SHARP FIGHTING IN NORWAY Numerous German Air Attacks

The German invasion of Norway is making painfully slow progress in the few sectors in which they have not been repelled. The invaders are still holding only a few areas widely separated and these forces can make no contact except by air.

The German attempt to stop the Allied advance from Narvik to Trondheim has resulted in fighting at Stensån, about 10 miles north of Trondheim. The road and rail line from Narvik to Trondheim Allied troops disembarked, first along the western shore of the narrow fjord and Stensån is therefore a very strong position. It is the point that the Allied advance was becoming a serious matter to the Germans and, accordingly, they rushed troops and destroyed the fjord from Trondheim and headed them under cover of fire from their wings.

This move was referred to in both the German and Allied press. The German press said that the Allies had a large number of troops which would go the fjord from Trondheim and that, after some sharp fighting, the Allied troops succeeded in re-establishing the situation.

This uncompromising attitude has been expressed by the King in a message to Mr. Paul Berg, the Chief Justice of Norway.

S. RHODESIA'S PART IN THE WAR Conscription Principle To Ensure Greater Efficiency

When the fifth session of the Parliament of Southern Rhodesia was opened on Wednesday, the extent of the colony's war effort was revealed by the Governor, Sir Herbert Stanley.

He said the Government of Southern Rhodesia appreciated the fact that their front line of defence must be at any part of the world indicated by the High Command.

He announced that the new recruiting organisation, under civil control, was being set up. The system of voluntary service would be maintained, but a measure of conscription is to be introduced in association with it in order that there may be greater efficiency.

PLENTY OF VOLUNTEERS The Governor said there was no lack of volunteers, but it was necessary for the Government to decide in what capacity the men could render the best service.

He added that preparations for the Air Training Scheme were proceeding satisfactorily. The first three Air Squadrons offered to the Imperial Government had now completed their personnel and there was a very satisfactory number of recruits for these units.—(Reuter.)

Holland's New Press Law

The most sweeping security measure yet taken by Holland was announced last night. A Decree allows all publication under military censorship. It empowers military authorities to prohibit any publication considered against national safety or interest. Any publication not to be banned without notice and any new publication must have the approval of the military authorities in advance.

The Decree prohibits the publication of photographs or cartoons.

GERMAN TROOPS CONCENTRATE ALONG BALTIC Nazi Designs On Finnish Islands?

Reports from several European sources confirm the rumours of concentrations of German troops along the Baltic and particularly at Memel, Danzig and Gdynia during the past few days.

A CHALLENGE TO CHRISTIANITY
In one of the most remarkable Press articles of recent times Prince Leopold, Luxembourg-Weirich explained that when the Nazis call all men and women, it is not because they are convinced that we are wrong but because they are convinced that we are right. He said that the Nazis are merely fighting to maintain or extend their power and that the writer continued to assert that if we feel that we are fighting to uphold the spiritual of Christianity and that we wish these ideas to prevail over Nazism, then "we must not only proclaim them but we must also practice them." Prince Leopold claims that an ideal which merely exists but is not given active expression is like the talent hidden in the sack reserved in Matthew xiv, 28, and he gives historical examples of the manner in which a lesser ideal has triumphed over a greater ideal when the latter had ceased to be an inspiring force. Few articles appearing in the Daily Mirror have been so clearly as this a British subject by naturalization and an author who has read thoroughly understands the Nazi mentality and shows the way in which the "people chosen by Providence" must be protected by law to establish the millennium of their unending "Reich." He continues to show that force alone cannot defeat these evil objectives, nor is it sufficient, thinking and self-righteous admiration is an authority in itself. He concludes by saying that he is not a Jew, but that he is a Christian and he is convinced that when he concludes: "Only a vigorous renaissance of our faith will rescue Nazism as a party for political and economic reconstruction, for we must act, and after the war, however well conceived and carefully thought out, can succeed unless such a plan embraces the living spirit of the Christian faith, the most noble of all religions. It is one of the most significant signs of our times that a few of our intellectuals, that we regard all matters spiritual to a separate compartment of life, and associate them with the idea of idleness and the outward observance of certain ritual and 'conventions.'"
Prince Leopold mentions by contrast that the spirit of Christianity will not preserve us from the evils of the Nazis and he concludes: "The Nazis are inspired by an ideal but we are not inspired by it. All things being equal, it is the strongest ideal which will decide the war and shape the peace of the world." Without actually mentioning it, his critic has reached an answer the way to the most practical solution of the evils of the Kingdom of God, which is the only true solution to all the problems which confront his spiritual world. The distortion of the Nazi ideal, as the phenomenon of the rise of the Third Reich, the promotion of the brilliancy of the vision of the Kingdom. As the phenomenon of dictatorship crises for world domination, it is continually evident to the British people its realisation of their responsibility as the people who must exercise world dominion in righteousness and as the servants of all mankind.
Evil forces have been let loose in our world and they continue to challenge to Christianity which will result in the greatest, darkest, darkest, darkest days of our civilization since the dawn of time. How significant is the light of these facts are the words of the Scriptures: "This Gospel of the Kingdom shall be preached in all the world as a witness to all nations; and who believe shall be saved." The End of the Old Order of Civilization is at hand, and we are being carried in the wind-shaking events of the present time, to the chaos heralds coming. We must act now, or our day of righteousness shall bring us to ruin. (Adv.)

