming community. The Tambach area is a Trias-Noria where it is required for conditioning the ground.

No limonite was found, but rocks of the basement complex were seen to underlie the layer forming the plateau and it is possible that in another part of the valley the greater number of this system might be found.

Mairaha and Kisungup

During May about reconnaissance notes were made from Mairaha down the Nyroba Gorge and up to Leroko. The essential purpose for these journeys lay in the search for "Bantouite", a very valuable clay characterized by an enormous absorptive power. Bantouite is considered to result from the decomposition of labradorite, a felspar common in volcanic necks.

Sok and Turkana

During May and June a reconnaissance was made of Western Sok, Murto, and the area lying between Lodes and Murto to the size Range. The basement complex underlies most of Sok and builds up the imposing ranges of Chumara and Schere. Mass deposits have been found in these hills and the iron-silica horizon of the system occurs near Kachiba.

Gravel from the Kachibungu River yields more than seven "traces" of gold and the occurrence warrants investigation. Results in long-bladed crystals, forms an abundant constituent of the heavy mineral concentration from the gravel.

Arif Kerton

Numerous dry watercourses are crowded and the entire region presents a fine example of arid-erosion, as indicated by sheet-flooding. The uplands and slopes are everywhere an angular stony mass accumulating on the lower levels. From this finer particles are transported by wind down to the numerous fans of deposits forming the plain running from the Ngora northwards. Like the plateau, the depth of the waste varies, but over great stretches it constitutes nothing more than a coarse covering the thin-spread rocks of the basement complex.

During the rare storms, not only are the smaller courses quickly transformed into torrents, but the wide sand rivers, such as the Kapra and the Turkul, in which the depth of sand may reach twenty feet, are shown by the watercourses anastomosed by the rills, change into rapid. Over the plain, a broad, shallow sheet of running water may rise readily to spread over a great area—the sheet flood. Although the sheet flood may subside and disappear rapidly, its effect has been to carry forward in mass the

surface rock waste and this in the movement of the water.

In addition to the resistant masses of granite, gabbro and diorite, the rocks of the Trias-Noria series also form outcrops and some may be seen near of Lake Lake. Fine specimens of "Bantouite" were obtained in this formation.

Lodes Hill is formed of basalt but no tabular rocks are found between it and the Meruanyony Range, which lies to the north of the Longomuru River, although traces of basalt have been seen in the area.

The Murto Pass is cut through rocks of the basement complex, which comprise granite, gabbro, diorite, hornblende, schist, quartzite, and a good deal of quartz with occasional lenses of quartz for structural studies.

Collectors of gravel were made from twenty or thirty of the dry courses north of the Kapra River, from the Longomuru River, and from the Lodes Hill. One half of the concentration from these gravels contained traces of ranged gold and although no concentration was found, the results would constitute "alluvial" indications appear to be worth tracing.

The fine exposures in Turkana during November, the purpose being to examine the discovery of a "gold-bearing quartzite" near Bana. The "gold-bearing quartzite" was found to be a normal ferruginous quartzite through which, in a few scattered parts, a plasma of small quartz veins runs, but in the course of weathering and heavy identification, the residual gold has been distributed in false hopes of its value.

The occurrence was not considered to be of any importance.

Through the kindness of Mr. H. J. Wayland, Director of the Kenya Geological Survey, the author was enabled to pay a visit to the mining areas of South-west Sok, where accompanied by Mr. Wayland, he examined the alluvial tin-concentrations along the Kapra River and the Mairaha tin mine. The Kibindi copper mine was also visited through the courtesy of the General Manager of the Tanganyika Corporation Limited, Mr. G. Barnard.

Numerous rock and mineral specimens were collected for the Geological Museum in Nairobi and appreciation must be expressed for the extremely helpful attitude with which the Geological Survey met by Mr. Wayland and his assistant, Dr. K. A. Davis.

STRONG YUGO-SLAV CRITICISM OF FRENCH POLICE MEASURES

International complications are likely to result from the assassination of King Alexander of Yugo-Slavia and M. Barthou in Marseille on Tuesday afternoon. In Geneva it is believed that the outrage will have the effect of torpedoing the endeavours that were being made to bring about a rapprochement between Italy and Yugo-Slavia.

