Women at work

THERE is a world of difference between taking a course in domestic science and mastering the intricacies of palantyping. A person who has done both is Mrs. Rachael Karanja, who is employed as a palantypist with East African Airways.

Palantyping, for those who are not familiar with it, is a form of shorthand which dispenses with a notebook and pencil. Instead a machine is used on which details in a message are taken down automatically, and then transcribed later. The machine, which is small and compact, is balanced on the operator's knee. It is the tool of her trade and is carried with her wherever she goes.

The advantage of palantyping over shorthand is its speed, since the fact that it does not take so long to learn. Another advantage is that it is not always possible for a shorthand writer to read someone else's shorthand, but a palantypist can read the shorthand of another's notes. This is very useful in a business office, for if the secretary is suddenly taken ill and leaves behind a notebook full of untranscribed messages, the palantypist can read them.

Disadvantages

The most obvious disadvantage is the fact that whenever the operator gets the most carry for such a machine, since in slipping a shorthand codebook pencil into her handbag. There are other disadvantages, such as being unable to make notes when on the telephone, or if the machine is not always with her. She would never replace shorthand.

But for the office it is ideal. Mrs. Karanja has the distinction of being the first palantypist at East African Airways, based in Nairobi. She mastered the intricacies of the machine in a five months' course of instruction at Nairobi college, paid for by her employers, who also provided her with pocket money while she was learning.

Mrs. Karanja, who was married only last month, was born in Fort Hall and educated at mission schools. She trained in domestic science at West for one year and when qualified taught elementary mathematics and needlework to the pupils of Kabuka High School.

Sought change

After teaching for a year she decided she wanted a change and joined East African Airways. She has attained a speed between 80 and 100 words per minute as a palantypist, the highest recorded speed of any palantypist being 230 words per minute.

Mrs. Karanja's hobbies are reading, reading magazines and watching the news on television. She is a trained domestic science teacher and a palantypist. It is certain that she need never be without a job.
