## CORRESPONDENCE

### ECONOMIC ISSUES

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."  
Sir—The world's requirements for raw and manufactured material were never greater than at present set in the face of this prices were never lower and history has never known such stocks of unmarketable goods, much of which cannot be sold at their production cost.

The primary cause of this is the loss of the unit purchasing power, the only remedy is to make good this loss. To talk of increasing the cost of commodities while the masses are unable to purchase at present prices is ridiculous. Commodities can only rise when the unit purchasing power is reduced. The restriction of production of the most necessities commodities may create temporary relief by squeezing those who can pay for it at the same time it decreases purchasing capacity.

Employment production by machinery, labour saving devices, and the employment of millions of cheap female labour, competition by foreign countries, production under cheaper conditions etc., has resulted in a general reduction of the world's earnings returning to the masses, and without this rise is increased the present monetary, social, and economic systems of the most civilized countries are faced with collapse. Currency inflation and increased production are the only methods by which small countries relying on foreign markets can hope to remain solvent; this is not a remedy but relief only, relying upon inflation competition.

To regain an equitable balance there must be a general reduction in hours of work (female labour should be reduced more than that of male), and money must be kept to present or higher standards, money now used to pay debt should be used to subsidize industry showing a loss directly to increased wages, excessive wage cost, tariffs should be placed on all foreign imported goods to make their market price equal to home production, all goods always & not export prohibited industry should be placed on the State and have taxation should be placed on all foreign investments and profits from these. This would curb the international financier who while protected by the Empire uses his capital outside to give competition to our own. There being no check on international financier-civilized countries whose people are on higher living rates must be the first to suffer by the power of its worldwide exploitation. International finance involves the nation in international politics and calls upon the nation for its protection and it should pay heavily for this.

Unless a rapid readjustment is made to the present system of distribution—primarily monetary—for in this other distribution depends, they must inevitably be swept aside as their above is creating stagnation in the more civilized countries and keeping millions in misery and want.



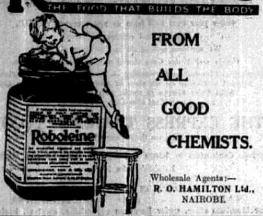

# NOTES FOR WIRELESS FANS

## The Milliampere Meter . . . . . How and when to use it.

SOME time ago I wrote of the useful indications as to the condition of valves and power supply which a small milliampere meter, connected so as to read the anode current, would give, presupposing that it had been incorporated in the design of the set. As, unfortunately, this fixture is rarely to be met with in commercial designs, instances have to rely on a separate instrument which is not all forms of receivers should possess.

Without such it is in much in the same position as a man who uses one on a long one journey without any of pressure gauge or speedometer and without any means of being able to measure the quantity of fuel in the tank. In fact, even commercial forms these little instruments have to be used to check voltage ranges which can be selected at will by connection to different terminals, e.g. 10 to 60 v. 0 to 10 or 10 to 50 volts and 0 to 200 or 250 volts distributed over the whole scale so as to give accurate readings of the lower voltages. There are in addition to readings of milliamperes up to 20 or 50, carrying these various scales of voltage readings as well as of course the usual scale of 0 to 100, as meter used as previously described and their capabilities are not at ways fully realized.

## Queries from Listeners

### FIFTY SHILLINGS WORTH OF ENTERTAINMENT

Individual Valves  
The purpose of the above note is to state to the L.T. the (1) the H.T. voltage with reasonable accuracy and the milliampere range, and the consumption of the whole set as well as that of each individual valve. A test of the total consumption can be made by breaking the H.T. negative lead and inserting the instrument in the gap, a test of each individual valve and the meter may be connected to the valves except the one which is to be tested as a wilderness. Another way of doing the same thing is not to bother about breaking the H.T. negative lead but to break the anode lead to the valve in question through the meter in a similar fashion. This method is simpler than the first but is not so accurate. It is a matter of preference. It is in view of the insulation provided not to break accidentally a contact which may easily be attended by disastrous results. It is therefore advisable to make up one's mind exactly which two points are to be touched and avoid all other metal portions like the chassis.

Tests of internal voltages are useful in that ascertaining a fault to have developed it does not by any means follow from the fact that the L.T. voltage is correct at all terminals of the set that it is read in each case and all of the filament pins on the valves. Provided the makers cards are available for the various valves a fairly accurate test of valve condition can be carried out by testing the consumption at given voltages up 100 volts either with a 200 or a small known C.B. voltage and comparing it

with the makers figure. Should the consumption be considerably more than this given, the valve should be replaced. A small little on to grid bias the test should be made as indicated as this fact is being understood as this may in itself damage the valve.

