Swift reprisal for Vietcong raids

America took swift reprisal yesterday for a Communist Vietcong attack on a U.S. Army headquarters and air base in South Vietnam which was the day which killed at least seven American servicemen and wounded 109 others.

An official statement in Saigon said military action was taken against installations in North Vietnam. The American action came as Mr. Averil Harrington, the Soviet Union, warned the United States against its war in North Vietnam. He has already provided a statement if the country were attacked.

Speaking at a news rally in Hanoi, he said: "The scheme to provision arms for the United States against the people of Vietnam." He called for U.S. withdrawal of troops from South Vietnam and for the American people to decide their own interest affairs.



Kenya's lead says Dr. Kiano U.S. missiles in Vietnam threatened

Kenya cut off trade with South Africa and Portugal some exports had been adversely affected, but outstanding example being soda ash, which exports were cut by 40 per cent; but she continued to be her duty to stand as a major of fundamental importance to the continent of Africa, including South Africa had been expanding faster than any other trade taken as a whole, though it was a small proportion of total trade.



Communist barracks hit in two strikes

More than 180 U.S. Navy jets and South Vietnamese planes made two strikes on military targets in Communist North Vietnam and three U.S. Navy jets were shot down, a U.S. military spokesman announced.

More than 180 U.S. Navy jet fighters based on aircraft carriers steaming in the South China Sea raided a military barracks area in Chanh Hoa, about 130 miles north of the 17th Parallel, dividing line between North and South Vietnam.

The spokesman said the second strike was made by 28 U.S. Air Force F-105 Super Sabres and F-106 Thunderchiefs, with an equal number of South Vietnamese Skyhawks, on three barracks area at Chap Lu, near the 17th Parallel. They struck one and a half hours after the raid by the carrier aircraft.

Carrier planes shot down

Three of the U.S. Navy planes were shot down because they were forced to fly low by cloud. None of the Vietnamese or American planes in the second wave were downed, although six Vietnamese Skyhawks were damaged by anti-aircraft fire.