The people of Yugo-Slavia are writhing with grief, and the whole country has gone into deep mourning. Feelings of bitterness towards France are prevalent in many quarters as it is felt that the precautions taken by the French police were inadequate and that they were therefore largely to blame. The French press, while expressing horror and indignation at the occurrence, states that the murders were the work of one man whose political phobia was known.

King Peter, after the news of the tragedy had been broken to him, left his school in Surrey for the Yugo-Slavia Legation in London. Later he proceeded with his Grand-mother, Marie, to Paris, where they will be joined by the boy king's mother, Queen Marie of Yugo-Slavia.

Geneva Comment on Outlook

Genève, October 10. Women feared and soldiers who had fought under King Alexander in three wars, shook with sobbing when they learned the news of the King's death from the black-bordered newspapers this morning.

There are unpublished scenes of grief throughout the country. Muffled bells are tolling in the churches and in the streets. Flags are draped with black on the King's birth-day. All public buildings are closed guard.

The man who murdered the King, Petre Kolarovitch, was tried before a Court for the Defence of the Realm some months ago by the order of Dr. Neuberger, the Chief Minister of Agriculture, during the investigation, but his acquittal, although his behaviour was condemned as disgraceful and reprehensible, Kolarovitch belonged to a group of political refugees who were encouraged in Hungary. The police say his passport was kept.

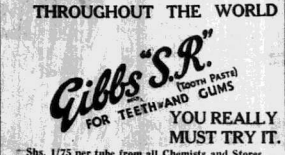

On Importations into Tanganyika

Proposals to Amend the Ordinance

An Ordinance to repeal and re-enact in expanded form the sugar consumption tax Ordinance, 1923, to be admitted to the Tanganyika Legislative Council is published in the current issue of the Tanganyika Official Gazette for general information. Its object and reasons are given as follows: "THE 1923 Ordinance was necessary for the purpose of safeguarding the revenue which an adjustment in regard to the importation of sugar manufactured in Kenya and Uganda and re-exporting to the territories and other countries, which provided for the first introduction of the sugar consumption tax Ordinance, 1923. Under this Ordinance a consumption tax of Sh. 9. per 100 pounds was imposed on all sugar imported from Kenya and Uganda. Arrangements are now being made by a local company for the production of sugar in the Northern Province and in view of the Customs Agreement it is proposed to amend the law in order to facilitate the importation of such sugar, including jaggery. Provision is made for the refund of the tax on sugar exported from the Territory. "The amendments necessary to give effect to the proposal and certain other minor requirements were such that it was considered advisable to repeal the original Ordinance and re-enact it in altered form. "Under the 1923 Ordinance the tax is charged as three shillings per one hundred pounds per cent. However, in the amended form the tax will be levied at the rate of three cents per pound."

MEALY BUG

Coffee Board and Measures of Control

(Continued from page 1.)

The urgent question of measures for the control of mealy bug continues to require the serious attention of the Coffee Board of Kenya and the Department of Agriculture. As explained in the Board's report to June 30, 1924, arrangements for that date tentative arrangements had been made between the Department of Agriculture and the Pathology Bureau Laboratories for the importation of parasites that may reasonably be expected to prove available in controlling mealy bug. These arrangements have now reached finality and supplies of the parasites are expected to arrive within a few weeks. The Department is making the necessary arrangements for their reception and the initial work required to establish them in their new habitat is in the hands of the Entomologist, Mr. Stobley. This parasite has proved successful in the control of the Citrus mealy bug in California; that all other methods of control have been rendered unnecessary but, as far as Kenya is concerned, it has yet to be proved that this parasite will find Citrus a suitable host. Until this has been proved parasites are advised to build no false hopes but some regard this as a first experiment in the introduction of parasite control. Control by predators (e.g. ladybirds) has, of course, been tried in the past and has only been partly successful. From the Board's "Monthly Bulletin."



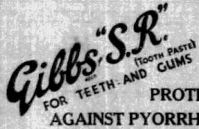

COSTS CONSIDERED EXCESSIVE
(Continued from p. 1.)

