## K.C.G.C. TO BECOME Take-over proposals in White Paper

It will be succeeded by the Voice of Kenya under the name of the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation, as explained in a White Paper issued last night in Nairobi.

"It is our intention to keep the Voice of Kenya free and independent," the Minister for Information, Broadcasting and Tourism, Mr. Acheng Onoko, said during a briefing to correspondents. "The Voice of Kenya will cater for all groups in the country and for the aspirations of all individuals."

The Minister affirmed that, although the Government proposed taking over control of the K.B.C., the Frms would continue to enjoy freedom, as had been shown by the Government and stated publicly by the Prime Minister, Mr. J. Kenyatta.

### Tribute to contractors

The White Paper contains the Government's observations on the report of the Latta Commission of Inquiry into the financial situation and administration of the K.B.C. It has been laid in the National Assembly. The next meeting of the National Assembly will be held on the 27th inst. A committee is to be appointed to examine details of the work and to report to the Government.

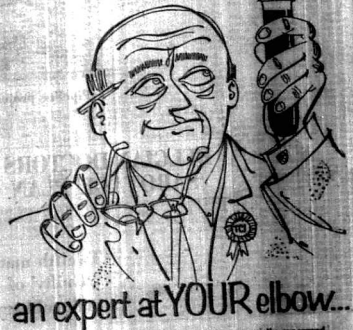

MEASURES to get more African women into employment were discussed yesterday at a meeting of the East African Women's Seminar at Kabete. The seminar was organized by John Okoth, and was for pre-bachelorettes and was held at the Kenya Hotel.

## ONE WEEK TRIKE ON EVICTIONS AGREED

### Policeman killed in raid by whites

Conferees on sanctions against South Africa ended in London yesterday with a declaration that total economic sanctions were "not practicable" and a call for speedy world action on them to end apartheid.

The decisions were recorded in the final report of the four-day conference which was attended by delegates and observers from about 40 countries.

The conference report warned that if the nations of the world failed to take speedy and decisive action on apartheid, it may well lead to the disintegration of the United Nations itself.

It cited the dangers of race war "which cannot be contained within the country's borders" and also said that economic and political support for apartheid would not endanger the relations with the white African world.

### Security threatened says Kenya

The report recorded that sanctions would not be applied effectively without a naval blockade of four to seven feet more than 250,000,000 a month. It was clear that to be heavier than any previous world financial barrier for Kenya's designs to the conference, the Minister for Justice and Constitutional Affairs, said that the security of the newly independent African countries was threatened by South African racial policies.

Mr. Mbari, who was chief chairman of the conference on the legal and political aspects of the problem, said that the conference had not only on the practice of apartheid but also on the fact that South Africa's economic and political policies within the continent itself were a major threat to the security of the African world.

### MINISTERS FOR TALKS ON LOANS

Kenya's Minister for Finance, Mr. Gichuru, and Minister for Agriculture, Mr. McKenney, leave for negotiations with the World Bank and the Commonwealth Development Corporation for a loan to support the development of the country.

# Women demand equal rights and respect

RESOLUTIONS demanding that the minimum legal age for marriage be raised to 18 for both sexes and that all marriages involving registered and unregistered women should have a right to own and inherit property were passed at the annual session of the East African Women's Seminar in Nairobi yesterday.

## KENYA CABINET BACKS MERGER

### Zanzibar will obey Tanganyika laws

KENYA last night expressed official support for the proposed union between Tanganyika and Zanzibar, which is expected to be ratified by the Tanganyika Parliament. A statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office in Nairobi said—

"The Kenya Government has now received official reports of the proposed union between Tanganyika and Zanzibar. The Prime Minister has also had lengthy discussions with the Tanganyika Minister for External Affairs, Mr. Kimbura, who brought to him personal messages from Presidents Nyere and Karume.

"Direct negotiations have also taken place among the heads of Government of Uganda, Tanganyika and Kenya. As a consequence the Government of Kenya is fully informed of the present development. The Government has expressed its support of the proposals and looks forward to their early implementation."

### Mr. Karume to deputise

Uganda's position has not yet been made known, but several hours discussion at Entebbe Airport with Mr. Karume and the Kenya Minister for Information, Mr. W. O. Ochieng, took place.

In Dar es Salaam, the Tasi parliamentary group met today before the special meeting of the National Assembly. The Bill under the Articles of Union which will make Tanganyika and Zanzibar one country, was discussed. Mr. Ochieng reported that Dr. Nyere will be President of the new Republic with Mr. Karume as Vice-President. It is expected that Dr. Nyere will be sworn in on September 1st.

### Remanded to Tanganyika

The four men arrested at Nairobi on August 21st, in connection with the alleged kidnapping of the late Mr. A. P. M. M. M., have been remanded to Tanganyika for further investigation.

### More trade ties with India urged

INDIA should increase its trade with East Africa and help the territories to develop industrially, was expressed last night in Nairobi by the Minister for Trade and Industries, Mr. W. O. Ochieng.

### Welcome for Kenyans in Tashkent

The people of Tashkent, the capital of Uzbekistan in Soviet-ruled Central Asia, gave a warm reception to the Kenyan Government Minister for Trade and Industries, Mr. W. O. Ochieng, who arrived in the city yesterday.

## 15 shifta die as patrol catches up

At least 15 shifta were killed by a Kenya patrol and British police patrol in the Wajir district on Wednesday. Two soldiers were wounded.

A patrol of two sections of 1st Platoon 'A' Company of Kenya Rifles, approximately 18 strong, commanded by Lt. H. B. B. B., on their march of Wajir after following the shifta in the Lidia Hills where they found some unexpected signs of their presence. After visiting footprints indicating the patrol camped for the night. The patrol was accompanied by British police.

## TRIBESMEN FROM TANA WILL FIGHT

A 12-man delegation representing the tribesmen of the Tana River District visited the office of the District Commissioner in Nairobi today to discuss their views on the Parliamentary Secretary and Defence, Dr. Waiyaki.

The delegation, which was led by the District Commissioner, discussed the views of the tribesmen on the proposed new constitution and the impact of the new constitution on their lives.

## KANU SEEKING TALKS ON FEDERATION

A meeting of representatives of the East African parliaments is expected to be held in Nairobi on Monday. The meeting will discuss the possibility of a federation between Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania.

## M.P.s back move on 'society'

Four Kenya parliamentarians have welcomed the Government's intention to investigate a report that the Kenya Society for Human Rights is planning to move its headquarters to Nairobi.

# COMPANY NEWS IS PACE-SETTER IN THE CITY

## LONDON stock market yesterday continued to record a generally irregular upward trend with some sharp declines in the latter part of the day. The closing level was 247 1/2, with the FTSE 100 index up 1 1/2 points from 246. The market was characterized by a steady rise in the early part of the day, followed by a period of consolidation and then a sharp decline in the afternoon. The main reason for the decline was the news that the British Government had decided to increase the income tax on dividends from 7 to 10 per cent. This news caused a general sell-off in the market, with many shares falling sharply. However, the market recovered somewhat in the evening, ending the day with a slight gain.

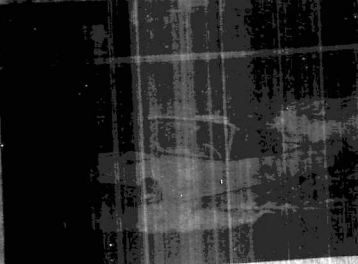
