TRIKERS TO MARCH ON LONDON

Resumption appeal by T.U.C. rejected

EXPULSION 10,000 'DOCKERS' REQUEST TO UNION

MERSEYSIDE dockers, on strike for five weeks, have decided to organize a protest march on London by 2,000 men. An appeal to the Trades Union Congress for a resolution was rejected at mass meetings in ports.

The General Council of the T.U.C. had stated its opposition to the strike and asked the Amalgamated Steamers and Dockers Union to call a meeting in the North of England next week. The union was found guilty of "boycotting" British Docks.

But the T.U.C. statement found the strike illegal on grounds where the London docks, in a national appeal, a resolution was passed. "In view of the T.U.C. refusal to call a meeting in the North of England next week, we will go on strike for 20 miles a day."

The dispute affecting about 200 ship and 1,000 men in Liverpool, where the T.U.C. had called a meeting, was the N.A.S.D.U. The latter called for resolution in northern ports which the T.U.C. rejected.

HUNTING COSTS INCREASED

Tanganyika aims to make shooting more selective

THE cost of a visitor's general hunting licence in Tanganyika is increased from today from 400 to 1,000. 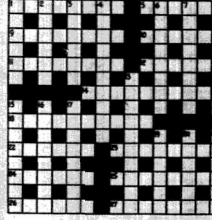

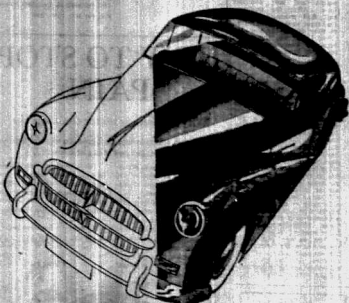

THE STORY OF THE KENYA FARMERS' ASSOCIATION

'The Kenya Farmers' Association is a farmers' co-operative run by farmers for farmers.'

THE Kenya Farmers' Association (Co-operative) Ltd., or as it is popularly called, the K.F.A., is a co-operative association of European farmers with branches in all main farming areas of Kenya and in the Northern Province and Southern Highlands of Tanganyika.

The first was to market European-grown crops in the most advantageous manner and the second was to make the members responsible for the purchase of essential such as fertilisers, insecticides, and veterinary medicine. From a small start at the end of 1953, the Association expanded into the most powerful co-operative of its kind in East Africa. At the outbreak of World War II it was the only co-operative which Government could turn for the general re-

THE STORY OF THE KENYA FARMERS' ASSOCIATION

The Kenyan Farmers' Association was formed in 1932 at the request of members. The K.F.A. purchased two or three hundred acres of land with a view to investigating the possibility of creating a chain of stores which would supply not only general farm requirements but also farmers' domestic requirements throughout the country. Three years later it was decided to extend its policy to the field of general farming. The experiment was an unhappy one and after three years later it was abandoned and the Association's attention was directed to other areas. A branch at Thika was also closed.

In the last few years there has been a vigorous revival and development programme.

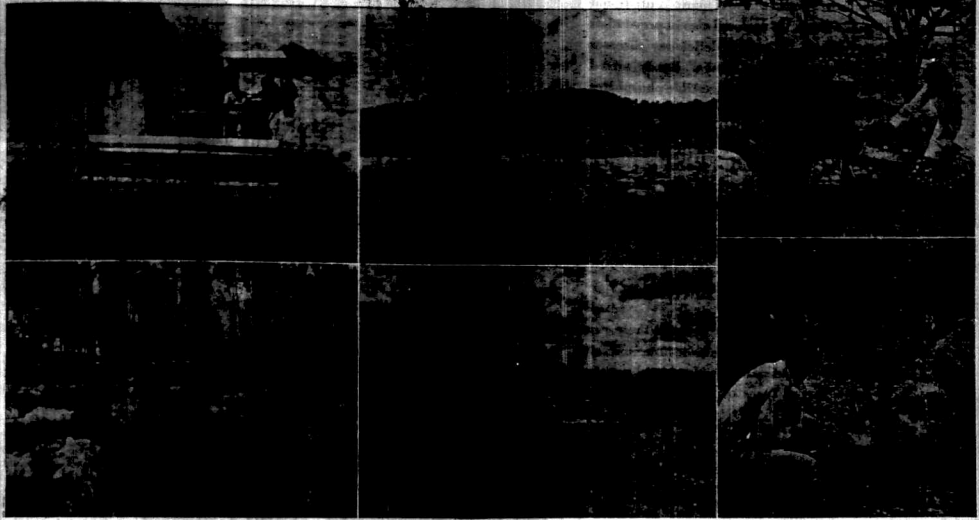

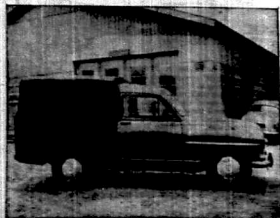
