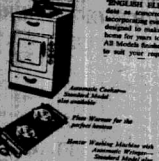

FOOT AND MOUTH AT DAGORETTI Fears for Royal Show discounted

OUTBREAKS of foot and mouth disease in the Dagoretti and Matara areas may not affect livestock entries for the Royal Show at Mitchell Park, Overlandia. **CIVIL AUTHORITIES TAKE OVER RESPONSIBILITIES**

MILITARY forces in Kenya are to be reduced in what is officially described as a "limited rundown." The decision has been taken by the Commander-in-Chief, East Africa, Lt.-Gen. Gerald Lathbury — with the concurrence of the War Council — in view of the continued improvement in the Emergency situation.

The British Government has approved the decision, which has not been taken as a result of pressure from outside Kenya, the Chief of Staff, Maj.-Gen. G. D. G. Heyman, stated yesterday.

Some reductions have taken place already. The R.A.F. Lincoln bomber squadron left in July and the U.S.A.F. 74th, K.A.R. returned to Uganda last month. Further reductions, including the Queen's Own Yeomanry, "P" Squadron and the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry will take place during the next few months.

The reductions in Kenya will include 2,500 British troops. Other units involved are Headquarters by R.F.C. and 28 Corps Engineer Regiment (less one composite squadron). The R.A.F. is likely to reduce its strength to 1,000 men.

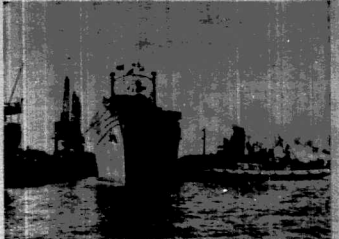

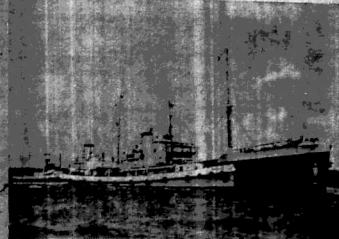
