The Japanese people are becoming restive at the long-continued war with China, at its great cost and at the restrictions it is imposing on daily life.

Because of this the Tokyo Government is believed to have decided to push ahead with the establishment of the Japanese-sponsored Central Government in China under Wang Ching Wei and this will be proclaimed on April 1.

RUSH TO BUY WAR LOAN

London, March 15. Competing on the London stock exchange, the issue of the £200,000,000 war loan, the Financial News says. The avalanche of application forms has descended on banks and securities offices this week, leaving no doubt that response to the war loan has come well up to expectations. It is thought there may be as yet for the actual result to be announced. The loan has already had the best possible reception, and subscriptions have often gone some part over the promised amount, with a minimum of assistance from banks, and only moderate operations by other financial institutions. This success, like the other results achieved by the war effort campaign, is being regarded as a sign that the financing of the war will proceed well. (British Official Service).

BRITISH TRAILER GUN-U-BOAT

Went On For 17 Hours

THRILLING CHASE

The story has now been revealed of how a British armoured trailer sank a German submarine after a running fight lasting 17 hours.

The trailer was patrolling off the north-east coast of Scotland and sighted a U-boat some 50 miles away. The submarine dived but the trailer was forced to surface. After a time the submarine had managed to exceed 15 knots. The trailer had been hit several times by the submarine's shells and later began to lose its engine room and the engine was soon almost knocked in water. It managed to work the engine to such effect, however, that the trailer's speed increased first to 16 knots and then to 18. By this time the engines were vibrating so much that they shook the trailer.

Finally, after 17 hours of chasing the trailer got within effective range of the U-boat. The gunner fired the largest and in a few minutes the German submarine sank to the bottom for good. There were no survivors.

During the fight the trailer's engine shut off twice, probably due to the vibration. The master of the U-boat had been awarded the D.S.M.

How gallantly these trailer ships fight against German aircraft is indicated by the story of Capt. Davidson of the Castle, who was shot down by a German aircraft on March 15. 



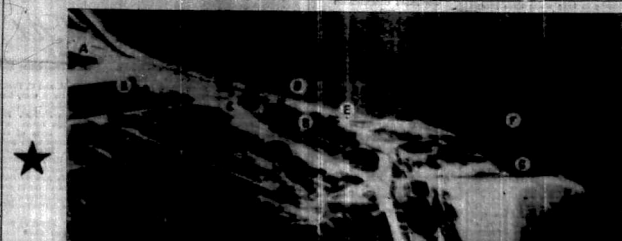
RELAYS OF PLANES DROPPED BOBS FOR SEVEN HOURS

EXTENSIVE DAMAGE

While the House of Commons was still in session on Tuesday night the Prime Minister gave Members the first news of the biggest air raid yet carried out by the Royal Air Force.

The raid which was directed against air bases on the island of Sylt continued without stopping for over seven hours, relays of planes taking part at half hourly intervals.

All reports agree that the bombing from the aircraft was accurate and that very considerable damage was done. Great fires started by the bombs aided the pilots in their selection of and attacks on important objectives.

BALKANS AS CENTRE OF INTEREST

Hint By German Foreign Office

Speakers of the German Foreign Office have hinted that the centre of interest in Europe will soon be moved to the Balkans and that Italy's relations with Russia would be changed.

Mr. Sumner Welles will leave Geneva today for the Baltic States for America. He has not seen Signor Mussolini since the latter's meeting with Hitler at Brenner, but he has had lunch and a two-hour conversation with Count Ciano yesterday. He refused to reveal anything of their conversation and has broken his silence only to confirm statements made in Washington and London that he had not been discussing peace proposals during his tour of the capitals. In fact, he said, no European government had offered him peace plans, or mediation proposals, nor had he conveyed any suggestions for peace by any European power. Mr. Welles said he had made this statement to allay the flood of rumours about his mission and stressed once again that he was taking home to President Roosevelt a report on facts.

Moscow Objects

Moscow, March 20. The British Embassy is understood to deny reports that the Soviet Union does not object to the German attack on Denmark, Finland, Sweden and Norway since "it would be almost against the Soviet Union and would be a direct contribution of the peace treaty with Finland."—Reuter.

Still a Mystery

This development confirms what was said by a diplomatic correspondent on Monday who spoke of Hitler's double aims. It will be recalled that the correspondent had remarked that, if the peace offensive failed, there was another side to the "win" which would give the Nazis a kind of second line. This he suggested, was to entail Italian support in the Balkans by persuading Signor Mussolini that Germany would not be faithful to her Russian ally. But this Russian influence in the Balkans should be neutralized by some sort of financial guarantee to Rumania.—(Reuter).

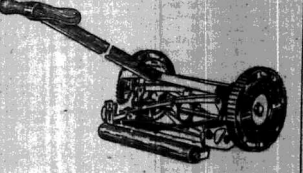

ments in foreign industries are being employed to influence the policy of many neutral countries on which Germany depends for supplies.

Between France and Britain there now exists a close collaboration in the purchase of war supplies and civilian and industrial requirements for the two countries and even an exchange of workers and tools for the fulfilment of war tasks and contracts so that the machinery of both countries may operate as one gigantic undertaking. Every important department has its liaison for the working out of a cooperative and non-competitive policy. Nothing approaching this coordination between two nations has been known in the world before and statements are watching closely the results to learn from their lesson which both countries may operate as one.

It was inevitable that what has been done by the two major countries would eventually be extended to the Colonial Empire. As a result of Mr. Macdonald's Paris programme, organizations have been set up in both countries to knit together the war effort of vast areas which represent nearly half the world, and that impressive fact must hearten all those who are weighing the chances of victory and defeat. The Empire together represent tremendous and almost inexhaustible resources in man-power and material. Under combined leadership, their policy influence on the outcome of the struggle must be decisive.

To make coordination effective, cooperation is being extended to the Colonies themselves and the Government of Colonial Territories are being instructed to maintain constant contact by regular exchange of information, combination of their war efforts and frequent conference. To obtain the last ounce from the vast economic resources of the Empire, it is hinted that the wartime policy will probably extend to coordination of production and distribution of raw materials. The East African Territories have no near French neighbours and it is improbable that at the present time there will be any very important changes in the economic and production policies of the Territories. The East African Territories are on the shipping route to several French possessions, north and south, and it is quite likely that there can be introduced measures of cooperation which will benefit all the shipping companies in the field of exchange of colonial produce much can be done. East Africa imports large quantities of raw materials which can be supplied by France and her Empire and is seeking markets for products which may well be required by our Allies. A recent good example was provided by coffee. France imports from foreign countries a large quantity of coffee to supplement her own colonial product and there should be little difficulty in supplying the demand for coffee sales and re-distribution within the currency area represented by the British and French possessions. It is policies such as these that will take time to work out in detail, and after they have been prepared, it is equally likely that affected territory sound and imaginative propaganda and publicity as part of State policy. The time may come when East Africa can probably study what it can do to expand markets in the French Empire and who steps should be taken to increase our purchases from our gallant Ally. These are practical contributions to victory.