There have been no further large export sales of Manitoba wheat, but quotations are being made for a large Spring movement which should be expected earlier than anticipated.

Maize: As an imported article, No. 1 Northern Manitoba 35/6d, quarter cask.
Australia—approximately 26/6d, quarter cask.
Barley: The demand is slow in Europe and recent political developments in the West have retarded shipments of Pale Barley to North Africa and the Continent. The result is that shippers will be looking for a number of additional markets, and may therefore be expected that a slight rise in the market price will result. Canadian offers are already a little lower than the price of Australian or Irish.

Flax: The price of flax remains that of East African lino is 27/6d per quart cask.
Fats: The following report has been received from London: The market showed very little change from that of last week. Purchases are being made very carefully and there is no look in the market at present.

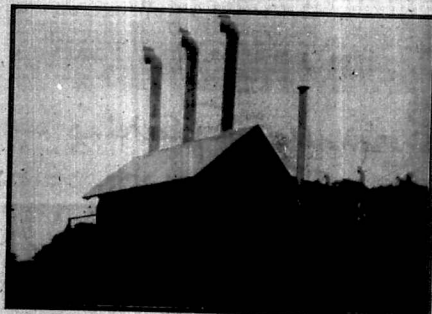

CONVERSATION PIECE

It matters not how meanly skilled a writer is if he lacks
knowing and communicative friends.

It is a pleasure to me to have seen in last Friday's paper, with which I agree to a large extent, if I have not pointed out that the important part of the conversation is the article on the outbreak of the Italian war and the effects of hostilities. It would therefore be breaking the spirit of that piece if I were to discuss a matter which is of no concern to the Civil Service. I need scarcely mention the use that German propaganda would make of a broken block of the Italian war, and how the members of the Civil Service, if and when this thing went wrong, would be accepted I would support the scheme with all the strength of my command.

In these days, when soldiers are sent away allowed to talk about the weather, in case the enemy might only observe the views briefly and to the point. It is a serious matter if I could agree with you on all occasions, the soldier, who after all is to face the danger of war, should be excluded.

Apart from that I should like to support the proposals.

Space prohibits the quotation of every view expressed but here are three most notable ones for themselves:

OBJECTIVE. (1) "As a concerned legislator I would have been glad to see the economy proposed in last week's Standard. My only complaint is that they do not go far enough. It is not out there and altogether. And why should this excellent reorganization be limited to war-time? The revenue could nearly be made up in other ways and all those people now living down to the ordinary level of penuriousness would be freed from the making of mutilations and other war needs."

CONSERVATION. (2) "Any sane parliamentarian indeed the unique opportunity to benefit the entire community, which the market provides there are now preparations on the ground which guarantee a large enough of the public funds would guarantee the difference I would have no objection."

(3) "A meeting of the Union of Arts and Handicrafts considered the economy proposed set out in the East African Standard. While some of our suggestions have been considered and our members, we felt after careful and objective consideration that any interference with the making of the goods would be very disastrous. It has been proved that a man can be greatly affected by the sort of food and drink on which he lives. It is a difference between the grain eating and the milk and blood drinking tribes in Kenya and therefore we insist that all measures affecting food and drink be considered."

