

UGANDA REPELS CONGO U.S. BORDER ATTEMPTS: PRESIDENT GIVES FIRE EXCHANGED

Uganda troops violated Uganda's borders at two points in Uganda on Tuesday, the Minister of Internal Affairs, Mr. [Name], said in a statement yesterday. In both cases they were driven back, he added.

LONG-PLANNED BOMBING Children wounded, says Minister

A number of children are reported to have been injured when Government planes bombed a primary school near Nyagata, Congo, last night.

News of the bombing was announced by Uganda's Minister of Internal Affairs, Mr. Felix Omondi, who interrupted Parliament in Kampala to make the following announcement: "I have received a report from West Nile that a school situated near Nyagata Primary School was bombed by Government planes at 7 p.m. today and that children have been injured. The Minister of Education has been assigned to investigate the incident and to instruct the necessary action to be taken."

Last night, Mr. Omondi said he was waiting for further details of the incident but that undamaged classes were in progress when the bombing occurred. This was the second bombing incident in nine days. On Feb. 13, Congolese bombers were reported to have attacked the border villages of Gulu and Pasha in Uganda. On Friday, Mr. Omondi gave all Uganda troops in the Congo 24 hours to leave. The Uganda Prime Minister, Mr. Obote, later stated that there were any Uganda forces in the Congo.

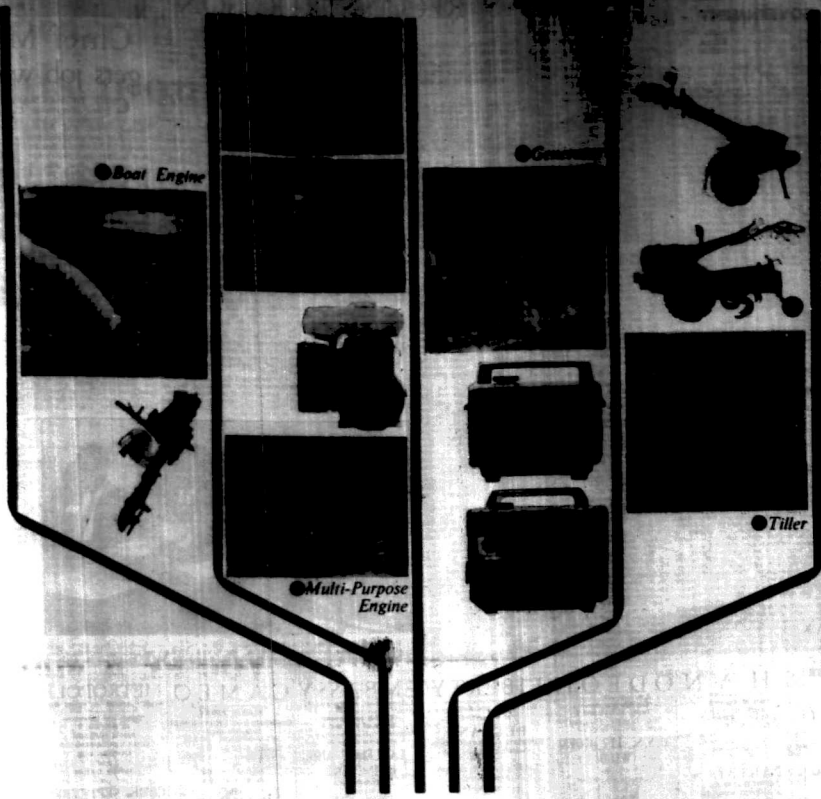

Family housing plans outlined by Minister

Minister for Housing, Mr. O'Rourke, at a breakfast held by the Housing Club at the University College in Dublin last night, outlined his plans for family housing.

The Minister said it was urgent to improve the standard of housing, particularly in the urban areas where the greatest pressure was placed on rental housing, but with more families becoming more concentrated in towns, there had lately been more concentration on local purchases.

It was essential to allow landlords, the opportunity of raising their own houses, rather than paying rent year after year, housing directly, or indirectly, to the best type of housing.

Pointing out that funds were limited, he suggested as a self-help move the initiation of Housing Action Committees which could be one of their monthly subsidies and in time be converted into a permanent basis. Local business could be formed by forming their own savings societies which would deal with the Ministry.

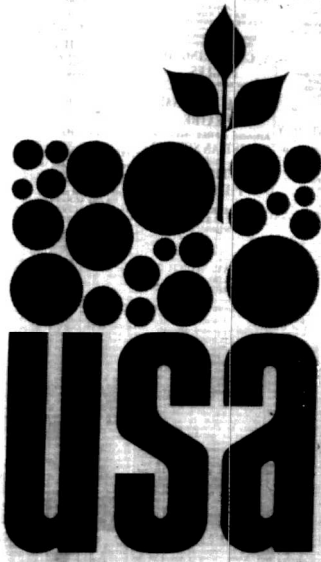

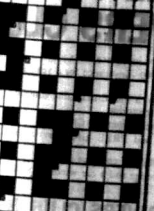
