The War and Local Problems

One of the main objects of the Bill gives powers to facilitate the carrying out of certain kinds of land drainage which are essential to the success of the food production campaign. Both gardeners and small farmers will be helped to grow more food. Gardeners will be able to obtain lime at half-price and basic slag at a 25 per cent reduction. Who's the money to do so, they will provide him with fertilisers and seeds and even do his ploughing up and reimburse themselves after his produce has been sold.

DOGGED DOES IT

Nel Tarleton's Great Record

['STANDARD' CORRESPONDENT] London, February 6.—Nel Tarleton, of Liverpool, set two new British records in his recent fight when, at 24 years of age, he outpointed the holder, Johnny Cusick of Manchester, in 15 rounds both fought at the Liverpool Fishmarket Boxing and British Championship.

It was a remarkable feat of persistence and doggedness. The records created by Tarleton, who has also been in management and has risen to do with the success of Ernie Roderick, the waterweight British title twice and being the oldest boxer ever to hold a British championship. Tarleton's ringcraft and skill were outstanding in a bout which was not notable for heavy punching or the little boom or two which produced some excellent boxing. The crowd, not slow to appreciate the gameness of Tarleton, showed almost continuously an approving 15 years to the holder of the title, he gave Cusick a beating home and once almost secured a knockout.

A Memorable Round. This was during the course of a memorable sixth round during which Tarleton landed a beautiful straight left to Cusick's jaw which followed up with a perfectly timed right cross. The blow knocked Cusick to his knees and he was too dazed to rise until the count of eight. His youth and condition, however, enabled him to weather the round, as Tarleton used his seven boxing minutes and his old skill and, against the natural inclination at such a time, recovered himself for the effort he knew would be required for the closing stages of the fight.

Throughout the fight Tarleton boxed with precision and power and the innocent use of a hard and accurate left hand had Cusick bleeding from the nose as early as the second round. It was, however, in the twelfth round that Tarleton displayed to a high degree the stamina and generosity which have served him in a title he first held over nine years ago. Cusick shook the overpowered fighter with a heavy right cross to the jaw, but Tarleton recovered gamely and came back to win the last three rounds in a manner which would have done credit to a much younger man.

A crowd of 7,500 saw the fight. Afterwards Tarleton said: "It was a great fight, and I fought just as I wanted to do. I knew if I could stay the distance I could win." Cusick said: "I was beaten by a much better man tonight—perhaps one of the greatest boxers this country has ever seen. I hope Tarleton keeps the title for a long time. As for me, I have finished with the featherweight, and in future I will fight in the lightweight division."

Mr. Eugene Henderson, of Leith, arrived two late to referee the fight, and Mr. W. Barrington Dalry, who was to have helped in a broadcast, officiated instead.

In a supporting bout Arthur Davidson (Bristol) fought Ken Robinson (Manchester) in the fifth round of a welterweight fight. The contest being stopped after Robinson had clearly shown his superiority.

An Impressive Record. It is not often that a boxing record holds so well on paper as it is in fact, but Tarleton's is an exception to this rule.

His first came into the limelight in the second decade after the war and showed something of his talent when he fought a draw with the

VIOLATION OF NORWAY'S TERRITORIAL WATERS: STRONG PROTESTS

OF THE MOST DARING EXPLOITS OF THE WAR AND MORE THAN EVER IN ACCORDANCE WITH "SEA WAR IN THE OLD STYLE" HAS RESULTED IN OVER 300 BRITISH SEAMEN, PRISONERS ON A SUPPLY SHIP OF THE GRAY SEAL BEING RESCUED BY BRITISH WARSHIPS IN NORWEGIAN TERRITORIAL WATERS.

The German ship, the *Altmark*, armed with pom-pom guns and machine-guns, took refuge in a Norwegian fjord, amidst protests from British and Norwegian authorities following, after which the Admiralty ordered the cruiser, *Cossack*, to enter the fjord and rescue the British prisoners.

The seamen were taken off the *Altmark*, which went aground, and were landed on Saturday at a Scottish port.

Norway has strongly protested against the violation of her territorial waters, but it is pointed out in London that the German ship obtained permission under false pretences to use the territorial waters, and if she had been allowed to pass through them it would have been an un-neutral act. The action of His Majesty's ships was taken with the full approval of Government.