Otherwise the proposals are excellent. I am sure that the suggested dress restrictions in war-time. Personally I should like to see legislation on the subject. But I must not say that my own views are final. I enclose a photograph and I think you will agree that this conversation has been in the interests of peace."

Contagious Mastitis

BEING a Broadleaf Talk given by Dr. S. E. Percy of the Veterinary Research Laboratory, Kabete, on Thursday evening April 16th, from the Nairobi Station, in the series of Talks to Farmers, arranged by the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of Kenya with the co-operation of the Nairobi and Wireless Ltd., and various Departments of Government.

The different types of mastitis commonly met with in this country are:

1. **Freshly, clinically acute mastitis.** In this type of mastitis the symptoms consist of a local swelling of the milk bearing udder and sometimes with dots and blood-tinged. The quarter concerned becomes swollen and painful, but the local may become blocked, making it difficult or impossible to return to normal in about two days. It is severe cases the quarter is often lost in a few days to a week. It is sporadic and non-contagious. There is no constitutional disturbance. The cause of this kind of mastitis is as yet unknown.

2. **Secondarily, clinically acute mastitis.** This is a form of mastitis which is secondary to another form of disease, such as metritis, pyometra, or a bacterial infection of the udder. It is often accompanied by a systemic illness, and may be fatal.

3. **Chronic mastitis.** This is a form of mastitis which is characterized by a persistent, non-painful swelling of the udder. It is often accompanied by a systemic illness, and may be fatal.

BY CALFHOOD VACCINATION

An Account of American Practice and the Result of Large-Scale Tests

THE following summary of the history of calving vaccination in America concerning the disease is published by the University of California and has been translated by Dr. Clarence M. Harris, Director of Veterinary Services, California, in the journal "Certified Milk."

THE WAR FIGHTING IN THREE SECTORS IN NORWAY Allies And Norwegians Oppose Germans North Of Oslo

The situation in Norway is still obscure and most of the information available is from German communications, from the terms of which it is evident that Nazi forces are not getting along as quickly as they expected.

A British War Office communique on Saturday announced that French troops have arrived in Norway, that operations are going according to plan and that Allied forces are in possession of certain vantage points.

Since the invasion of Norway the War Office has issued only three communiqes, totalling 56 words. This reticence has undoubtedly kept the Germans guessing, for they are now speaking with two contradictory voices on the situation in Norway.

Both Allies and Germans are making efforts to stop operations from reaching Norway. British submarines have sunk two German transporters while the other hand, the R.A.F. on Saturday night made the first attack on any German air base in Denmark—a successful one on Aalborg aerodrome. In northern Denmark, which has served as an advanced base for the German attack on Norway, British transports and seaborne forces are making attempts to stop operations.

High seas operations are continuing. The one British aircraft carrier, the *HMS Hermes*, is in the area. The second German submarine to be sunk was the *U-23* on Saturday night. The following day the R.A.F. made the first attack on any German air base in Denmark—a successful one on Aalborg aerodrome. Centre of Interest Ironheim's Claim 1000 Dead Washed Ashore

It is officially stated in London today that German troops have been washed ashore at the mouth of the Oslo Fjord. This is the only part of the price which Germany is paying for the initiation of hostilities and it is regarded in London as disposing of the German propaganda claim made regularly over wireless that the transport of German troops to Norway was proceeding steadily and according to plan.

"Allied troops are now in North Central and Southern Norway and they are now in contact," he said. "This morning's Norwegian war communiqué says that British fighters have arrived in Norway and are already on patrol duty. German and French anti-aircraft guns have also been landed and some of them have been used."



Sir John Strick, director of the Sterling Office, London, April 12.—(Received.)
I have been asked to draw attention to a statement of his in Parliament on the subject of the depreciation of sterling in the financial market. "I am glad to find that opportunities for making a statement which will help to correct some of the misapprehensions current both at home and abroad on this subject. The recent fall in the financial rate for sterling on foreign markets was not the result of a general fall in the value of sterling in the world, but of a fall in the demand for sterling in foreign currencies and a fall in the demand for sterling on the part of foreign governments and certain other countries."

Our Policy
"The position of sterling in the purchasing power of sterling for the world and the position of sterling in the world of transactions between the world and other countries should be conducted in London through our central office at our official rates. That may have the incidental result that any outside market for sterling becomes a very narrow market, and a thin market is always erratic and fluctuating."

