## Uganda 'the leader in East Africa'

### FEAR OF KENYA RIDICULED

THE belief that Kenya was the leading partner in East Africa's new Territories was ridiculed by the Minister for Commerce and Works, Mr. C. Handley Bird, when speaking in the debate in Uganda's Legislative Assembly, which has been adjourned to continue its session for a further period of four years. The last time the assembly met was over two years ago.

It was quite clear that regulation was over the services of the people of Uganda.

"Kenya has a Representative Member, said that some of the members of the Central Legislative Assembly might be the result of the government's policy."

"You cannot call Kenya a mandated territory," he said. "Kenya is a self-governing country. He added that the Commission was carrying out its responsibilities for the co-ordination of these territories. He suggested that the Commission should take action on the Central Assembly.

Mr. Bird was replying to a speech by Dr. K. N. Mattock, a new Ugandan Representative Member, who had declared that the Central Legislative Assembly was seeking to "wedge" towards the Kenyan side in East Africa.

Dr. K. N. Mattock, a Member of the Central Legislative Assembly, said that after the war the Kenyan settlers were seeking to have their movement to form some sort of union.

#### Political ends

"For a long time they had been seeking to have the East African Federation," he contended. "They are now seeking to have a political institution between the Central Legislative Assembly and Africans regard the Central Legislative Assembly as a political assembly."

It is true to state, that no country could stand alone, but the Central Legislative Assembly of Kenya was designed for that purpose.

"We have had the assurance from the Kenyan Government that there shall be no federation, but we have also had the assurance all over the world that there will be no federation at any time or in history have been, will be, or can be any such breakaway."

Mr. C. Handley Bird, Representative Member, supporting the motion, said that the Central Legislative Assembly had many of the valuable services of the High Commission.

He supported a suggestion that the Central Assembly should be reconstituted.

Mr. H. E. Densfield, Q.C., the Attorney - General, winding up, supported the High Commission services and the High Commission.

"I can give an unswerving guarantee if it is possible to change the name of the Central Legislative Assembly to increase the membership of the

African people," he said.

**British Lions will play an E. Africa XV this afternoon**

The match that thousands of Rugby football enthusiasts all over East Africa have been waiting for between the British Lions and the E. Africa XV will be played this afternoon on the new Ngong Road ground of the Rugby Football Union of East Africa, the "christening" game on which the Union made its debut as an independent body in due course, the Twickenham of Kenya. The match will be opened by Sir Ernest R. G. Cocks, Governor of Kenya, and the Mayor of Nairobi, Mr. H. J. Gray. The game is to start at 3 o'clock. The admission fees will be £1/- per head. The spectators will be admitted to the stadium at a nominal sum of 5/- and children under 12 years old will be admitted free. It was announced yesterday that the number of spectators in the stands will be limited to 12,000.

A couple of days' rest will have got most of the young and fit players in the E. Africa XV into shape, and they can be expected to give a good account of themselves when the Lions play them today.

The game's the thing.

But the outcome of the game will depend very largely on the weather, as the two sides will be unable to practise effectively if any rain falls. The Lions have had the opportunity of practising twice since Tuesday evening, and effective play has been maintained. The Lions' tour has been a success so far in South Africa, and spectators today can expect to see something more than a good football game.

The East African team, which has been flying above, above all the other teams in its class from the start, will be able to show its mettle on Monday evening, the tourists' first night in Nairobi, when the result of a sickly afternoon will be known.

Referees: Mr. Andrew Clark (B.M.C.R.F.), Mr. F. G. P. Miller (S.A.R.F.), Mr. J. C. McLean (Army), Mr. D. Macmillan (Scotland) and Mr. K. R. H. Bell (Ireland) have been appointed by C. M. T. and the R.F.U., and Mr. G. M. and Mr. M. McMillan (Newport and Cardiff) will be in charge of the two touch judges.

But the changes do not mean that there is no chance for the E. Africa XV to do well in its debut appearance.

**Opening of new ground**

The Government's new Cricket Match Ground will open on the ground at 3 p.m. today, and will look like a picture when completed. The Etiamau-Jamani district and the Central Province will be represented by their teams in the opening games. The Lions will be in the same place for their first training session this afternoon, and will be in the stadium for their match with the E. Africa XV.