Germany, of course, has strongly protested to Norway stating that she takes the most serious view possible of the incident, which is one of that may have the gravest consequences.

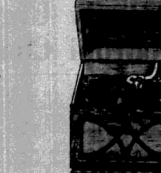

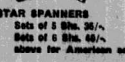

Mr. A. C. Cassell returned to the difficulty of servicing agricultural machinery and of obtaining spare parts for essential implements. GERMAN SHIPS FATED IN HER AS THE BRITAIN'S STRONG PROTEST TO OSLO

Demand For Internment Of Altmak GERMAN ANGER

Foreign Office statement reveals the gist of the strong representations made by Lord Halifax to the Norwegian Minister in London over the Altmak incident.

The Foreign Secretary complained of the failure of the Norwegian authorities to establish the presence of British prisoners on the German ship and the Minister has been asked as a matter of urgency to obtain from his Government an explanation of this failure.

The British Government has expressed the view that Norway in this matter has failed in her duty as a neutral State.

In view of all the circumstances the British Government is pressing for the internment of the Altmak. The vessel is still around and is being guarded by Norwegians.

The Altmak incident has attracted attention throughout the world, and the need for a more effective international law has been expressed by several States, while Germany's reply has been regarded as one of the most arrogant and un-British press and radio discourses.

The outline of a communication made to the Norwegian Minister in London on Saturday by Lord Halifax, the Foreign Secretary, was published on Sunday night. It complained that the way the Norwegian authorities had sought to establish the presence of British prisoners on the German ship was inadequate and that the British Government is pressing for the internment of the Altmak.

Nanning is considered of special strategic importance because the railway line connecting French Indo-China with Southern China runs through the city.

The military situation, said the War Minister, "has turned definitely in our favour and a Chinese victory is now assured."—(Ruter).

10,000 Italians Will Fight For Finland

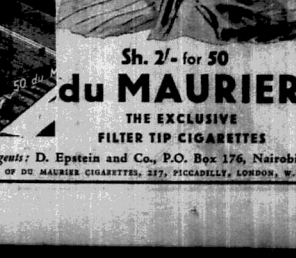
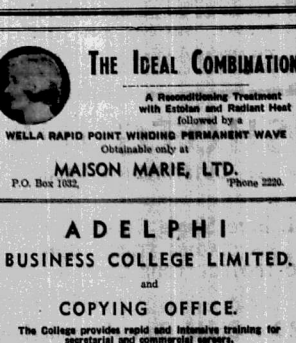

British Government's Ten-Year Plan

DEPENDENCIES ASK TO MAKE LONG RANGE PROPOSALS TO LONDON

ANNUAL HALF MILLION FOR RESEARCH

WHITE PAPER WAS PUBLISHED IN LONDON ON TUESDAY AFTERNOON SETTING OUT DETAILS OF AN IMPROVED DEVELOPMENT IN BRITISH COLONIAL POLICY.

A summary of the White Paper was issued to the East African Standard by the Kenya Government last evening. The main points are:

1. Replacement of the Colonial Development Fund (which is limited to a million pounds a year) by a new scheme providing grants totalling a maximum of £25,000,000 a year for 10 years.
2. A maximum grant of £500,000 a year for research.
3. An invitation to all Colonial Governments to submit development programmes for a period of some years ahead.
4. The creation in London of a Colonial Development and Welfare Advisory Committee to assist the British Government in planning expenditure from these new sources. It will include unofficial members.

The following is a summary of the main points of a statement by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, on the subject of the new Colonial Development Fund.

1. The statement begins with a reference to the Royal Commission which are being published annually. It is pointed out that the Royal Commission is being taken forward in particular the Government "accepts in principle the important proposals which should be a central feature of the plan provided for by a Commission of high qualifications planning in consultation with the administration concerning the further development of welfare services in the West Indies. They also accept the proposal for the appointment of an Imperial Council to advise the Secretary of State for the West Indies. The necessary funds will be provided under the proposals set out below. A further statement on the other complementary work with the West Indian Governments has been concluded in the meantime a special sum of £200,000 is being provided for such schemes as can be begun immediately.

