

THE NANDI ESCARPMENT ROAD PLAN

No date yet for start of work

ALTHOUGH Kenya Government is unable to say when construction on the Nandi Escarpment road will begin, when work starts plans and estimates will not complete.

The Kenya Legislative Council by the Acting Colonial Secretary, Mr. T. R. L. Preston, who presided over the debate, said the road could start and finish within two years.

Part of network

The Kenya Colonial Secretary said the network of the Colony road system had been increased by the Road Authority, which has been given the responsibility of construction and maintenance of roads.

Mr. Preston also said, in view of the large amount of traffic in the area, the Government had made an immediate decision as to the route of the road, and that public funds allocated to roads would be used to finance the scheme.

Colonial Secretary said that since the plan for the development of the area had been drawn up, there were five discussions and the first estimates made, very conservative, were based on the figures which had not been completed.

He said the first estimate was not prepared as the work had not been started, and the second had not been completed.

Decision held over

The whole question of the road regarding the completion of the road has been discussed by September.

Mr. Preston said that a decision should be made by the Road Authority, which would be able to answer the question of the date when the road would be opened to traffic.

The decision had, therefore, been brought to the notice of the Road Authority, and the relevant materials regarding the particular section of the road had been referred to the Colonial Secretary.

In this connection, the matter in question had been discussed by the Road Authority, and there was any difficulty in the Postmaster General's office in the Post Office, the date suggested in the question.

Canon W. H. Hillard dies in Australia

AFRICAN VIEWS ON DEVELOPMENT

Talks with Mr. Griffiths

DISCUSSIONS IN UGANDA ON TRADE AND CO-OPERATIVES

Uganda's State Paper reports that the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. James Griffiths, had "representations made to him by African leaders in the Northern Province and had also heard some account of the development and the hopes and aspirations of African growers of cotton and ground-nuts."

The point regarding economic development was made during talks Mr. Griffiths had with the standing committee of the Acholi African Government, who in a document presented to him for his perusal said that "the economic independence of the Acholi African Government could not be realised."

Mr. Griffiths heard the African growers' viewpoint on co-operation and trade and was told that there were over 70 Growers' Co-operatives Societies in Bugisu, and it was their aim to expand their activities and form a union in every county.

The spokesman of the growers told the Colonial Secretary: "We are anxious to get into the cotton this coming season and if the Protectorate Government will do what we ask, so we would be fit to start if given the lease for our executive use."

On questioning the Acholi documents, Mr. Griffiths said: "I would like to know what you have read in the documents, but I am not privy to them. We would quite like to have a copy of the documents." This was the acknowledgement that the Acholi African Government did not have political independence could not be realised.

Because of that the committee decided to discuss with him how to make representations to the Government, Northern Province, generally, about the economic development of the Acholi area.

The Governor told the Standing Committee that the main priority for the next few years must be to improve communications and make a road network available.

The Acholis had welcomed wireless and radio and had made significant progress in agriculture, but they thought further progress should be made.

They said that they were anxious that the Acholi African Government should be developed as quickly as possible. The Acholi African Government in the Northern Province education and health and they pleaded with Mr. Griffiths to give the Acholi African Government a fair share" of development in the Acholi area.

Mr. J. G. Hopkins (Abelante) said that the Acholi African Government would be "planted together" and that the Acholi African Government branches now making profits should be encouraged to increase the benefits of less prosperous areas.

It was agreed that the Acholi African Government should be allowed to continue to plant groundnuts on the tree crop areas.

Later he visited the educational institutions in the Acholi area and the training centre at Tuguru.

At the training centre Mr. Griffiths asked the question of the possibility of the extension of the local agricultural workers' scheme.

Mr. A. D. Colson, Assistant Under-Secretary of State, said that he had been in touch with Mr. Griffiths and with Mr. Griffiths had made a note of the Acholi African Government's request.







MR. GRIFFITHS FINISHES HIS TOUR

Statement in Commons soon
'CONFIDENT THAT EAST AFRICAN PROBLEMS WILL BE SOLVED'

Mr. JAMES GRIFFITHS, Secretary of State for the Colonies, has ended his tour of East Africa. Before leaving Nairobi by air on Saturday evening, Mr. Griffiths told reporters in Nairobi that he intended to present to a statement in the House of Commons on the political and constitutional problems on which he had had full discussions with Unofficial Members of the Legislative Council.

It was to be able to make a full statement in the House of Commons in the near future that he explained his reason for leaving Nairobi.

He said: "I am sure that it was possible to find a solution to the constitutional and political questions on the basis of co-operation between all races and all parties."

Paying tribute to the clear-cut increase in population, Government and objective way in which Uganda had used its natural resources to the maximum before him their vision and the co-operative spirit in which the people of Uganda approached the survey process.

Mr. Griffiths said the talk had been very valuable.

During his stay a large number of delegations from African organisations and from the Commonwealth countries had been presented to him, and he had had time to visit in each country every month, in order to give adequate consideration to the demands of questions that had been raised.

Helpful visit

"I am grateful to all who have been helpful to me in my efforts to assess them. I will study all the points seriously and hope to implement them," Mr. Griffiths promised again.

He also expressed gratitude for the many kind words he received everywhere and for the help given him by the people of the community. He was deeply conscious of the fact that his visit had been very short, nevertheless, he had been very helpful.

He said: "I have had a most useful background against which I believe problems can best be assessed. That comes before us in the Colonial Office."

Impressed'

The Colonial Secretary made these points:

"The atmosphere: "I visited Central and North Nyasaland and part of the Shire Highlands, in the Southern District, and there I saw something of the social, economic and cultural life, and the rural areas—particularly the important agricultural areas."