—and the Judges concurred with
him in this opinion—that the rela-
tive merits of the two were un-
derstood by the appellants were changed
was perfectly simple and clear,
and the question of law was
involved and the Town Clerk
ought not have proceeded the
course. However the Town Clerk
having elected to brief as assess-
ors, proceeding entirely upon the
basis—was necessary as assess-
ors.

The Judges continued: "It
must be borne in mind that the
award not costs is not to be used
as a method of punishment. If
a Magistrate is of the opinion that
an accused person by his conduct
merits or conducts in deserving of
more severe punishment, he should
award such punishment by an in-
creased fine or increased imprison-
ment as the case may be and not
by awarding increased costs."

Justice Hoon considered that
the cost awarded by the Magis-
trate was excessive. They ac-
cordingly ordered that they should
be reduced to 20/- each in the
two cases every a hearing was
"grossly" were tendered; in addi-
tion each of the appellants would
pay a further 20/- as Magistrate's
Costs. It was observed that
in each case the Magistrate had
charged exhibit fees. There was
no authority for the collection of
such fees in criminal matters and
the amounts collected under that
head were to be returned.

As the appellants had been
unsuccessfully, successful in their
appeal the Court considered they
were entitled to some costs. In
view of the fact that the appeal
was consolidated their Honours
were of the opinion that 50/-
would be a fair amount as
costs in the appeal and they
ordered accordingly.

Mr. A. M. P. Hutt has reverted
to his earlier appointment of
Assistant District Officer in Tan-
zania.

Indian Officers

Articles in the "East African Standard" and the "Nairobi Times," he said, had described what had been done to interest those officers of the Indian Army who in the near future would be retired, on pension. Several officers had visited Kenya this year, and had been favorably impressed with the opportunities offered by the Colony for residential retirement. Some had already bought land in readiness for making their homes, and the Government had been making inquiries in following up interviews several times during the tour of Colonel Raages in India, and it was now being raised, more tours, hotels, and so on to be made readily available at Bombay for all those who contemplated a visit to Kenya.

Land for Sale

Particulars of land for sale were collected and duplicate copies forwarded to the Land Office. To all people enquiring about land, lists of land agents were forwarded. Prospective purchasers were advised, and put in touch with land agents.

A register of those seeking employment was maintained, and although the Association naturally did not claim to be able to find these work, every effort was made to put them in touch with those who had jobs to offer.

Articles in the "East African Standard," he went on, had made reference to the work done by the Association on behalf of Government in making arrangements for the party of Public Schools now touring East Africa. This had involved the dispatch of a number of letters, as well as a number of personal interviews.

"The Association had undertaken on behalf of Government the redemption of various brochures, and work was now being completed on a new issue of "Kenya, Britain's Most Attractive Colony."

Finance

In spite of the depression the Kenya Association had been able to carry on its work for two years without an appeal to the general public. Due to the public-spirited action of the chairman, the Association was fortunate in having the use of its office and staff room at a nominal rent of Shs. 20.00 per month. Books, stationery and other expenses would cost Shs. 300.00 per month, and in this way the Association was being able to do its work.

New Members

The Bill requires that any person who intends to carry out excavation or surface operations for any of the objects listed in the schedule must be in possession of a permit obtained through the Colonial Secretary. Before issuing the permit, however, the Colonial Secretary must satisfy himself that the applicant is competent both by training and experience to carry out the excavation or excavation in accordance with the provisions of the Bill, and in his discretion, requires to be furnished with the appropriate technical support, financial and otherwise, of an archaeological or scientific society or institution of repute.

Reports

"In every permit issued there will be an implied undertaking on the part of the permit holder that he, or the institution which he represents, will, within a period of two years after the completion of the excavation or excavation authorized by the permit, deposit such longer period as the Colonial Secretary may in writing approve, as adequate security for the report or publication on the results of the excavation and/or conservation, as the case may be, and will deposit with the Governor his copies of such report or conservation."

