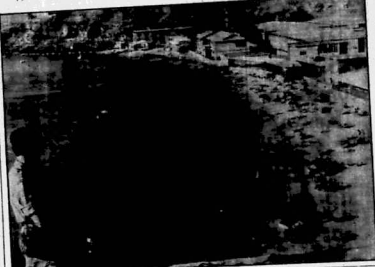

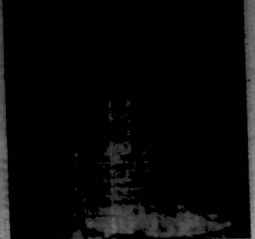

HEAVY U.S. COLL IN VIETNAM East boycotts wounded in a week key talks in Nigeria

UNITED STATES troops suffered their second-highest weekly casualties of the Vietnam war during the seven days ending on Saturday, the U.S. Command in Saigon announced yesterday. America's only eight fewer than the battles in November, 1965, along the X Drang Valley in the Central Highlands.

This announcement came soon after Vietcong guerrillas flung grenades and carrying explosives overran a U.S. platoon in the Central Coastal Highlands, killing 13 Americans and wounding 21.

The U.S. Command said 1,381 men were wounded last week as American troops bore a series of drops into Vietcong-held areas and U.S. Marines were involved in bitter fighting just south of the North Vietnamese border.

COMMON MARKETS

TALKS MAY BE RESUMED soon between East African countries and the European Economic Community, a statement has been issued from the E.E.C. by a spokesman.

Representatives of the Six nations in the European common market resumed talks with East African representatives last November when the East Africans refused to accept a tariff preference schedule discriminating against their established trade rights. However, the East African representatives, under the leadership of the late Mr. J. M. Nyerere, Minister for Commerce, returned to London to resume talks on a tariff preference schedule in the European market.

The British Prime Minister has recently seen East African representatives in London and has expressed his interest in the outcome. It is expected that Mr. Demasi said it would be a good idea to resume the special tariff preference which would meet the needs of the East African countries.

Britain does not benefit from any tariff preferences in East Africa when the talks were resumed last November. It was felt that the East African countries in return for preference offered in European markets, should be given a similar preference in the Commonwealth trading arrangement, and also that the Commonwealth tariff preference should be extended to the East African countries.

Associate membership of the European market is desired by the East African countries as the first step in an agreement with the E.E.C. and Nigeria. This is entirely in line with the Youngs Convention under which the Six and their associated States have set up a free trade area.

East African Economic Charter

A message from Brussels indicates that E.E.C. member countries are prepared for a resumption of negotiations with East Africa for the purpose of a free trade area. The E.E.C. Commission is currently occupied with an application for association from North Africa.

After the consideration which has gone into the subject in East Africa, it is believed that the E.E.C. Commission will be asked to issue a mandate at the resumed talks to allow the E.E.C.