## Notes of the Week

### BRITISH BROADCASTING TAKES A STEP FORWARD

AS I have not done such a very great deal of listening during the week so that I am unable to say definitely whether it is the case on all wavebands there appears to have been a return to better conditions. That is to say that though the amount of static about does not seem to have decreased signal strength on the whole are better and static consequently not so disturbing. Signals from (SBE) however still rather quiet by it as well as, occasionally, by light fading and (SBE) suffers by comparison of signal strength with its close neighbors, the German and French Colonial Stations. As has been predicted the selectivity problem is becoming more acute and though (SBE) and (MID) are separated by the powerful 100 k/c. If the general signal strength of the latter is very much superior i.e. (which is not infrequently the case) and there is some fading about, with most sets, it is difficult to obtain the former quite free of interference.

On September 6 British Broadcasting took a very decided forward step with the inauguration of the new long wave transmitter at Pretoriusburg. In the future to be applicable to the S.W. situation as well, for the reduction of the number of stations while increasing their power. It is of no particular consequence to us, but it is very

definitely a notable achievement on the engineering side of broadcasting. This increase in power more than doubles the received strength in our district and it is estimated that the new station will serve 80 per cent. of the territory in the British Isles with a signal of considerably superior quality, at least in part, due to the employment of a new method of modulation known as the Mercator system of series modulation.

The new transmitter building, above which reach the 700 foot aerial mast, the highest previously used by the B.B.C. being a mere 500 feet, is situated on a level plain and contains the four 500 h.p. Diesel engines which are required to supply power to the new long wave transmitter and its medium wave sister, the midland Regional (150 kw). This method of obtaining power for the transmitter though not unique is interesting in that storage for 150 tons of fuel is provided, sufficient for both stations to radiate daily for the normal number of hours for a period of a month.

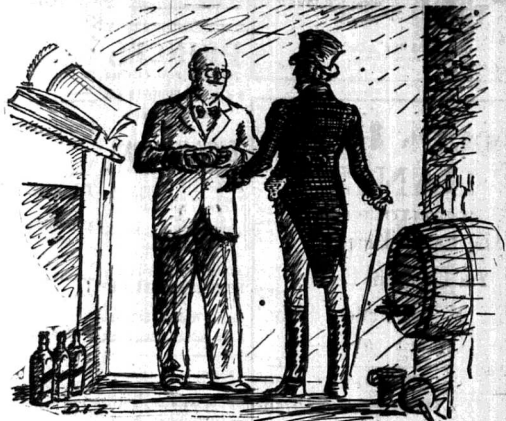

The Hon. Conway Harvey, Member for Nyanza, in a speech, seconded the motion, dealing principally with the question of mining leases, the importance of preserving land for the whittling down of the area of Kijungu township and the recommendations regarding the Masai, Nandi and Lumbwa.

#### Problems in Kivoro

The Hon. Conway Harvey (Nyanza) was the first speaker on Thursday when the debate on the report of the Legislative Council.

In seconding the motion proposed by the Hon. E. H. Wright, Mr. Harvey expressed his unqualified agreement with all that had been said by his colleagues, the Acting Leader of the Elected Members. ## London Newspaper Calls for Survey

## SORELY OPPRESSED PEOPLES CARRY HEAVY DEBT

£125,000,000 Total

The most interesting and significant reference to East African financial affairs that I have seen in a leading London newspaper for many weeks is a plain and informed statement by Mr. S. W. Alexander, City Editor of the "Daily Express," on the burden which the Colonies are carrying in the form of interest on loans.

### A CHANGED PICTURE

The "Daily Express" said on September 26— "While British Government stocks are rising and the home country and the Dominions have been able to obtain good relief by converting their debts to lower interest loans, the Colonial Empire is still being compelled to carry heavy debt burdens."

"Altogether, there is £125,000,000 of debt issued on behalf of the Colonial territories. The average interest rate is over 3 per cent. Several of the interest rates are 6 per cent.

"The weakness of the position is that, in many instances, the debts are not redeemable for several years.

"For instance, Kenya is paying six per cent. interest on a £5,000,000 loan which was originally made in 1914. The total Government debt is £1,000,000,000 of which £125,000,000 is not redeemable until 1945.

"All these high interest stocks stand at high prices in the market. The Kenya stock is quoted at £125 and the Gold Coast stock at £124.

"When these stocks would yield the rates of interest were doubtless paid and not difficult to meet because of the high prices of the commodities which are produced from the territories concerned.

"There is here a strong case for an analysis of the position by the Colonial Office, and possibly a consolidation of the whole Colonial Empire debt on a basis which would reduce the burden."

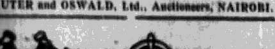

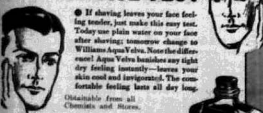

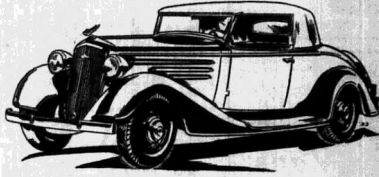

**Indian Opposition To White Highlands**

the tribe, as known to Europeans, might be said to encompass wide limits and the devoted band of Englishmen associated with him from 1906 to 1907. In the latter year he had received permission to form a trading company to open up roads between British East Africa and Abyssinia. In 1907 Marabiti was occupied by himself and his companions and they remained in occupation of that mountain until December, 1908. Marabiti in 1906 was inhabited, according to it was the headquarters of two nomadic tribes, the Rendile and the Samburu, who, although of totally different stock, lived together and used the same grounds. Both used the lake at Marabiti to water their herds.

