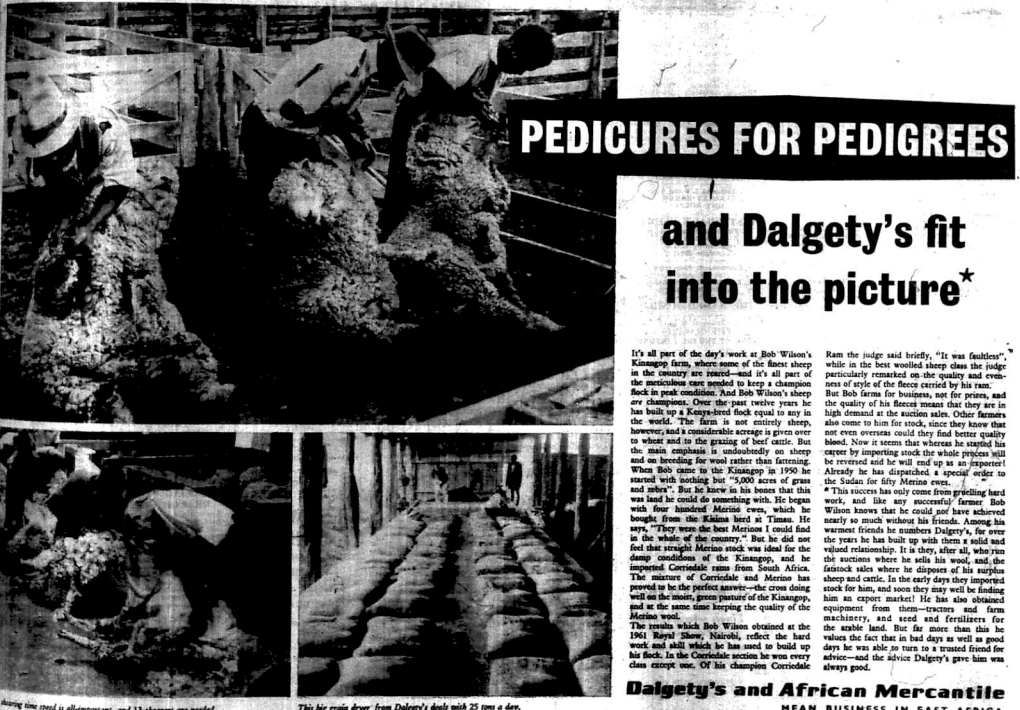

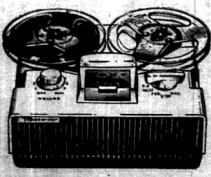

As the fighting continued Mr. Gizenga's men were supported by Lumumbist youths swinging bicycles and armed with spears, clubs and bows and arrows. A band of U.N. Ethiopian troops were moved to stop the pro-Leopoldville men.

A U.N. spokesman said that the Gizengists had murdered three pro-Leopoldville officers. There were also reports that a mutiny had been quelled at a local army camp.

The Prime Minister in the Congo Province, Mr. Abov, said in Leopoldville that he had ordered the Army Chief, Gen. Landu, to take all necessary measures to restore order in Stanleyville.

A U.N. spokesman said that U.N. headquarters had promised full military support to Gen. Landu against the rebels. Mr. Gizenga's home, set among wild tropical growth on the banks of the Congo river, offers perfect camouflage to the defenders against an advance from either the river or the river.

T.B.s put to flight of New Guinea

Commonwealth yesterday opened fire on Indonesian motor-transport columns in the northern West New Guinea, setting one afire, probably a second and putting the rest to flight, the Dutch news agency Hollandia correspondent reported last night.

It is the first reported outbreak of fighting between the Dutch and Indonesian naval forces since Indonesian soldiers landed on Dutch territory under the terms of the 1949 agreement.

A Defence Ministry spokesman in The Hague declined to say if the outbreak meant a state of war with Indonesia. He said details of the encounter, such as the strength of the Indonesian force, were not known.