"In regard to the question whether we should block sterling for the great deal of foreign money now in this country in the form of securities, or extruded to other countries because sterling is, and remains, a currency in international use. At the outbreak of war we carried out the policy of international use to which the money holder had agreed. THE DEVELOPMENT OF HIGH SEAS WAR

Both Sides Seeking For Strategic Positions

A GERMAN WARNING

British and Norwegian official reports disposed of rumors that heavy British losses have been suffered in actions in Norway.

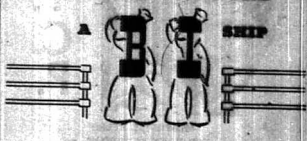

There is a growing feeling that much that remains to be done, despite all the talk, to give much clearer lead to the agricultural industry in more exact terms concerning the direction of the effort it is so anxious to make to supply the Kingdom, maintain pre-war markets and follow up new markets for the consumption of East African export surpluses.

The country has been blessed with generous rains and the agricultural outlook has not been brighter for years than it is now. But how little we have to show for it! It is the prevailing opinion that the prevailing conditions were illustrated as recently as Saturday by the figures we published regarding the sources of supply for Liebig's factory. This factory is carrying out an important and essential task today in supplying most of the fertilizer used in East Africa but instead of the cattle being obtained readily and cheaply from the nearby native areas which the factory manager has stated was being brought on the hoof hundreds of miles from an adjoining territory because the Government of Kenya apparently unable to persuade its natives who people that here at hand is one of the most important and the most effective method of helping the war effort of the Empire. Months ago the Government was supposed to be considering an extension to Kenya of the excellent stock raising organization which is functioning so efficiently in Tanganyika, but we have heard no hint of progress.

It is only our passing thoughts that are passing through our minds. For example, there are many directions of organization of resources and the diverting of profits related to war needs and to the Government. Disturbed by the fact that it is impossible to produce without reason, we are beginning, not to see the light at the end of the tunnel, but to see a black hole at the end of the tunnel. People who are willing to save money if they feel that they are being deceived, are not likely to be so easily deceived. Perhaps most of all, because it is a personal issue, they are beginning to be disturbed about whether the volunteer system is as good as it is in practice. We can get the best out of them and so recruit a force of many square miles in round lots.

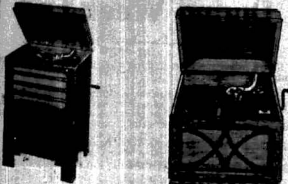

People Machine-Gunned In the Streets

LATEST NEWS OF FIGHTING

The mining of the approaches to Narvik, the repulse of another German attack in the Gudbrandsdalen Valley and more Allied landings south of Trondheim are revealed by joint communiques issued by the British War Office and the Admiralty.

Two double-hulls have been laid down near Narvik. Broadly speaking, the minefields, which are about the mine apart, covered the chief navigable approaches to Narvik both from the north area from the south.

Yesterday's War Office communique reported Allied enemy air activity in the Narvik area which, however, in no way interfered with Allied operations.

Rebuffed
For the second day in succession the War Office was able to report the repulse of an enemy attack in the Gudbrandsdalen Valley. There Allied troops have been successfully demoralized in spite of enemy air attacks on Allied lines and lines of communication. Both these facts have an important bearing on the situation on the Gudbrandsdalen front.

Germans Attack Red Cross Units

Swedish Red Cross units, including the German Red Cross, have been bombed by the German air force.
The units consisted of one lady and one nurse, and were attacked near the town of Helsingfors. The two nurses were seriously injured by the bombs, but the ladies were considerably damaged by machine-gun fire.

The German claim to have sunk four British ships and 13 transports in the past few days. There is not the slightest truth in this claim, says the Admiralty. The ships were sunk by British submarines. It is impossible to land troops and supplies on the Norwegian coast here. This is evidenced by the fact that German war planes are not seen in the area.

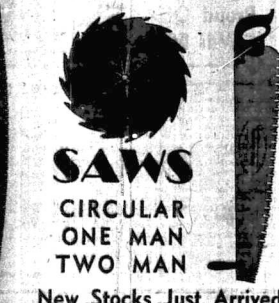