"When a permit discloses any object of archaeological or scientific interest in the course of operations permitted by the permit, he must, without undue delay give notice of such discovery to the Colonial Secretary, who will also notify the Colonial Secretary."

An amendment to the Bill provides, with the sanction of the Governor, gardens or other areas of any monument.

If the Governor apprehends that a monument is in danger of being damaged, injured or allowed to fall into decay, he may direct the holder of the permit to take such steps as he may think fit under the provisions of the Indian Land Acquisition Act, 1924, as applied to the Colony, or to take such steps as he may think fit for the preservation of such monument from "public nuisance" within the meaning of that Act.

An authority may receive voluntary contributions for the purpose of the maintenance of a monument and may, subject to the approval of the Governor, give orders as to the management and application of such contributions.

Kenya's Plight
THE BURDEN OF LAWD KENTS OF THE FARMER

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—The Colonial Author's paper published in last week's edition of the "East African Standard" was interesting reading, and very especially that portion which dealt with the farmer.

When will Government realize that what these rents are unfair to most farmers, and quite impossible of payment under present conditions? Land rents should be put on a proper perspective basis, and should be made on their proper basis, if any. They should not be fixed on the basis of the White Highlands, nor that the latter Commission's ruling.

One notices that Government has recently handed over to the Nairobi Municipal Council, for instance, a most valuable plot free of any estate duties, and in a poor corner road. It is also interesting to find that the occupiers of the best coffee land are paying the equivalent rent of twenty shillings per annum for holdings equal in value to that on which they are paying anything up to two thousand shillings per annum.

To raise rent to the rent position in Laikipia the District was forced to order Settlements in 1919, when the rent was fixed at one per cent. This has position of farmers was such that Government very grudgingly accepted the terms (stated rents) in addition to the paid in 1945, and lowered the rent to five cents per acre from 1925-34, ten cents 1935-44, thereafter subject to variation on all other lands in the Colony.

Farmers who brought land to the Government auctions subsequent to 1925 are charged twenty cents per acre still. In most of these cases the land was acquired by "round off" existing holdings. On these days a bare living could be made off the reduced rent, though it was still so high a proportion of the farmer's overheads.

These rents were mainly paid up till 1930, but since then with the decline, drought, and the catastrophic drop in the value of everything we produce, it has been quite impossible to do so.

Government instead of helping farmers, has merely carried on with demand notes, adding penalties and finally recently threatened to put farmers in Court for their arrears. On this the District with the will help of our Blasted Member had a deputation received by the Land Advisory Board, from whom the deputation requested a Commission of Inquiry into rents. The Board, in spite of the fact that there is not a single stock farmer amongst its members, was most sympathetic, and it is understood made some recommendations to Government.

The only subsequent action by Government of which the writer and others know, is a registered letter from the Provincial Commissioner, Nairobi, received last week, in which the writer is told that the Government has decided to raise the rents to the level of the White Highlands. It would seem that the value of his life in a prolonged, severe, ungrateful struggle, from September 10 till January 29, three weeks after the food supply of Khartoum had been exhausted, appealed to the country, even more than his great administrative powers and unassuming bravery. To this fact we owe the establishment of an efficient medical service in the Sudan, and, indirectly, the discovery in 1917 of an improved and valuable cure for the plague of Africa, which has proved of economic importance amongst both man and sheep throughout the continent.

ROAD AND WEATHER REPORT
Mr. Galton-Fenzi writes as follows:—
Kenya and Tanganyika are still very dry and very parched, and the same can be said of Uganda, except that in certain parts there have been some thunderstorms which have freshened things up somewhat.

In Kenya the wettest place this week was Kisumu, where three heavy thunderstorms were there 3 inches of rain. The next is Kilifi with 1 1/2 inches, Mchinsoni Road with 1 1/2 inches, and Morbani and Sogoli with an inch each. To the coffee area in Kwana and Fort Hall there was a slight shower on Wednesday morning which wet the leaves, but hardly dampened the proportion. The position is still very serious and will be even more so when the short rains break in the near future. Personally, however, I feel much more cheerful about matters, as it really looks as if there may be some relief, and good stems breaking shortly. This would relieve the situation very greatly.
