Turning to the Standard, Major Cavendish-Bentley has informed that Cecil Hurst had succeeded in the temptation of adopting the tactics of a publicist, expert and of making a theoretical demonstration instead of taking any action on the arguments put forward during the debate or even on the evidence which had been adduced by the Commission.

Another Area Available
He informed the Hon. and Rev. Members that the European Estates Members were in contact and absolute agreement with the proposals laid down in paragraph 80 of the Report namely that the Commission should not support an application that because who could benefit on this to make better use of the land which had been given or more beneficially have it been given over to the natives for their use. The Alternative Area

The King refused to sanction the law unless the opinion of the people of Siam on the question was first obtained. As his demand was refused, His Majesty feels that he is no longer able to defend the rights and liberties of his people and that it would therefore be useless for him to remain on the throne.

In his presidential address at the opening of the Indian National Congress, Raja Rajendra Prasad vigorously attacked the British White Paper policy, the economic policy of the Government of India, and the communal award. 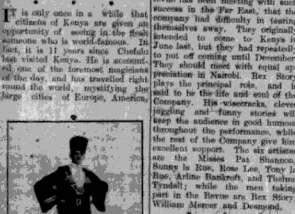

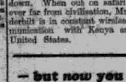

Chromium: Conditions are too dry for the later maize, but the earlier crop is looking healthy. The coffee crop is outstandingly the driest yet.

Argease and Yields
The total estimated argease of 1934 to be harvested in Kenya is 128,150; and the estimated yield, on the basis of 200 lbs. in 1000 sq. ft. The relative figures for wheat are 27,000 and 20,000 bushels respectively, and that there are 102,724 acres planted under maize. The yield is expected to total 115,000 tons.

Native Revenue
According to reports received from Agricultural Officers in Native reserves food supplies in practically all the Native areas are plentiful.

Below are given the principal crop features from the different districts where Native agriculture is carried on.

In the Kiisi District the bulk of the maize both in the reserve and in the coast strip has been harvested. A shortage is reported from some locations in the reserve. A considerable increase in the new under sowing is shown in the coast strip this year.

In the Malindi Sub-District reserves better maize crops than for some years have been obtained. With the exception of a few areas, the yields are good in the Machakos District, and there will be little available for export. The Pigeon Dro Cop, which is in process of being harvested, is yielding well and a considerable amount is being sold.

Nearly half the maize crop in the Fort Hall District had been harvested by the end of last month.

The maize yield in the South Syden District is satisfactory, and with greatly increased acreage a surplus of 6,000 bags would be obtained. The crop will be harvested during October.

Bean yields were below average. Good crops of potatoes were harvested in August, but there is only a very small demand.

WITHHOLDING WAGES

And Employment of Children at Kakamega

J. Franklin of the Free Synagogue, Kakamega, appeared at Kakamega on October 11 on a charge of withholding native wages. The accused was arrested on the 10th and was in court at 10 o'clock when the food arrived and it was not given to the accused until nearly an hour later.

The first witness in the case against Charles Singh was the Indian schoolboy, Abdul Ali, who gave dramatic evidence last week in the court case.

He said that some time after making a statement to the police in connection with the case he was approached by the accused of the case, who offered him 10 shillings to help him to get out of the country. He refused, but he intended to give in evidence before the court the statement he had made to the police. Then the accused and another man went to Mr. Phuka's house and from there they went to Mr. Mungu's house. He was told by the accused that next week he was going to see his Excellency the Governor and that he would be required to tell his Excellency that the police had given him money for making a statement. When they got to the house there was another man with him. Witness became afraid and asked them to take him back to his father.

The case is continuing.

A Letter from a Laborer

On September 24 at Lagorai, A. H. St. John, of the Kiisi Synagogue, was convicted on 31 charges of withholding the wages of his laborers. The amount of wages involved was Shs. 725.00. Fines were imposed amounting to Shs. 100.00, and in default of payment the sentence of imprisonment for 11 months. The accused was also ordered to pay costs amounting to Shs. 150.00, and in default to be further 147 days imprisonment. The Labor Officer, Kisumu, prosecuted in cases.
