RUSSIAN ATTACKS GO ON UNABATED

But Finns Holding Their Own On Karelian Isthmus

Russian attacks on the Mannerheim Line on the Karelian Isthmus continue unabated despite the fact that they have suffered several reverses. The attacks are likely to continue for some time as Russian reinforcements have been brought up during the past few days.

War in the air goes on and Russian bombers made widespread raids on south-west Finland again on Sunday, Finnish aircraft established by bombing Russian troop concentrations at air bases in Estonia.

Russian bombers yesterday once again their widespread raids on south-west Finland, the latest report states that a further six civilians were killed and there were also reports of attacks on Viborg, but Helsinki escaped. A number of attacks were made on Ostankova, south of Lake Ladoga, which was destroyed. Many bombs were dropped on a hospital near the railway station, killing about 20 people. Also was bombed the 77th time. A wing of the university building was hit but there were no casualties. Many of the raiders in the last few days are believed to have taken their way across the Gulf of Finland from the new Russian bases in Estonia, and it is reported that Finnish aircraft made several attacks on these bases.

More Turkish Quakes: 45 People Killed

The centre of the disastrous Turkish earthquake in Samsat was badly shaken again by a strong aftershock on Saturday night, when 45 people were killed, many badly injured and many houses completely destroyed. There have been daily tremors since the great shock on the 26th and 27th, and in the past few days there have been more frequent and steadily stronger. (Reuter.)

bombing Russian troop concentrations at the air bases in Estonia. Five Russian aircraft were seen coming down on the ice on the Gulf of Finland near the Finnish coast yesterday and they were all shot while still in the air. The results were about 17 and carried a large quantity of explosives.

500 Bombs on Viborg

There are more details of Saturday's raid. More than 500 bombs were dropped on the town, which was badly damaged and many are buried. Direct hits numbered 130, and the main force of the raid was directed on the Cathedral, on four banks and on the town. Fortunately 85 per cent of the population had been evacuated and only 10 people were killed.

Russian attacks on the Mannerheim Line have continued throughout yesterday. Soviet troops advanced to the Finnish positions, supported by tanks, but failed to take the Finnish positions. The Finns claim that 3,000 Russians were killed, and that the heaviest fighting was in the neighbourhood of the barbed wire entanglements. In spite of these claims, the attacks are likely to continue as Russian reinforcements have been brought up.

Suede Decried

The first Swedish volunteers, Oskar Hansson, to be decorated by the Government of Finland have been given the Order of the Finnish Cross of Freedom, according to a Stockholm newspaper report.

Further contribution of 500,000 was made yesterday to the Finnish Red Cross research hospital.

The fact that all sections of the Finnish people are united in the fight against Russia, has been affirmed once again, this time by the President of the Finnish Government, Trade Unions. He said that the aim of the Finnish Government is to bring about a Russian invasion had no connection with the objects of the Trade Union Movement. Thousands of members of that Movement in Finland had taken to arms and gone to the front. Finest War Council Meeting

"Harmony Was Complete" Says M. Daladier

Paris, Feb. 6. The biggest gathering of Allied War Council met for the fifth time. Chamberlain headed a strong British delegation which included Lord Halifax, the Foreign Secretary, Churchill, First Lord of the Admiralty, Sir Olive Stanley Secretary for War, Sir Kingsley Wood, Secretary for Air, General Sir Edmund Trousdale, Chief of Staff, Admiral Sir Dudley Pound, Chief of the Navy Staff, Sir Ronald Campbell, Sir Alexander Cadogan, Air Marshal Pease and Major General Lyall.

Death Sentence for Ration Card Offence in Germany

Berlin, Feb. 6. The death sentence has been imposed in Germany for charges of granting ration cards unlawfully. In East Prussia 28 men of whom eight were Municipal officials, were tried for giving or receiving ration cards against the law. One official was sentenced to death and 27 others received terms of years varying from three months to five years. Everything from soap to clothes is rationed in Germany, but even such simple necessities as soap are scarce with ration cards cannot be sure that the shops will have any stock of what they want.