2. While the Royal Commission has examined the position in the West Indies, the Government has estimated the position in other Colonies and has decided to announce the policy on the broad lines of the statement above. Through the unhappy circumstances of the war, the rate of advance of the Government has been delayed and their policy of development as far as possible in the "emergency permit".

3. His Majesty's Government are to be the mainstay of the welfare of the inhabitants of the Colonies. Armaments Expansion

THOUSANDS UNDER TRAINING

London, February 20. Eight thousand men are now being trained in Britain to fill vacancies in the engineering industry to meet the expansion of the armaments industry. Every employment exchange has been instructed by the Ministry of Labour to select men with an aptitude to learn a new trade. They are to be given instructions in practical engineering in 14 Government training schools, established some years ago to relieve unemployment in distressed areas.

On this occasion the age limit of 30 has been extended to 40 to meet the demand of the armaments industry and many more men are still recruited.

The scheme is welcomed by the newspapers this morning but suggestions are put forward that it might be made even wider in its scope. The Times suggests it should include not only the armaments industry but also men engaged in non-metallurgical work. It is important that to ensure that none of the training benefits is "lost" through unemployment.

"U.S. Drifting Towards War"

1,000,000 Tons of Shipping Lost

London, Feb. 20. Twenty merchant ships were lost as a result of enemy action during the week ending midnight on Sunday. This is the largest total for any single week since the war started. As usual, the neutral vessels were the main victims.

Admiralty figures issued today show that 15 ships belonging to British losses were five ships, totaling 20,000 tons.

The week's losses bring losses since the outbreak of the war to 1,000,000 tons. That is a very large amount, especially when it is considered that the period of uncut losses was experienced in 1937 when the shipping was nearly 200,000 tons in one month and averaged 100,000 tons a week.

Thirteen of the neutral vessels were lost, and six of these were lost to U-boats without a trace. The remaining seven were lost in copy-it struck a mine.

SWEDEN AND FINLAND DIVISION BEATEN

King's Statement

Brilliant Work By The Finns

February 20. King Gustaf of Sweden yesterday issued a statement, endorsing the action of the Swedish Government in refusing Finland's appeal for direct aid. After expressing the greatest admiration for the fight being fought by "our brothers in Finland" against overwhelming odds, he said that Sweden had tried to help in many other ways, but had decided that they must adhere to the decision not to give direct aid. Sweden might have drawn into war with the Great Powers.

The King's statement adds that in each event it might become impossible for Sweden to give Finland even the help she is now receiving. His statement concludes by expressing his sincere hope that the Swedish people will understand and approve his attitude.

The Swedish Government's decision not to give military aid to Finland has been widely criticized by Finnish newspapers and public speakers.

SERVICE ESTIMATES TO BE SECRET

February 20. The Government has decided to publish during the war the amount spent on the Services and a number of other items.

The Naval estimates, published yesterday, showed a total of £100 million for the year 1940-41. The estimates for the Army and the Royal Air Force will be published in the next few days.

Foreign Minister's Account of Altmark Incident

MR. CHAMBERLAIN'S REPLY

While the violation of Norwegian neutrality in connection with the Altmark incident was deplored by the Norwegian Parliament, the hope was expressed that the incident would not weaken the ancient friendship between Britain and Norway.

The Norwegian Foreign Minister in a statement on Monday night said that not only at a Norwegian port but was stopped by a Norwegian warship in territorial waters. The Norwegian captain was then satisfied that the Altmark was what she purported to be and did not know the ship had British prisoners on board.

It was stated Lord Halifax had admitted to the Norwegian Minister in London that Britain had committed a technical breach of Norway's neutrality but had argued that this was little or nothing because the fact that the Germans kept 300 or 400 prisoners aboard the Altmark in conditions worse than those in which a dog would be kept.

Mr. Chamberlain said that the Altmark incident was a violation of the League of Nations and that the Government would be glad to see the League of Nations take any action which would be in accordance with the League's principles.

He then indicated that Norway might appeal to the League of Nations or to another international court, but in any case, he felt that the League of Nations should take any action which would be in accordance with the League's principles.