Those were pre-Government days and by the time of the arrival of the Hon. Member and his friends was only possible by the goodwill of the local tribes. His friends made treaties or agreements with the chiefs of both tribes. He had no record of any spear-throwing murders during all the years he was there.

**Wanted Protection**

This was because the Samburu and Rendile were citizens and had been wanted the protection of the laws of British East Africa. The Administration continued to affirm its intention.

The two tribes were then arrested and their complaints were arranged to administer punishment for any breach of their treaties. Under the Gladstone-Cornell type of administration the Hon. Member and his friends was shown in the spear-throwing murders which were happening and a disgrace to any administration.

The point he wished to make was added, was to emphasize the essentially shifting nature of the tribes within the Northern Frontier Province—no tribe had ever, in history of recent times, been the least static anywhere in this large block of country. Nor was there in agreement with section 798 of the Constitution's report.

**Leroghi Plateau**

Turning to the question of the Leroghi Plateau, he said in order to come to a proper understanding of the grounds on which he chose Leroghi for white settlement, it is necessary to go back to the year 1907 when the Hon. Member was then Governor, and, after consultation with the Hon. member, he decided to try to move the Mau Mau into their reserved areas, in one territory, instead of in isolated groups, and under effective control of their powerful chief, Langa.

His policy had pointed out the benefits that would accrue to the Mau Mau if they were all placed in one reserve; the advantage of which was a reserve from an administrative point of view; and the advantage to white settlement in being able to extend without limit to the north. As compensation for moving he offered each headholder 20 per cent. more land than he held at the time and first right of any

land they chose to select in the north, which to the best of the Hon. Member's belief, included Leroghi.

**Breach of Faith**

"I can assure quite definitely," he declared, "and I am sure every settler who moved there at Sir Percy's request will agree with me, that we would have been more to be content later by Samburu. It happened that none of us above Leroghi as our own peopling land. I had very much in mind that this area would have been selected to us."

"I claim therefore that the proposal to allot Leroghi to the Samburu was a breach of faith to white settlers in this country in terms of Sir Percy's promise in 1907."

Continuing, he stated that he never suggested to the Hon. Member that the land which was now occupied by the Mau Mau, and therefore you must go back there, but that the area was now occupied by other tribes and had to be vacated to make room for the settlement of other tribes for such purpose.

**Weakest Part of Report**

Section 907 of the report, which dealt with this question, seemed to him to be the weakest part of the report, and there was not a single argument in it with which the Plebeian Members could agree. He stated, he agreed, started with the fact admission that Marabiti was in fact Samburu land when the Administration came, and went on to say without a single attempt at justification that Marabiti had since been occupied by other tribes and was therefore forfeit to the Samburu.

"But why?" he asked. "Who are these other tribes, whose did they come, and by what right do they usurp Samburu territory? We have a right to know all these things and also why the Commission neglected to enquire as to whether recommending that the Samburu should have Leroghi in Marabiti."

"The whole argument contained in section 907 is preposterous, and in contradiction with section 798, in which the Commissioner states the main reason for the Mau Mau in the Northern Frontier tribes, is both inconsistent and absurd."

**Overstocking**

On the subject of overstocking in the Native reserves, he said that this was a huge question and had repercussions in every branch and phase of Native life. When the present Council was elected on March 11 last, the Hon. Member, before, at their first meeting, decided, if possible, to come to a complete agreement among themselves on several matters, one of which was their policy as regards Native reserves and overstocking.

After considerable labour they arrived a common policy to which they could all subscribe, and this policy was duly recorded in a memorandum sent to the Economic Development Committee, prior to the publication of the Committee Report. That policy differed in no important detail from the policy laid down in the relevant section, section 209, of the Constitution Report, which he adequately expressed their views.

The main recommendation in section 2040 was that a committee be appointed to consider the question of overstocking in the Native reserves. The Hon. Member called upon Government to appoint a committee with reference to the Mau Mau and with terms of appointment as laid down by the Constitution.

**Trials Not to Blame**

Under normal conditions of life, the Mau Mau would have been brought out sufficiently well in the report. It was the wholly unscientific use of land by the stock tribes and the consequent necessity for doubling or tripling the amount allotted them to make good.

He instanced the Ngong Hill, where, he said, year in and year out, except in times of great drought, the large implanted mixed thousands of acres of grass continually sown for turning into hay, silage, and so on as an insurance against dry months were drought, was year in and year out it was allowed to seed, die down, and was burned off.

In conclusion, he declared that all that he had said, and all the agreement he had expressed with the vast majority of the findings of the Carter Report, rested on one factor—the factor of security in white settlement and in the Mau Mau. Without that security, and if Government attempted to tamper in any way with the full security offered white settlement in the report, all his remarks were of no avail and stood cancelled.