The ship was only slightly damaged. A Finnish ship was sunk on the coast northwards through the middle of southern Finland. Also bombed and two persons were killed.

Rare Hot Baths

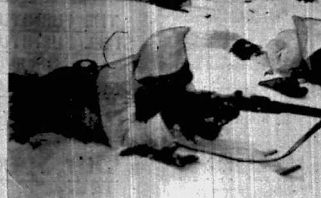

New Zealand Celebrates Centenary

February 6. The ceremony of signing the 1840 Treaty of Waitangi, whereby the New Zealand Maori accepted British sovereignty, was re-enacted in its original setting at a great Maori gathering at Waitangi today, and formed part of the New Zealand centenary celebrations.

The Dominion Secretary, Mr. Joseph Eden, who was in Auckland and his party returned from the King, and from several foreign countries.

MAGINOT LINE HAS THREE LINES Cost As Much As 100 Battleships

France has now six and a half million men under arms. This figure was given last night by a member of the French Military Mission in present Britain. He said that five million soldiers were at their posts within a few days after mobilisation.

He also declared that a tremendous amount of work had been carried out on the Maginot Line since the war began. It now consisted, not of one line, but of three, and in front of the main line was a vast network of wire—10,000 miles of it—linking observation posts and pill-boxes.

This officer estimated that the Maginot Line had cost as much as 100 battleships of 30,000 tons type and he expressed the view that the Line could never be captured.

He said the Germans had no shells which could make an impression on it and there were machine guns on top of the Line and also commanding the corridors inside—(Reuter).

END OF AN INCIDENT Conference At The Hague Triumph Of Compromise

On Economic And Social Activities Of League

The correspondence between the British and Japanese Governments regarding the Asama Pass incident was published on Tuesday night in the form of a White Paper and was issued simultaneously in Tokyo.

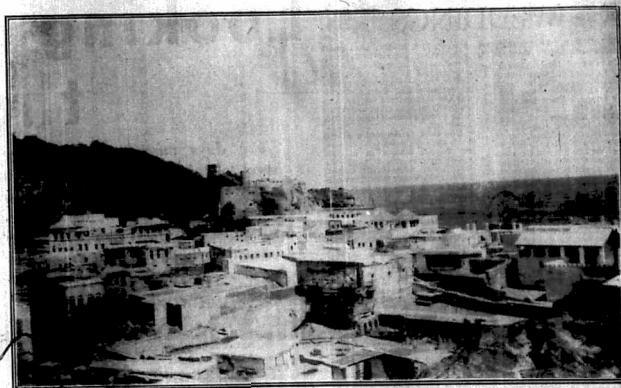

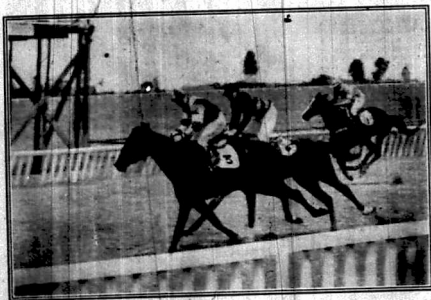

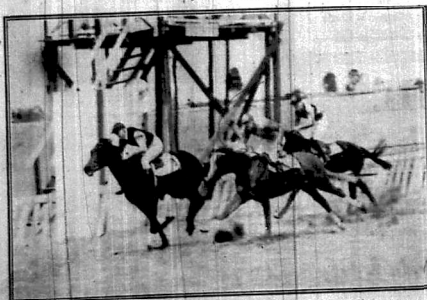

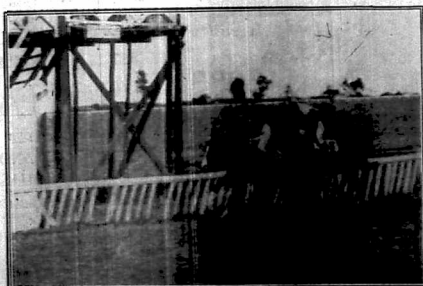