The Foreign Minister said that British warships had committed a grave act of Norwegian neutrality by intercepting the Altmark. He said that the British authorities did not know that there were British prisoners on board the Altmark, but that as a special service which must be rendered to a warship which is in contact with international law, it was the duty of the British authorities to take any action which would be in accordance with the League's principles.

K.C.C.'s Decision At Nakuru Meeting

Members of the Kenya Co-operative Creamery, at an extraordinary general meeting held to discuss the question of participation in the pig industry decided:

That the K.C.C. should assume some limited financial responsibility up to a maximum of £5,000 in the formation of a separate or subsidiary company to deal with the industry;

That a co-operative bacon factory with equal shareholding of the K.F.A. and K.C.C. should be formed.

An extraordinary general meeting of the Kenya Co-operative Creamery Limited was held at the Nakuru Hotel last Friday and was attended by nearly 90 people, including Mr. R. Dabney, Director of Veterinary Services, Major F. W. Cavendish-Bentinck, and other members of the Colony Government.

The Chairman called upon Mr. Dabney to address the meeting. He said that before the war the pig industry in the Colony was in a state of stagnation and that it was necessary to develop the pig industry in order to meet the needs of the Colony.

The Chairman stated that he had had a number of discussions with the Settlement and Production Board and that the Board had considered the question of pig raising in the Colony. He believed, however, that the Government should co-operate in getting the business going by the formation of a separate company.

Mr. F. W. Cavendish-Bentinck proposed the following resolution:—

(1) That the future development of the pig industry in the Colony should be on a co-operative basis;

(2) That the K.C.C. as such should assume some limited financial responsibility up to a maximum of £5,000 in the formation of a separate or subsidiary company to deal with the industry;

(3) That a co-operative bacon factory with equal shareholding of the K.F.A. and K.C.C. should be formed.

The resolution was carried by a large majority. The Chairman then declared the matter open for discussion.

E. AFRICAN INTERNAL AIR SERVICES

Fare-Paying Passengers Cannot Be Accepted

Kenya Movement Rallied To The Call

Sir Percy Ferrier's broadcast call on "Scouting in Wartime" from the B.B.C. on Monday's night coincided most opportunely with the preparation of a report by the Kenya Scout Council on what has been done in the Colony since last year.

Although war has not come to Kenya in the direct sense, the Scout movement has rallied to the call for unimpaired personal and communal service, as well as to the call for an active part in the Empire.

As early as April 1939 the Kenya Scout Council under the Chairmanship of Sir H. G. Gurnea, Chief Scout of the Colony, decided to participate in the Colony's war service programme, and all secretaries of District Scout Associations were asked to submit a full list of all members of the movement in their areas. It was made clear that there was no desire in "Mother Joy" for Scouts, but to utilize the Scout organization in the fitting of actual war services.

As a general rule, all members of school troops "worked" with their respective school A.R.P. organizations, and in many cases, they were already aware of war work out during their school days, and were encouraged to get into immediate touch with their local authorities.

Indian Scouts of the newly-constituted 10th Mountain Group undertook full courses in first aid and artificial respiration, and a number of their members were appointed as first aiders in the G.O. War Service organization, with the Commission of Police.

Airman Two

Practically every Scout, Rover and Scouter in the Ukamba district volunteered for air service, that might be required. Signallers there were nearly 50 of them among the volunteers, were selected as being especially useful in the area. Special action was arranged by each A.R.P. Signaller, and in a very short time a high standard of efficiency was reached in Morse transmission by flag, radio, lantern, and lamp.

Ninety-three European, Indian and African Scouts reported in the Scout District Commissioner at Nairobi in response to his broadcast appeal for Scouts. Sixty-three were at once posted to various jobs such as A.R.P. signallers, dispatch riders, and in various capacities with F.F.A., the R.F.C., and the Nairobi D.C.'s office, with many a practical demonstration or examination in A.R.P. or first aid, was made possible by the passive assistance of Boy Scouts' Patrols.

Many of the African volunteers, who were trained in Nairobi on the field, as Lumini, and on being inducted in to their respective local D.C.'s, as being the most practical way of utilizing their enthusiasm, walked back again the same day.

