Referring to the report on Africanisation made to the E.A.C.S.O. by Mr. Udon last year, in which inferior "East African standards" were predicted, Mr. Mackay said: "This sort of thinking is fundamentally wrong and must be vigorously rejected."

"Certainly so far as the E.A.R. and H. is concerned, the best possible standards, not only in the matter of overall policy and finance and in our everyday operation, but also in the matter of personnel, are essential that a public service should remain efficient and stable."

The broadcast named Sheikh Abd Karume as 'President' of the 'Republic of the Shirazi Karume' and leader of the Afro-Shirazi Party, which has been in opposition to the ruling alliance of the Zanabhar National Party and the Pemba Peoples Party. In a few hours of fierce fighting, which started at about 3 a.m., the insurgents captured all strategic buildings, starting with the police armoury.

As the chatter of automatic weapons and rifles cut through the hazy air, the Head of State, the Sultan Seyyid Jamsheed bin Abdullah—the Prime Minister, Sheikh Mohamed Shabane, and other Government Ministers took refuge on board the steamer Salama, which anchored off shore.

600 men 'armed to teeth'

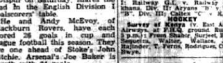

SITTING in a small office in the broadcasting station headquarters at Rahia Leo, yesterday, the President of the new Republic of Pemba and Zanzibar, Sheikh Abid Karume, told me: 'The old Government is dead and buried. The whole country is peaceful. The troubles are over...' He added as shouts from the armed crowd assembled outside the headquarters echoed through the building: 'The people who are shouting are doing so from natural exuberance. We feel it is not yet time to stop people from rejoicing because they have a Government which they really want.'
