Australians Rush To Enlist

THE QUEEN ELIZABETH

The Queen Elizabeth, the world's biggest liner which was completed in Scotland only a fortnight ago is now in New York. It will remain there for the duration of the war, well out of the way of Nazi aircraft.

March 7. A rush of applications has followed an announcement in Australia yesterday that recruiting is to begin for new forces and New South Wales has already a waiting list of 5,000. It is expected that the quota will be quickly filled when recruiting begins a few weeks' time. Lieut-General Sir Thomas Blarney, Commander of the Australian Forces, will also command the new force according to an announcement by the Defence Minister today. (Reuter).

PILOTS AND PLANES GIVE GREAT ACCOUNT OF THEMSELVES

AIR MINISTER'S REVIEW

AN OUTLINE OF THE TREMENDOUS EFFORT BEING MADE BY BRITAIN, THE EMPIRE AND FRANCE IN ORDER TO ATTAIN MASTERY OF THE AIR WAS GIVEN IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS YESTERDAY BY SIR KINGLEY WOOD, AIR MINISTER, REVIEWING THE WORK OF THE ROYAL AIR FORCE DURING THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF WAR.

During that period, he said, the Air Force had not been operating at full intensity. It had been developing and consolidating its position. Nevertheless pilots and aircraft had given a truly great account of themselves.

He described the R.A.F.'s part in escorting convoys and in reconnaissance flights over Germany and also spoke of the position of civil aviation after the war.

But he ended with a note of warning. Germany's air force was both strong and powerful and if enemy attacks were made successfully and often that they would be beaten off without successful results.

BIGGEST FLIGHTS OF WAR R.A.F. Again Over Germany

London, March 7. Members of the Royal Air Force last night carried out one of the most extensive reconnaissance flights of the war. They were over north-west Germany, including Bremen, Hannover, Hamburg, Wilhelmshaven and Cuxhaven in addition to the security patrol over German sea-ports.

There was little opposition to the R.A.F. planes and only over Bremen did anti-aircraft batteries open heavy fire. One plane was surrounded with bursts of orange coloured flame. The pilot was seen to German aircraft with navigation lights on flying at a height of 10,000 feet over the Heligoland strait but no attempt was made to attack the raiders.

Elsewhere there was considerable activity and some British planes were held in the covering hours of 20 to 30 searchlights for nearly half a minute. They managed to get out then, however.

FRANCE'S NEW BATTLESHIPS

Paris, March 7. The second of the four 10,000-ton battlecruisers which France has now been launched. These ships will carry eight 16-inch guns, fifteen 6-inch guns and four aircraft.

PALESTINE POLICY DEFENDED

Reason For New Land Regulations

Replying to an Opposition motion of censure on the Government in connection with the new land regulations in Palestine, the Secretary of State for the Colonies denied that the regulations were a concession to political pressure from the Arabs.

The British Government, he said, had the sternest warnings from Palestine in recent weeks that despite appearances in Palestine there was beneath the surface growing unrest among the Arabs who feared that the British Government would not carry out the policy laid down in the White Paper.

In Palestine three leaders of the Jewish Labour Party have been sent to prison for six months for organising demonstrations in Tel Aviv against the regulations which control the sale of land.

These regulations were debated in the House of Commons last night when a Labour motion commending the regulations was rejected by a majority of 100.

Mr. Malcolm Macdonald defended the Government's regulations, pointing out the transfer of land to Palestine.

The Opposition attack was led by Mr. Noel Baker who submitted a motion condemning the regulations as inconsistent with the terms of the Mandate. He also had the honour of introducing a motion of censure against the Government.

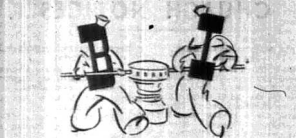

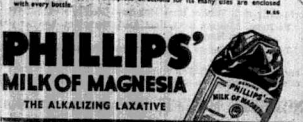

THE NEW HIGH SEAS

Being a Review of Event and Opinion in the Union.

THE TRUISM that, for seamen, the whole world is in the war zone was startlingly emphasized by the collision disaster of Durban last month.

The "Chedale" (4212 tons) and the "Greystone Castle" (9,633 tons) were both steaming under war conditions—completely blacked-out—when they collided at 11.15 p.m. last Saturday 24 miles north-east of Durban.

The Chedale, her side ripped open, sank in 24 minutes. Sixteen men, including the captain, chief and second officers, the Chief Engineer and the second, third and fourth engineers, were drowned, and it was only by some prompt rescue work on the part of the Greystone Castle, herself badly damaged, that the rest of the crew were saved.

The appalling damage to the Chedale's hull was caused by the starboard anchor of the Greystone Castle, which caught in the other ship's side, and ripped open her plating like a giant sledge-hammer. There was no time to think of lowering a boat—the Chedale's radio operator had time only to flash an S.O.S. The men who could reach the deck in time, many of them half-dressed, jumped into the sea before the onslaught of floating wreckage. The sea was rough, but mercifully warm.

A curious feature of the accident was that quantities of tin were later, part of the cargo of the Greystone Castle, leaked into the sea and, although it leached automatically into the Greystone by Agent from the English minority, it was the population of South-West Africa to be roughly split into four political divisions—the "Nazi Germans," the "so-called Afrikaners" and the "Maitaine-Afrikaners."

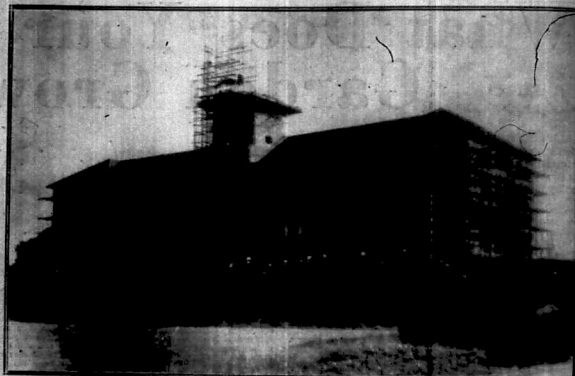

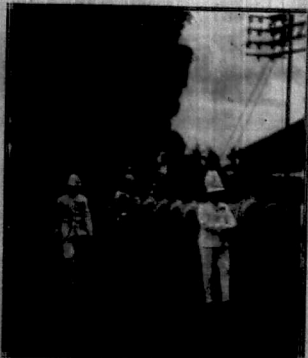

## THE PIG INDUSTRY

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir—I have read with much interest the various publications in your paper on the pig industry. One of those who have always contended that this should definitely be a side line with every farmer, and not a separate business, is now being proved—albeit not a day farmer, would point out what appears to be to a big risk. The President referred to the allocation of 91 square miles of forest land—nearly two per cent of the total forest area in Kenya. This amount was kept secret, the protestant members of the Forest Department were not consulted and the public was given no opportunity of protesting at this squandering of a national asset.

"Government," continued Mr. Lodge, "has since told us that 'political expediency' has necessarily outweighed objections from the forestry point of view."
