TWO United Nations helicopters, one armed to evacuate if necessary, were in to Kisumu, the capital of the Congolese Province of Katanga, yesterday to provide support for the evacuation of terrified, hungry and ill.

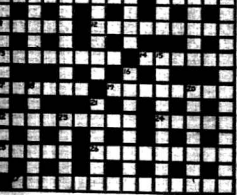

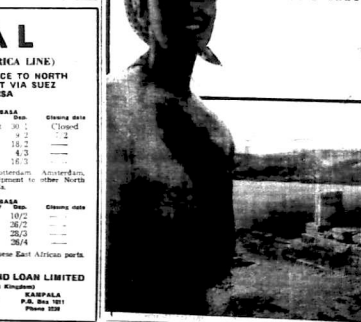

BIG ADVANCE ON LEGAL CO-OPERATION

AFRICA has taken a major step towards inter-state co-operation on legal matters, Kenya's Attorney-General, Charles Mboya, and the Uganda Minister of Justice, Mr. Bisigye, yesterday arrived back from Lagos, where their agreement had been reached on establishing a committee of African jurists.

Mr. Bisigye told the East African Standard that he regarded with a "highly favourable" attitude the fact that a committee of African jurists was being set up to deal with legal problems which were peculiar to Africa.

Mr. Bisigye said that the committee would be made up of representatives of the independent African States that represent lives at the Lagos meeting, where a convention establishing a committee of African jurists to be approved by Heads of States.

Mr. Bisigye said that he expected that the committee would be set up in the near future and would operate as a specialized body of the Organization of African Unity with all OAU member States represented.

The object of the committee was to promote the development of an applicable law in Africa to deal with legal issues which were peculiar to Africa and to provide a legal knowledge upon which advice and greater international law of the real-world.

He explained that the committee would operate as a fairly loose body and would not necessarily be bound by the law of any one State in Africa. It would return to the law of the country of the origin of the dispute.

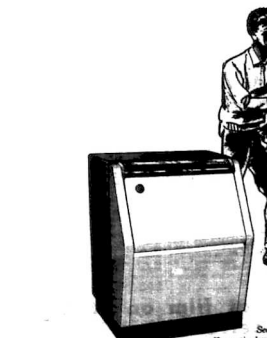

Boycott over racial segregation

Boycott organisers in New York claimed more than 260,000 children stayed away from city schools yesterday in protest against "de facto segregation."

Hundreds of parents, teachers and children marched outside schools in bitter cold with placards bearing such slogans as "End Jim Crow by Negro groups who alleged the Board of Education had done little to end racial imbalance in the city school system."

The organisers also hoped at least half the million pupils in the city's 800 State schools would stay at home. They said some schools had 90 per cent of their pupils away.

They promised the boycott would be peaceful, but it could be extended to 2,000 men to special duty at schools and held 6,000 in reserve.

In many schools more than 80 per cent of the pupils here are Negro or Puerto Rican, and have rights proper to them, urging that school district boundaries be redrawn and new ones introduced to integrate these schools.