The lions up to now have been the best of company in Nairobi, and their arrival has brought the city to life again. They will be in the stadium throughout the day, and it will be interesting to see how they get on with the local boys.

This morning they will visit the Nairobi National Game Park and the Botanical Gardens, and this afternoon they will visit the Royal Agricultural Show.

Tomorrow morning they will visit the National Parks Office in the National Park or to the office of the National Parks Commissioner, Mr. J. W. Ingram (Lambeth), and, after luncheon, they are due to leave Nairobi Airport for Mombasa at 3 p.m.

There is at least a possibility of the Lions being invited to stay on.

# SOLDIERS NOT GUILTY OF KIPSIGIS MURDER

Leave court 'without a stain'

AFTER retiring for 75 minutes, a jury in Nairobi yesterday found Sgt Alfred Edward Pumblett (20) and his son, Rtd Sgt. S. W. Swindell, not guilty of a Kipsigis herd boy and not guilty of any lesser offence. The Supreme Court public galleries were crowded when the forecourt announced the verdict.

"You have had a fair trial and you have been acquitted by 12 of your own peers," said Justice de Lecting told the two men. Sgt. Pumblett, in dark green uniform, saluted the judge before leaving the courtroom to congratulate his advocates. Both Justice de Lecting and the Rtd. Sgt. Swindell, the first to be called to the Bar, were present.

## Summing up

The judge summed up for the prosecution, who said more than 100 persons should have witnessed these questionable events.

The prosecution accused them of killing a herd boy and did they not know that it was wrong to kill that joint intent?

"If the defendant was killed, was he attempting to escape? It was necessary to shoot him down to prevent his escape." Mr. Justice de Lecting added. "It is clear that if old Swindell kill him in self-defence he was not guilty of murder. But if he killed in self-defence he could be guilty of manslaughter."

The same would apply to Pumblett if he was entitled to defend his man.

"The court will decide that man was being attacked."

## Jury recalled

The jury retired at 11.45 p.m., but returned after 10 minutes to hear two further points of law, and again adjourned until 11.30 p.m. when summing up.

Chief Justice de Lecting, which the judge had indicated, told the Sgt. Pumblett and his son, Rtd Sgt. Swindell, to stand firmly towards the defendant and the court in the presence of the demonstrators of the mass meeting in Nairobi.

All those who saw the pair after the shooting had said they had been acting in self-defence at having done something they believed to be right. No person, you might think, would want to be accused of committing a "murder," the judge pointed out.

## Help in Emergency

Mr. J. D. Templeton (Acting Deputy Public Prosecutor) told the court that the two accused had been charged with murder and must not be taken into account when sentencing them.



## YOUTH'S PROSPECTS IN THE BRITISH THEATRE

By Kenneth Tynan

Cambridge newcomer is Peter Hall, the 23-year-old director of the Royal Shakespeare Company who has handled, in the past few months, "The Merry Wives of Windsor", "Waiting For Godot" and "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest". The Arts Council has given him a grant of £1,000 to present "Cuckoo" at the Arts Theatre with new English ones as they occur. "It's crucial, and we will return to it."

On the whole, the advantages

of going to a theatre are considerable, but becoming a professional actor is not easy. The trade unionists are right in their view that many of them are not even on the same rank as their teachers. But the pay scale is like reading for admission to the Black Hole of Calcutta.

How to start

EVERYONE responded to its offer discussed, the possibility of qualifying in spite of the fact that the Royal Court's "Theatre in Education" which would impose on would-be actors a system of examinations, would itself be directed by itself and a majority of actors would be ill-equipped to do so. The right to start although reasonable, would bring employment figures, there is no guarantee that it would produce. Stagehands are not entitled to fees which greatly exceed those for their tuition so it is at the rate of £10 a week, plus expenses, that you can expect to earn. Every drama school has its own entrance exam to exercise its programme of studies, and management and criticism courses are not always those who later become professional actors. There is no guarantee that you will be admitted to a company, but you should be prepared to answer the question, "What can you do?"






