

Cyprits agree to remove roadblocks

UNITED Nations forces in the Turkish-Cypriot village of Manoussaria are under heavy fire during overnight fighting there, it was learned here in a dispatch received here today.

The U.N. spokesman said that during the night, Greek-Cyprits had captured positions on a high hill dominating Manoussaria, which is two miles east of Kokkina, in North-West Cyprus.

Shooting continued throughout the night, and the Greek-Cyprits were still in control of the hill yesterday morning. At the nearby Greek-Cyprist village of Ayios Theodoros, where the flare-up in this corner of the island ignited two days ago, two U.N. vehicles were caught in crossfire but did not return the fire.

British soldiers held

In a new peace move, agreement has been reached between the Cyprus Government and United Nations officials for removal by Thursday of all roadblocks and fortifications on nine key arterial roads. The Turkish-Cyprits have yet to approve the agreement, which could prove a factor in reducing tension.