War Service

War service within the movement itself has been undertaken by ten volunteers who responded to Lord Baden-Powell's personal broadcast call to "fill up the gaps" in the ranks of Scouts, Cubs, and Local Association officers.

And by no means less is the help in the movement in Kenya given by over thirty individuals or representatives of various organizations and communities, who have accepted places on the staff and greatly expanded Kenya Scout Council's staff today in the Metropolitan Hotel, Nairobi, under the Presidency of the new Chief Scout for the Colony, the Reverend Sir Henry Moore, K.C.M.G.

members of delegation were exercised in favour of that particular body, the British Standard should be that to his mind the right to impose either direct or indirect taxation must stand or fall together.

The Difference

On this point Mr. Shapley explained that the distinction he had endeavoured to draw was the difference between a revenue raising method where the subject had control and a direct tax where the subject had no control.

The President: I think Mr. Shapley will be content to thank his colleagues for the indirect taxation matter.

Mr. Shapley: I have presented the arguments so far as I see them with complete confidence.

Chief Justice Webber: What in England would it mean for a tax levied to be imposed in a way different from the law that a motor car must carry a full light at night?

Mr. Shapley: The revenue law every year has to be passed.

His Lordship: In exactly the same way any other ordinary law.

Mr. Shapley: I agree. But in England the taxpayer has got to be consulted through the House of Commons. The Kenya Legislative Council has got to be consulted through the Imperial Parliament, but the latter has not said enough.

The local legislature here must be regarded as the agent of the Imperial Parliament, so long as powers have been delegated to it, but you talk to the Imperial Parliament to see the extent of the powers.

Chief Justice Webber: Do you think it is right to have a tax levied through its agent?

Mr. Shapley: I think, through the British Settlement Act, then the King in Council. But the House of Commons has got to be consulted in any such case as it has derived from the House of Commons.

The President: The King in Council has not the power of the Legislative Council.

Mr. Shapley: What are the limitations of the power of the King in Council? My contention is that the King's powers are limited.

The President: The King in Council could impose income tax in this country. Do you mean that the King in Council, who derives his powers from the Imperial Parliament, is not to have the power of taxation?

Chief Justice Webber: Have you read section 2 of the Act?

Mr. Shapley: It is used with words which do not look to have been intended.

After a certain amount of further argument the President said that the decision would be given judgment before Court is Appeal breaks up. It is learned that the decision will be given today but that the full text of the judgment will not be printed until Monday.

UGANDA COTTON GINNING IN FULL SWING

The cotton picking season in the Eastern Province and Uganda district has practically finished and the greater part of the crop has now been ginned. It is thought, in a report as the season proceeds, that the ginning has taken only just a month to buy the whole of the seed cotton produced in these areas.

Ginning is proceeding day and night and it is expected that it will not be completed before May next. In Uganda Province heavy arrivals are reported and here again ginning is full swing. It is estimated that 45,000 tons have been despatched from railway stations and ports for export.

Now that the whole Province is ginning, despatches for export will become greater still and the peak is expected to be reached during March, April and May.

The lint market has again become very uncertain this week, due mainly to the threatened strike of mill workers at Ahmednagar which has affected Bombay. The highest price of the week was 34 cents per lb. for A.R.K. but this broke to 31 cents, ending half a cent off Wednesday at 32.

150 Traffic Cases Before Magistrate

Mr. D. J. Coffey, Resident Magistrate of Nairobi, was seated on Tuesday with in his court 150 cases, of which 118 were dealt with, summing up being issued in the balance of 34 charges in connection with the 50 pieces of traffic which were received and no appearance made.

The traffic light system was a list of 143 cases and it is a long time since this large number was dealt with in the course of a single day.

In the cases decided on Tuesday 35 as follows were imposed:—

For driving on a prohibited road: 30 convictions were recorded, a fine of Shs. 20/- being imposed in each case.

For driving a motor vehicle without possession of the annual Shs. 5/- driving license: 72 convictions, the fine in each case being Shs. 5/-.

To complete the list of 150 cases dealt with in the course of the day, a motor vehicle when not in possession of a certificate of compliance, One of Shs. 10/-, one of Shs. 20/-, and eight fines of Shs. 5/- were also imposed, in connection with these.
