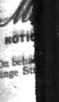

Many Schemes Before Settlement and Production Board

In regard to overstocking of Native Reserves the meeting urged the Government to end the period of inaction in tackling this problem. It requested the Board to undertake a complete review of the agricultural credit structure and an examination of ways and means of financing improvement in farming systems for the benefit of the land.

Some resolutions urged consideration of ways and means of stimulating the development of secondary industries, and asked that facilities should be provided for the Agricultural Department to press forward with grassland research.

The Director of Agriculture stated that applications for grants from the Colonial Development Fund had been made in the respect of schemes for reforestation in Native Reserves, for a survey of forest reserves and for reconditioning in the Kamusa reserve. The proposed schemes were over periods of five to ten years.

SOUTH AFRICAN SCENE

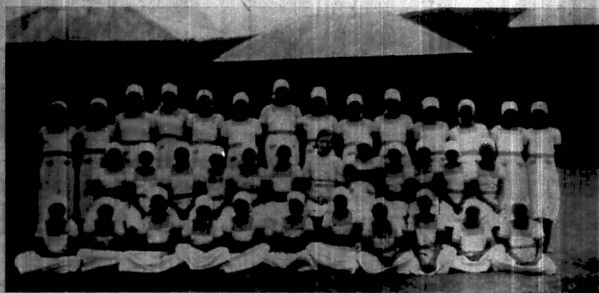

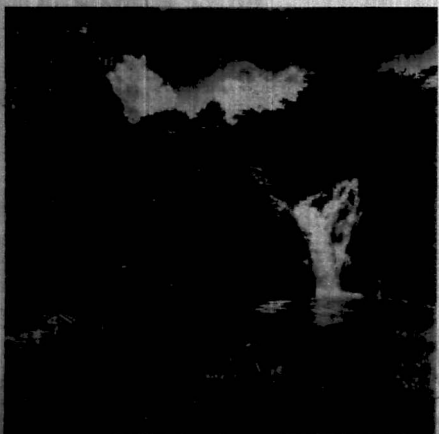

WAR SPREADS TO SCANDINAVIA

German Invasion Of Norway And Denmark

These are described as being concerned with general questions affecting relations between the Allied Governments and Scandinavia and their purpose is said to be to clarify the attitude of the Allies on matters connected with Scandinavian neutrality.

Mr. Berzard, the French Premier, also saw the Norwegian and Swedish Ministers in Paris. Messages from Stockholm state that Sweden will reply to the notes through an official channel. It is not to be expected immediately. It is thought that Sweden and Norway will receive similar notes, will not exchange views, and that Norway may remain silent.

Sweden has announced that it will not permit the landing of German troops. Swedish authorities quarantined in Stockholm state that the British note does not ask for any in-

Bottling Up German Fleet EFFECT OF BIG NEW MINEFIELD

An international warning broadcast on behalf of the Admiralty today gives news of the most decisive operation so far reported since the German invasion of Denmark and Norway.

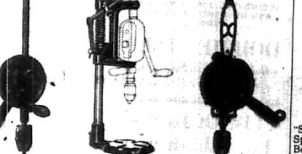

UNEASY NEUTRALS
The Next Blow?

The fact that this part of the plan has failed has enormously increased Germany's difficulties. Denmark has become, by reason of its occupation, enemy territory and already the economic pressure and make life for the embarrassed Danes so much more difficult. The German Government supplies have been cut off, from one trade from Sweden is liable to increasing interruption and the shipping of German goods to the Allies in making their blockade effective have been removed by Hitler himself.

So far there are no reliable indications of Germany's next move but as it was so aptly described in a Press comment the other day, the Nazis are like a man who has been kicked in the teeth and is in the desperate process they will have no regard at all for any neutrals. The Comintern and its division which is the western front is to be broken, but we cannot overlook the temporary advantage which would follow an adventure in the German eastern Europe where German agents are working hard to stir the pro-British fire of Russian. But though oil in Rumania looks an attractive prize, invasion of that country would set upon an interruption of those vital supplies, and south-European Europe cannot provide the economic resources that would follow the invasion of Norway to an early and inglorious end.

Germany's prestige has received a further blow. Every previous act of aggression has been so cleverly planned that it has left no loophole for effective retaliation. But now the western flank is wide open, exposed to relentless sea pressure and already the Allies have swiftly considered that gain in the Skagerrak and the Kattegat; by taking the obvious step of mining the whole area, closing the bottle neck of the Baltic and extending down to Dutch territory. The effect of this move are obvious. The Germans are pinned down in the north and such naval and land units as they have in the North Sea or Norway can be dealt with piecemeal in the cleaning up process as opportunities offer. But the query remains: What is Germany's next move? The suggestion is being made that the invasion of Norway was merely a cloak to hide some more important elsewhere. If it was, and it is a doubtful theory, then it has badly misfired. What is probably the truth is that it was part of a much larger plan intended first and quickly to secure the German grip on Scandinavia and the supplies the northern countries represented, and that the plan was related to large operations of a magnitude intended to give the German military forces, and probably the German air force, a much more elbow room than they have enjoyed in front of the congested western area defamed by the Maginot line. Having secured the northern flank, German strategists probably intended next to invade the Low Countries to give effect to the favourite and well-known plan tried and prematurely abandoned in 1914 of outflanking the western front by a circling movement through Holland and Belgium in the direction of Paris and western France. There is no evidence that such a plan has in fact been given up, even now. So very long ago Field Marshal Goring said the war would be won by a gigantic blow on the western front and there is every reason to believe that he is correct. There is an alternative plan, but one more the Germans have made their psychological blunder which gives time, they always make. They obviously reckoned on Norway proving to be as uninteresting as Denmark and they thought that the Skagerrak minefields were impenetrable by a naval force, or would be at least proof the operations long enough to enable German control over Norway, and domination of Sweden.

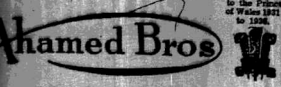

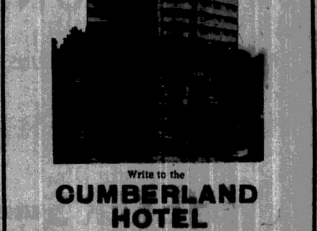

The British Navy has delivered two further crippling blows at the German invaders of Narvik—by the guns of the fleet, the other by the extension of mine-laying operations.

KING HAakon's REPLY TO NAZI DEMANDS

There are growing signs that Norway intends to put up a strong resistance against the German invaders and in this the King is setting a great example to his people. King Haakon declares he will not leave his country whatever the danger and reports say he has already slept peacefully.

Hamparing The Nazi Invaders

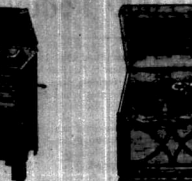
